SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4274

A bill to amend 2000 PA 489, entitled "Michigan trust fund act,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 12.252), as amended by 2022 PA 83, and by adding sections 11a and 11b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- (a) "Community district education trust fund" means thecommunity district education trust fund created in section 12.
- 4 (b) "Flint settlement trust fund" means the Flint settlement5 trust fund created in section 11.
- 6 (c) "Medicaid benefits trust fund" means the Michigan Medicaid7 benefits trust fund established in section 5.
- 8 (d) "Medicaid program" means a program for medical assistance



- 1 established under title XIX of the social security act, 42 USC 1396
 2 to 1396w-6.
- 3 (e) "Medicaid special financing payments" means the Medicaid
 4 special adjustor payments each year authorized in the department of
 5 health and human services appropriations act.
- (f) "Michigan merit award trust fund" means the Michigan meritaward trust fund established in section 9.
 - (g) "Michigan opioid healing and recovery fund" means the Michigan opioid healing and recovery fund created in section 3.
 - (h) "Revenue sharing trust fund" means the revenue sharing trust fund established in section 11a.
- 12 (i) (h) "Strategic outreach and attraction reserve fund" means
 13 the strategic outreach and attraction reserve fund created in
 14 section 4.
- (j) (i)—"Tobacco settlement revenue" means money received by
 this state that is attributable to the master settlement agreement
 incorporated into a consent decree and final judgment entered into
 on December 7, 1998 in Kelly Ex Rel. Michigan v Philip Morris
 Incorporated, et al., Ingham County Circuit Court, docket no. 9684281CZ, including any rights to receive money attributable to the
 master settlement agreement that has been sold by this state.
- Sec. 11a. (1) The revenue sharing trust fund is established in the department of treasury. The revenue sharing trust fund consists of 1 or more of the following:
- 27 (a) Money deposited in the revenue sharing trust fund as
 28 required by section 25 of the general sales tax act, 1933 PA 167,
 29 MCL 205.75.

- 1 (b) Donations of money made to the revenue sharing trust fund 2 from any source.
- 3 (c) Interest and earnings from revenue sharing trust fund 4 investments.
- 5 (2) The state treasurer shall direct the investment of the 6 revenue sharing trust fund.
- 7 (3) Money in the revenue sharing trust fund at the close of a 8 fiscal year remains in the revenue sharing trust fund and does not 9 lapse to the general fund.
- Sec. 11b. (1) Beginning on October 1, 2024, subject to subsection (2), and upon appropriation, the state treasurer shall transfer and disburse the money received by the revenue sharing trust fund as follows:
 - (a) To cities, villages, and townships that were eligible to receive funding under section 952(1) of article 5 of 2022 PA 166, in an amount equal to 52.87% of the disbursement, distributed to each city, village, or township in the same proportion that each was eligible to receive under section 952(1) of article 5 of 2022 PA 166.
- 20 (b) To cities, villages, and townships that were not eligible 21 to receive funding under section 952(1) of article 5 of 2022 PA 22 166, in an amount equal to 1.00% of the disbursement, distributed 23 to each city, village, or township on a per capita basis based on 24 the most recent federal decennial census.
- (c) To counties, in an amount equal to 46.13% of the disbursement, distributed to each county in the same proportion that each was eligible to receive under sections 952(2) and 955 of article 5 of 2022 PA 166. If a county was eligible to receive payments under section 11 of the Glenn Steil state revenue sharing

- 1 act of 1971, 1971 PA 140, MCL 141.911, for only a partial fiscal
- 2 year, the amount distributed to the county under this subdivision
- 3 must be adjusted to treat the county as if it were eligible to
- 4 receive the revenue sharing payments for the entire fiscal year.
- 5 (2) If a city, village, township, or county is eligible to
- 6 receive a distribution under subsection (1), the distribution must
- 7 be made on the last business day of October, December, February,
