SENATE BILL NO. 354

May 24, 2023, Introduced by Senators GEISS, POLEHANKI, MCBROOM, SANTANA and BAYER and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2018 PA 235.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1531. (1) Except as provided in this act, the
 superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
 requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
 teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
 an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an
 endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in an

1 elementary grade in the public schools of the state.

2 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
3 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
4 certificate only to an individual who has passed appropriate
5 examinations as follows:

6 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed the
7 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
8 area in which he or she applies to be certified.

9 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed, 10 if it is available, the elementary certification examination, and 11 has passed the appropriate available subject area examination for 12 each subject area, if any, in which he or she applies to be 13 certified.

14 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the 15 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a Michigan 16 teaching certificate to an individual holding a certificate from 17 another state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher 18 preparation institution who applies for a Michigan teaching 19 certificate only if the individual passes appropriate examinations 20 as follows:

(a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass the
appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
area in which he or she applies to be certified. The superintendent
of public instruction may accept passage of an equivalent
examination approved by the superintendent of public instruction to
meet this requirement.

(b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass, if it
is available, the elementary certification examination, and pass
the appropriate available subject area examination for each subject

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area, if any, in which he or she applies to be certified. The
 superintendent of public instruction may accept passage of an
 equivalent examination approved by the superintendent of public
 instruction to meet 1 or both of these requirements.

5 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the 6 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching 7 certificate **only** to an individual who has met the elementary or 8 secondary, as applicable, reading credit requirements established 9 under superintendent of public instruction rule. If an individual 10 holds a teaching certificate, then beginning July 1, 2009, 11 notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of 12 public instruction shall not advance the individual's certification to professional certification unless the individual has 13 14 successfully completed at least a 3-credit course of study with 15 appropriate field experiences in the diagnosis and remediation of 16 reading disabilities and differentiated instruction. To meet this 17 requirement, the course of study should include the following 18 elements, as determined by the department to be appropriate for the 19 individual's certification level and endorsements: interest 20 inventories, English language learning screening, visual and auditory discrimination tools, language expression and processing 21 22 screening, phonemics, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, comprehension, 23 spelling and writing assessment tools, and instructional 24 strategies. An individual may complete the course of study either 25 as part of his or her teacher preparation program or during the first 6 years of his or her employment in classroom teaching. 26 27 (5) Not later than January 11, 2002, the superintendent of 28 public instruction, in cooperation with appropriate curriculum

29 specialists and teacher educators, shall revise existing reading

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standards to recognize reading disorders and to enable teachers to
 make referrals for instruction and support for pupils with reading
 disorders.

(6) Subject to subsection (8), if an individual holding a 4 5 teaching certificate from another state applies to the 6 superintendent of public instruction for a Michigan teaching 7 certificate and meets the requirements of this subsection, the 8 superintendent of public instruction shall issue to the individual 9 a Michigan professional education teaching certificate and 10 applicable endorsements comparable to those the individual holds in 11 the other state, without requiring the individual to pass the applicable subject area examination otherwise required under 12 subsection (2) or (3). To be eligible to receive a Michigan 13 14 professional education teaching certificate under this subsection, 15 an individual shall provide evidence satisfactory to the department 16 that he or she meets all of the following requirements:

17 (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a position
18 for which the individual's teaching certification from the other
19 state was valid.

(b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned course of study at an institution of higher education approved by the superintendent of public instruction or has earned, at any time, a master's or doctoral degree approved by the superintendent of public instruction.

(c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
reading credit requirement established under superintendent of
public instruction rule.

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(7) An individual who receives a teaching certificate and

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1 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (6) is eligible to 2 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to 3 endorsements the individual holds in another state only if the 4 individual passes the appropriate subject area examinations 5 required under subsection (2) or (3).

6 (8) The superintendent of public instruction shall deny a
7 Michigan teaching certificate to an individual described in
8 subsection (6) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or
9 concealment in the individual's application for a certificate or
10 for a conviction for which an individual's teaching certificate may
11 be revoked under section 1535a.

12 (9) The department, based upon criteria recommended under 13 subsection (11), shall provide to approved teacher education 14 institutions approved guidelines and criteria for use in the 15 development or selection of subject area examinations. This 16 subsection does not apply after June 30, 2024.

17 (10) For the purposes of this section, the superintendent of public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under 18 subsection (11), shall develop, select, or develop and select 1 or 19 20 more subject area examinations. In addition, the superintendent of public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under 21 22 subsection (11), shall approve an elementary certification 23 examination and a reading subject area examination. If the 24 department develops for use under this subsection an examination 25 that had previously been contracted for using a competitive bid 26 process, then the department shall not expend on the development of 27 that examination an amount that exceeds the amount that the department expended on procurement of the most recent 28 29 competitively-bid version of that examination. This subsection does

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1 not apply after June 30, 2024.

2 (11) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint an 3 11-member teacher examination advisory committee composed of 4 representatives of approved teacher education institutions and Michigan education organizations and associations. Not more than 5 6 1/2 of the members comprising this committee shall be certified 7 teachers. This committee shall recommend criteria to be used by the 8 superintendent of public instruction in the development, selection, 9 or development and selection of subject area examinations. In 10 addition, the committee shall recommend guidelines for the use and 11 administration of those examinations. This subsection does not apply after June 30, 2024. 12

(12) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a 13 14 7-member standing technical advisory council composed of 15 individuals who are experts in measurement and assessment. This council shall advise the superintendent of public instruction and 16 the teacher examination committee on the validity, reliability, and 17 other technical standards of the examinations that will be used or 18 are being used and of the administration and use of those 19 20 examinations. This subsection does not apply after June 30, 2024. 21 (13) Not later than November 30 of each year, the 22 superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a 23 report on the development or selection and use of the elementary 24 certification examination and the subject area examinations to the 25 house and senate education committees. The report shall must also 26 contain a financial statement regarding revenue received from the 27 assessment of fees levied under subsection (15) and the amount of 28 and any purposes for which that revenue was expended.

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(14) The elementary certification examination and the subject

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1 area examinations required by this section may be taken at 2 different times during an approved teacher preparation program, but 3 the elementary certification examination and the subject area 4 examinations, as applicable, must be passed before an individual is 5 recommended for certification.

6 (15) The department, or if approved by the superintendent of 7 public instruction, a private testing service, may assess fees for 8 taking the elementary certification examination and the subject 9 area examinations. The fees, which shall must be set by the 10 superintendent of public instruction, shall must not exceed the 11 actual cost of the examination and of administering the examination. Fees received by the department shall must be expended 12 13 solely for administrative expenses that it incurs in implementing 14 this section. If the superintendent of public instruction increases 15 a fee charged for an examination under this subsection, at least 1 year before implementing the fee increase, the department shall 16 notify each approved teacher education institution of the amount of 17 18 the fee increase. An approved teacher education institution shall 19 notify each of its affected students of the timing and amount of such a fee increase. 20

(16) If an individual holding a teaching certificate from 21 22 another state applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets 23 all requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except 24 passage of the appropriate examinations under subsection (3), the 25 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable temporary teaching certificate, good for 1 year, to the individual. 26 The superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a Michigan 27 28 teaching certificate to the individual after expiration of the 29 temporary teaching certificate unless the individual passes

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1 appropriate examinations as described in subsection (3).

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(17) As used in this section:

3 (a) "Elementary certification examination" means a 4 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has been developed or selected by the superintendent of public 5 6 instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and 7 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary 8 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is 9 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate. 10 (b) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to

11 a specific area of certification, which examination has been
12 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
13 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
14 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not
15 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.

16 (17) (18) The superintendent of public instruction shall
17 promulgate rules for the implementation of this section.

(18) (19) Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, if the 18 19 superintendent of public instruction shall continue to issue has 20 issued a state elementary or secondary continuing education 21 certificates certificate under former R 390.1132(1) of the Michigan 22 Administrative Code to individuals an individual who completed the 23 requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and who apply 24 applied for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994, . If 25 the superintendent of public instruction has issued a state 26 elementary or secondary professional education certificate to an 27 individual described in this section, the superintendent of public instruction shall consider the individual to have a state 28 29 elementary or secondary, as applicable, continuing education

1 certificate.

2 (19) (20)-Not later than January 1, 2019, the superintendent 3 of public instruction, in consultation with the department of 4 talent and economic development labor and economic opportunity and 5 groups or individuals representing employers, economic development 6 agencies, trade unions, secondary school principals, middle and 7 elementary school principals, teachers, school district and 8 intermediate school district superintendents, and others as 9 determined appropriate by the department, shall promulgate rules to 10 allow an individual to use time spent engaging with local employers 11 or technical centers toward the renewal of a teaching certificate 12 in the same manner as state continuing education or professional 13 development.

14 (20) Not later than June 1, 2023, the state board shall
15 approve a teacher licensing examination for purposes of this
16 section. The examination approved under this subsection must
17 already be in existence when approved and must be administered
18 nationally.

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(21) As used in this section:

20 (a) "Elementary certification examination" means either of the21 following, as applicable:

(i) Before July 1, 2024, a comprehensive examination for
elementary certification that has been developed or selected by the
superintendent of public instruction for demonstrating the
applicant's knowledge and understanding of the core subjects
normally taught in elementary classrooms and for determining
whether an applicant is eligible for an elementary level teaching
certificate.

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(ii) After June 30, 2024, the examination approved by the state

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1 board under subsection (20).

2 (b) "Subject area examination" means either of the following,3 as applicable:

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4 (i) Before July 1, 2024, an examination related to a specific 5 area of certification, which examination has been developed or 6 selected by the superintendent of public instruction for the 7 purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and 8 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether an 9 applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.

10 (*ii*) After June 30, 2024, the examination approved by the state
11 board under subsection (20).
