A bill to amend 2008 PA 537, entitled "Michigan retired law enforcement officer's firearm carry act," by amending sections 7 and 12 (MCL 28.517 and 28.522).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 7. (1) The commission or its agent shall issue a certificate to a qualified retired law enforcement officer who has complied with the active duty firearms standard and is eligible to carry a concealed firearm under 18 USC 926C and this act.
- 5 (2) A certificate holder shall carry the certificate and a6 valid driver license or Michigan personal identification card on

- 1 his or her that person at all times while in possession of a
- 2 concealed firearm and shall produce the documents upon demand by a
