A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled

"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"

by amending section 81116 (MCL 324.81116), as amended by 2022 PA 57.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 81116. (1) The To obtain a license required under this part, the owner of an ORV requiring licensure under this part shall file an application for a license with the department or a dealer on forms provided by the department. If an ORV is sold by a dealer, the application for a license shall be submitted to the department by the dealer in the name of the owner. The application shall

include a certification. The owner of the vehicle shall sign the 1 application or, if the application is filed electronically, provide 2 information requested by the department to verify the owner's 3 identity. The application shall be accompanied by a fee as provided 4 5 in subsection (2). A person shall not file an application for a 6 license that contains false information. Upon receipt of the 7 application in approved form and payment of the appropriate fee, 8 the department or dealer shall issue to the applicant a license. A 9 license is valid for the 12-month period beginning April 1 and 10 ending the following March 31.

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(2) The fee for a license is as follows:

12 (a) Except as provided in subdivision (c), if the license does
13 not authorize operation of the ORV on state ORV trails, (b),
14 \$26.25.

(b) Except as provided in subdivision (c), if If the license
authorizes operation of the ORV on state ORV trails, \$36.25.

17 (c) For a license valid for a 12-month period beginning April
 18 1, 2024 or a subsequent April 1, no fee.

19 (3) A dealer may purchase from the department ORV licenses for 20 resale to owners of vehicles requiring licensure that require a **license** under this part. The department shall refund to a dealer 21 the purchase price of any ORV licenses returned within 90 days 22 after the end of the 12-month period for which they were valid. A 23 dealer shall maintain and provide to the department records of ORV 24 25 license sales on forms provided by the department. In addition to the sale of ORV licenses, a dealer engaged in the sale, lease, or 26 27 rental of ORVs as a regular business may sell any other license or permit authorized by the department to be sold by other dealers 28 29 under the statutes of this state.

(4) Before a vehicle requiring that requires an ORV license is
 operated, the owner shall ensure that a license is permanently
 attached to the vehicle in the manner prescribed by and, subject to
 this subsection, in the location designated by the department. The
 license for a 2-wheel vehicle shall be attached as provided in
 either of the following:

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(a) Centered on the exposed surface of the rear fender.

8 (b) Located at a visible place facing forward on a front9 suspension fork.

10 (5) If, when a vehicle that otherwise requiring requires a 11 license under this part is sold, the purchaser certifies on a form 12 provided by the department that the vehicle will be used and stored 13 outside of this state and will not be returned by the purchaser to 14 this state for use, a license is not required for the vehicle.

15 (6) If a license acquired by the owner of an ORV is lost or 16 destroyed, the department shall provide that person with a 17 replacement license free of charge. The department may require a 18 person requesting a replacement license to supply sufficient 19 evidence of the loss or destruction of the original license.

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
