

THE HUMAN CLONING FUNDING PROHIBITION ACT
Act 111 of 1998

AN ACT to prohibit the expenditure of state funds for the purpose of human cloning.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

333.26401 Short title.

Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as “the human cloning funding prohibition act”.

333.26402 “Human cloning” defined.

Sec. 2. As used in this act, “human cloning” means that term as defined in section 16274 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16274.

333.26403 Human cloning; prohibited conduct.

Sec. 3. A person shall not use state funds to engage in or attempt to engage in human cloning.

333.26404 Exception.

Sec. 4. Section 3 does not prohibit the use of state funds for scientific research or cell-based therapies not specifically prohibited by that section.

333.26405 Private right of action.

Sec. 5. This act does not give a person a private right of action.

333.26406 Violation; penalty.

Sec. 6. A person who violates section 3 is subject to a civil fine of \$10,000,000.00. A civil fine imposed under this section shall be distributed in the same manner in which penal fines are distributed in this state.
