- 3 Whereas, May is celebrated as Jewish American Heritage Month,
- 4 providing an opportunity to celebrate the rich history, culture,
- 5 and contributions of American Jews to the United States and the
- 6 state of Michigan; and
- 7 Whereas, Jewish presence in Michigan dates back over 250
- 8 years, to 1761, when Ezekiel Solomon settled in Fort
- 9 Michilimackinac, now Mackinaw City; and
- 10 Whereas, Michigan is home to a vibrant Jewish community nearly

- 1 100,000 strong that has grown and flourished across the state, with
- 2 significant Jewish presence in the Metro Detroit communities of
- 3 West Bloomfield, Farmington Hills, Oak Park, Huntington Woods,
- 4 Southfield, Franklin, Bloomfield Hills, Birmingham, Commerce, Ann
- 5 Arbor, and other communities; and
- 6 Whereas, Michigan's Jewish community has been instrumental in
- 7 promoting economic growth and development, fostering education and
- 8 philanthropy, and supporting social justice and civil rights
- 9 causes; and
- 10 Whereas, Jews have made unique and substantial contributions
- 11 to civics, government, and leadership of the United States and
- 12 Michigan, including prominent figures such as Supreme Court
- 13 Justices Louis Brandeis and Ruth Bader Ginsburg, U.S. Senator Carl
- 14 Levin, Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, Michigan Attorney
- 15 General Dana Nessel; U.S. Representative Elissa Slotkin; Judge
- 16 Avern Cohn; and
- 17 Whereas, Jews have made unique and substantial contributions
- 18 to movements for justice and civil rights, including Gloria
- 19 Steinem, Harvey Milk, Samuel Gompers, Bella Abzug, Rabbi Abraham
- 20 Joseph Heschel, and countless others; and
- 21 Whereas, Jews have made substantial contributions to economic
- 22 development, business, and philanthropy in Michigan and across the
- 23 United States, including leaders in the Detroit Jewish community
- 24 David Hermelin, Max Fisher, William Davidson, and Gary Torgow; and
- 25 Whereas, Jews have made invaluable contributions to the arts,
- 26 culture, sports, and entertainment in America, with notable figures
- 27 such as Gilda Radner, Hank Greenberg, Joan Rivers, Stephen
- 28 Sondheim, Stan Lee, Barbra Streisand, Steven Spielberg, among
- 29 countless others; and

- 2 engine of innovation in the fields of science, technology,
- 3 medicine, and fashion, with pioneers such as Albert Einstein, Larry
- 4 Page, Carl Sagan, Levi Strauss, Hedy Lamarr, and Ruth Handler; now,
- 5 therefore, be it
- 6 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 7 this legislative body declare May 2023 as Jewish American Heritage
- 8 Month in the state of Michigan. We celebrate the countless
- 9 groundbreaking, unique, and significant contributions of American
- 10 Jews, which have had a profound impact in shaping the development
- 11 and character of our state and country.
