HOUSE BILL NO. 4729**

A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020; to provide for certain conditions on appropriations; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

25 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

26 **GENERAL SECTIONS**

27 Sec. 201. In accordance with section 30 of article IX of the
28 state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources
29 under part 1 for fiscal year 2019-2020 is \$125,000,000.00. State



1 spending from state sources to be paid to local units of government
2 under part 1 is \$0.00.

3 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures
4 authorized under this part and part 1 and the departments,
5 agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and programs for which an
6 appropriation is made under part 1 are subject to the management
7 and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

8 Sec. 203. If the state administrative board, acting under
9 section 3 of 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.3, transfers funds from an amount
10 appropriated under this act, the legislature may, by a concurrent
11 resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and
12 serving in each house, inter-transfer funds within this act for the
13 particular department, board, commission, officer, or institution.

14 Sec. 204. (1) The office of the auditor general shall audit
15 the use of the funds appropriated in part 1 for coronavirus public
16 health emergency - health care capacity, coronavirus public health
17 emergency, and coronavirus response fund and report to the chairs
18 of the senate and house of representatives committees on
19 appropriations at a minimum of every month on the appropriateness
20 of the preceding month's expenditures until the funds are expended.

21 (2) In accordance with section 53 of article IV of the state
22 constitution of 1963, section 1 of 2003 PA 1, MCL 13.101, and
23 section 6a of 1846 RS 8, MCL 8.6a, both of the following apply:

24 (a) A person may not interfere with, prevent, or prohibit the
25 auditor general from carrying out its duties.

26 (b) All departments, state agencies, committees,
27 commissioners, or officers of this state and any political
28 subdivision of this state, so far as is compatible with their
29 duties, shall give the auditor general any necessary assistance



1 required by the auditor general in the performance of his or her
2 duties.

3 (3) Not later than September 30, the auditor general shall
4 provide a detailed report to the governor, the department of
5 technology, management, and budget, the secretary of the senate,
6 the clerk of the house of representatives, and the chairpersons of
7 the senate and house of representatives committees on
8 appropriations. The report shall contain all of the following:

9 (a) Details of the auditor general's services related to its
10 review of the coronavirus public health emergency - health care
11 capacity, coronavirus public health emergency, and coronavirus
12 response fund for the current fiscal year.

13 (b) Details of findings of fraud, waste, or abuse of these
14 state appropriations.

15 (c) Recommendations for corrective actions by any governmental
16 entities.

17 Sec. 205. The state budget director shall report on the status
18 of funds appropriated in part 1 to the chairs of the house and
19 senate appropriations committees on a biweekly basis through
20 September 30, 2020.

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22 **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

23 Sec. 251. The funds appropriated in part 1 for the coronavirus
24 public health emergency - health care capacity shall be distributed
25 to critical health care providers in this state, in amounts and by
26 a method approved by the state budget director and the director of
27 the department of health and human services, for expenditure by
28 those providers to expand capacity for the health care response to
29 the respiratory virus coronavirus-19 (COVID-19). The state budget



1 office shall report to the senate and house appropriations
 2 committees, relevant senate and house appropriations subcommittees,
 3 and senate and house fiscal agencies no later than June 30, 2020
 4 and September 30, 2020 on the types of activities supported with
 5 the funds, and the amount of funds expended to date.

 7 **DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT, AND BUDGET**

8 Sec. 301. (1) The coronavirus response fund is created within
 9 the state treasury.

10 (2) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for the coronavirus
 11 response fund, \$35,000,000.00 shall be deposited into the
 12 coronavirus response fund.

13 (3) Funds may only be spent from the coronavirus response fund
 14 upon appropriation, or legislative transfer pursuant to section 393
 15 of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

16 (4) Interest and earnings from the investment of funds
 17 deposited in the coronavirus response fund shall be deposited in
 18 the general fund.

19 (5) Funds in the coronavirus response fund at the close of a
 20 fiscal year shall remain in the coronavirus response fund and shall
 21 not lapse to the general fund.

22 Sec. 302. (1) Federal revenues authorized by and available
 23 from the federal government for the respiratory virus coronavirus-
 24 19 (COVID-19) public health emergency and related economic response
 25 are appropriated to departments for state and local preparedness
 26 and response activities. If additional expenditure authorization in
 27 the statewide integrated governmental management application
 28 (SIGMA) is approved by the state budget office under this section,
 29 the department and the state budget office shall notify the chairs



1 of the senate and house of representatives appropriations
2 subcommittees that have jurisdiction over the expended funds and
3 the senate and house fiscal agencies within 10 days after the
4 approval.

5 (2) This section shall remain in effect for no longer than 90
6 days after the effective date of this act.

7 Sec. 303. In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,
8 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$35,000,000.00 for
9 state restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available
10 for expenditure until they have been transferred to another line
11 item in part 1 under section 393(2) of the management and budget
12 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
