SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4362

A bill to amend 1967 PA 281, entitled

"Income tax act of 1967,"

by amending section 471 (MCL 206.471), as amended by 2011 PA 38, and by adding section 474.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1	Sec. 471. (1) The department shall administer the tax imposed
2	by this part. shall be administered by the department. The
3	department shall prescribe forms for use by taxpayers and may
4	promulgate rules for all of the following:
5	(a) The maintenance by taxpayers of records, books, and
6	accounts.
7	(b) The computation of the tax.
8	(c) The manner and time of changing or electing accounting

methods and of exercising the accounting method options contained
 in this part.

3 (d) The making of returns, the payment of tax due, and the4 ascertainment, assessment, and collection of the tax.

5 (2) The rules shall follow the rulings of the United States 6 internal revenue service Internal Revenue Service with respect to 7 the federal income tax if those rulings are not inconsistent with 8 this part, and the department may adopt as a part of the rules any 9 portions of the internal revenue code or rulings, in whole or in 10 part.

11 (3) A summary of state expenditures and revenues by major 12 category, in dollar amounts and percentage of total, for the most 13 recent state fiscal year that the information is available, shall 14 be printed in the instruction booklet accompanying each state 15 income tax return.

16 (3) (4) Each state income tax return shall contain a space for the taxpayer to indicate the school district in which the taxpayer 17 18 resides. Beginning with the 2023 tax year and each tax year after 2023, the state income tax return shall contain a space for the 19 20 individual taxpayer to indicate if the individual taxpayer is willing to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under 21 22 part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123. The state income tax return shall also include the 23 24 following statement under that space: "An individual taxpayer 25 willing to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry must 26 complete the donor registry schedule and submit it with the 27 taxpayer's state income tax return.".

5 return required under this part, the department shall provide a

(b) A summary of state expenditures and revenues by major
category, in dollar amounts and percentage of total, for the most
recent state fiscal year that the information is available.

13 (c) Beginning with the 2023 tax year, information describing 14 the donor registry program maintained by Michigan's federally 15 designated organ procurement organization or its successor 16 organization under section 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, explaining the taxpayer's right to make an 17 18 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and providing 19 20 the taxpayer with the opportunity to specify, in a form and manner 21 as prescribed by the department under section 474, on the 22 taxpayer's annual return required under this part that the 23 individual taxpayer is willing to participate in the anatomical 24 gift donor registry under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 25 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.

27 subsection (6)—(5) (a) on the department's official website.

28 Sec. 474. (1) Beginning with 2023 tax year and each tax year 29 after 2023, the department shall develop and utilize a donor



registry schedule, that may be filed with a taxpayer's annual 1 2 return, that provides an individual taxpayer with the opportunity 3 to specify that the individual agrees to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of the public health 4 code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and is willing to 5 6 make an anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the 7 public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123. The 8 donor registry schedule required under this section must include, 9 at a minimum, all of the following information:

10 (a) The individual taxpayer's name, date of birth, address,11 and 1 of the following:

12 (i) The last 4 digits of the individual taxpayer's Social13 Security number.

14 (*ii*) Driver license number.

15 (*iii*) State personal identification card number.

16 (b) Information describing the donor registry program 17 maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization or its successor organization under section 10120 of 18 19 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120. The information 20 required under this subdivision must include the address and 21 telephone number of Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization or its successor organization as described 22 23 in section 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 24 333.10120.

(c) Information that if the individual taxpayer completes and files the donor registry schedule created under this section with the taxpayer's annual return, the department will forward the completed schedule to the secretary of state for that individual to be included as a donor on the donor registry maintained by the



secretary of state or for that individual's information to be
 transferred directly to the organ procurement organization or its
 successor organization, or both, in accordance with section 10120
 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120.

5 (2) For taxpayers who file a joint return, each individual 6 taxpayer that agrees to participate in the anatomical gift donor 7 registry under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 8 333.10101 to 333.10123, shall separately affirm the individual's 9 willingness to be placed on the donor registry maintained by the 10 secretary of state or to have that individual's information 11 transferred directly to the organ procurement organization or its 12 successor organization by completing the donor registry schedule 13 required under this section. The department shall forward each 14 donor registry schedule filed with an annual return to the 15 secretary of state. The department and secretary of state shall determine the manner and frequency that the donor registry schedule 16 17 filed with an annual return must be forwarded from the department 18 to the secretary of state. The confidentiality restrictions 19 provided in section 28(1)(f) of 1941 PA 122, MCL 205.28, do not 20 apply to the disclosure required by this subsection.

21 (3) Information about an individual taxpayer's indication of a 22 willingness to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry 23 under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 24 333.10101 to 333.10123, that is included in the donor registry 25 schedule obtained by the department and forwarded to the secretary 26 of state under this section is exempt from disclosure under section 27 13(1)(d) of the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 28 15.243. The department is not required to maintain a record of an 29 individual taxpayer who does not indicate a willingness to



participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123. Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect unless all of the following bills of the 102nd Legislature are enacted into law: (a) House Bill No. 4363.
