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HOUSE BILL No. 5940

May 8, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Chirkun and Yaroch and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 2011 PA 256, entitled "Michigan fireworks safety act,"

by amending sections 2 and 7 (MCL 28.452 and 28.457), section 2 as amended by 2012 PA 257 and section 7 as amended by 2013 PA 65.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

- (a) "Agricultural and wildlife fireworks" means fireworks devices distributed to farmers, ranchers, and growers through a wildlife management program administered by the United States department DEPARTMENT of the interior INTERIOR or the department of natural resources of this state.
 - (b) "APA standard 87-1" means 2001 APA standard 87-1, standard

- 1 for construction and approval for transportation of fireworks,
- 2 novelties, and theatrical pyrotechnics, published by the American
- 3 pyrotechnics association PYROTECHNICS ASSOCIATION of Bethesda,
- 4 Maryland.
- 5 (c) "Articles pyrotechnic" means pyrotechnic devices for
- 6 professional use that are similar to consumer fireworks in chemical
- 7 composition and construction but not intended for consumer use,
- 8 that meet the weight limits for consumer fireworks but are not
- 9 labeled as such, and that are classified as UN0431 or UN0432 under
- **10** 49 CFR 172.101.
- 11 (d) "Citation" means that term as described in section 17a.
- 12 (e) "Commercial manufacturer" means a person engaged in the
- 13 manufacture of consumer fireworks.
- 14 (f) "Consumer fireworks" means fireworks devices that are
- 15 designed to produce visible effects by combustion, that are
- 16 required to comply with the construction, chemical composition, and
- 17 labeling regulations promulgated by the United States consumer
- 18 product safety commission CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION under
- 19 16 CFR parts 1500 and 1507, and that are listed in APA standard 87-
- 20 1, 3.1.2, 3.1.3, or 3.5. Consumer fireworks does not include low-
- 21 impact fireworks.
- 22 (q) "Consumer fireworks certificate" means a certificate
- 23 issued under section 4.
- 24 (h) "Department" means the department of licensing and
- 25 regulatory affairs.
- (i) "Display fireworks" means large fireworks devices that are
- 27 explosive materials intended for use in fireworks displays and

- 1 designed to produce visible or audible effects by combustion,
- 2 deflagration, or detonation, as provided in 27 CFR 555.11, 49 CFR
- 3 172, and APA standard 87-1, 4.1.
- 4 (j) "Firework" or "fireworks" means any composition or device,
- 5 except for a starting pistol, a flare gun, or a flare, designed for
- 6 the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion,
- 7 deflagration, or detonation. Fireworks consist of consumer
- 8 fireworks, low-impact fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, display
- 9 fireworks, and special effects.
- (k) "Fireworks safety fund" means the fireworks safety fund
- 11 created in section 11.
- 12 (l) "Local unit of government" means a city, village, or
- 13 township.
- 14 (m) "Low-impact fireworks" means ground ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 15 (i) GROUND and handheld sparkling devices as that phrase is
- 16 defined under APA standard 87-1, 3.1, 3.1.1.1 to 3.1.1.8, and 3.5.
- 17 (ii) A SKY LANTERN.
- (n) "Minor" means an individual who is less than 18 years of
- **19** age.
- 20 (o) "NFPA" means the national fire protection association
- 21 NATIONAL FIRE PROTECTION ASSOCIATION headquartered at 1
- 22 Batterymarch Park, Quincy, Massachusetts.
- (p) "NFPA 1" means the uniform fire code, "UNIFORM FIRE CODE",
- 24 2006 edition, developed by NFPA.
- 25 (q) "NFPA 72" means the "National Fire Alarm Code", 2002
- 26 edition, developed by NFPA.
- (r) "NFPA 101" means the "Life Safety Code", 2009 edition,

- 1 developed by NFPA.
- 2 (s) "NFPA 1123" means the "Code for Fireworks Display", 2010
- 3 edition, developed by NFPA.
- 4 (t) "NFPA 1124" means the "Code for the Manufacture,
- 5 Transportation, Storage, and Retail Sales of Fireworks and
- 6 Pyrotechnic Articles", 2006 edition, developed by NFPA.
- 7 (u) "NFPA 1126" means the "Standard for the Use of
- 8 Pyrotechnics Before a Proximate Audience", 2011 edition, developed
- 9 by NFPA.
- 10 (v) "Novelties" means that term as defined under APA standard
- 11 87-1, 3.2, 3.2.1, 3.2.2, 3.2.3, 3.2.4, and 3.2.5 and all of the
- 12 following:
- 13 (i) Toy plastic or paper caps for toy pistols in sheets,
- 14 strips, rolls, or individual caps containing not more than .25 of a
- 15 grain of explosive content per cap, in packages labeled to indicate
- 16 the maximum explosive content per cap.
- 17 (ii) Toy pistols, toy cannons, toy canes, toy trick
- 18 noisemakers, and toy guns in which toy caps as described in
- 19 subparagraph (i) are used, that are constructed so that the hand
- 20 cannot come in contact with the cap when in place for the
- 21 explosion, and that are not designed to break apart or be separated
- 22 so as to form a missile by the explosion.
- (iii) Flitter sparklers in paper tubes not exceeding 1/8 inch
- 24 in diameter.
- 25 (iv) Toy snakes not containing mercury, if packed in cardboard
- 26 boxes with not more than 12 pieces per box for retail sale and if
- 27 the manufacturer's name and the quantity contained in each box are

- 1 printed on the box; and toy smoke devices.
- 2 (w) "Permanent building or structure" is a building or
- 3 structure that is affixed to a foundation on a site that has fixed
- 4 utility connections and that is intended to remain on the site for
- 5 more than 180 consecutive calendar days.
- 6 (x) "Person" means an individual, agent, association,
- 7 charitable organization, company, limited liability company,
- 8 corporation, labor organization, legal representative, partnership,
- 9 unincorporated organization, or any other legal or commercial
- 10 entity.
- 11 (y) "Retailer" means a person who sells consumer fireworks or
- 12 low-impact fireworks for resale to an individual for ultimate use.
- 13 (z) "Retail location" means a facility listed under NFPA 1124,
- **14** 7.1.2.
- 15 (aa) "Rule" means that term as defined in section 7 of the
- 16 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.207,
- 17 that was promulgated by the department.
- (bb) "Serious impairment of a body function" means that term
- 19 as defined in section 58c of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
- 20 300, MCL 257.58c.
- 21 (cc) "Serious violation" means a violation of this act, an
- 22 order issued under this act, or a rule promulgated or adopted by
- 23 reference under this act for which a substantial probability exists
- 24 that death or serious impairment of a body function to a person
- 25 other than the violator may result unless the violator did not and
- 26 could not, with the exercise of reasonable diligence, know of the
- 27 presence of the violation.

- 1 (DD) "SKY LANTERN" MEANS AN UNMANNED FREE-FLOATING LUMINARY
- 2 DEVICE THAT USES HEATED AIR PRODUCED BY AN OPEN FLAME OR OTHER HEAT
- 3 SOURCE TO BECOME OR REMAIN AIRBORNE.
- 4 (EE) (dd) "Special effects" means a combination of chemical
- 5 elements or chemical compounds capable of burning independently of
- 6 the oxygen of the atmosphere and designed and intended to produce
- 7 an audible, visual, mechanical, or thermal effect as an integral
- 8 part of a motion picture, radio, television, theatrical, or opera
- 9 production or live entertainment.
- 10 (FF) (ee)—"State fire marshal" means the state fire marshal
- 11 appointed under section 1b of the fire prevention code, 1941 PA
- 12 207, MCL 29.1b.
- (GG) (ff) "Warehouse" means a permanent building or structure
- 14 used primarily for the storage of consumer fireworks or low-impact
- 15 fireworks.
- 16 (HH) (gg) "Wholesaler" means any person who sells consumer
- 17 fireworks or low-impact fireworks to a retailer or any other person
- 18 for resale. Wholesaler does not include a person who sells only
- 19 display fireworks or special effects.
- 20 Sec. 7. (1) Except as provided in this act, a local unit of
- 21 government shall not enact or enforce an ordinance, code, or
- 22 regulation pertaining to or in any manner regulating the sale,
- 23 display, storage, transportation, or distribution of fireworks
- 24 regulated under this act.
- 25 (2) A local unit of government may enact an ordinance
- 26 regulating the ignition, discharge, and use of consumer fireworks,
- 27 including, but not limited to, an ordinance prescribing the hours

- 1 of the day or night during which a person may ignite, discharge, or
- 2 use consumer fireworks. If a local unit of government enacts an
- 3 ordinance under this subsection, the ordinance shall not regulate
- 4 the ignition, discharge, or use of consumer fireworks on the day
- 5 preceding, the day of, or the day after a national holiday except
- 6 as follows:
- 7 (a) A local unit of government with a population of 50,000 or
- 8 more or a local unit of government located in a county with a
- 9 population of 750,000 or more may regulate the ignition, discharge,
- 10 or use of consumer fireworks between the hours of 12 midnight and 8
- 11 a.m. or between the hours of 1 a.m. and 8 a.m. on New Year's day.
- 12 (b) A local unit of government with a population of less than
- 13 50,000 located in a county with a population of less than 750,000
- 14 may regulate the ignition, discharge, or use of consumer fireworks
- 15 between the hours of 1 a.m. and 8 a.m.
- 16 (3) An ordinance under subsection (2) shall only impose a
- 17 civil fine of not more than \$500.00 for each violation of the
- 18 ordinance and no other fine or sanction.
- 19 (4) A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT WITH A POPULATION OF 100,000 OR
- 20 MORE OR A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT LOCATED IN A COUNTY WITH A
- 21 POPULATION OF 750,000 OR MORE MAY ENACT OR ENFORCE AN ORDINANCE
- 22 THAT REGULATES THE USE OF A TEMPORARY STRUCTURE WITH FIREWORKS. AN
- 23 ORDINANCE ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY INCLUDE, BUT IS NOT
- 24 LIMITED TO, A RESTRICTION ON THE NUMBER OF PERMITS ISSUED FOR A
- 25 TEMPORARY STRUCTURE, REGULATION OF THE DISTANCE REQUIRED BETWEEN 1
- 26 OR MORE TEMPORARY STRUCTURES, OR A ZONING ORDINANCE THAT REGULATES
- 27 THE USE OF A TEMPORARY STRUCTURE. AS USED IN THIS SUBSECTION,

- 1 "TEMPORARY STRUCTURE" MEANS A MOVABLE STRUCTURE THAT IS USED IN THE
- 2 SALE, DISPLAY, STORAGE, TRANSPORTATION, OR DISTRIBUTION OF
- 3 FIREWORKS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, A TENT OR A STAND.
- 4 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 5 after the date it is enacted into law.
