ENROLLED SENATE BILL No. 57

AN ACT to amend chapter III of Act No. 165 of the Public Acts of 1929, entitled as amended "An act to protect fish in all the waters over which this state has jurisdiction; to regulate the manner of taking, possession, transportation, size and sale of fish; to regulate the taking and sale of minnows, wigglers, sturgeon, and noxious fish in all waters over which this state has jurisdiction; to provide for the issuing of licenses and permits to take fish from all waters over which this state has jurisdiction and for the disposition of the funds derived therefrom; to define what shall be classed as inland waters; to regulate the manner and method of taking turtles; to provide penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act, and to repeal certain acts relating thereto," as amended, being sections 303.1 to 303.11 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, by adding section 1b.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Chapter III of Act No. 165 of the Public Acts of 1929, as amended, being sections 303.1 to 303.11 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended by adding section 1b to read as follows:

CHAPTER III

Sec. 1b. Notwithstanding any other provision in this act or any order of the commission of natural resources or the director of the department of natural resources, the following provisions shall be applicable during the open season for trout in that portion of Duck Creek within Gogebic County, Watersmeet Township, beginning at the old railroad bridge SE-SE section 16, T44N-R39W downstream to the Middle Branch of the Ontonagon River at NW-NW Section 27, T45N-R39W:

- (a) Only artificial lures may be used to take trout.
- (b) Trout must be at least 10 inches in length.
- (c) Not more than 5 trout may be taken per day.

Section 2. This amendatory act shall take effect on January 1, 1989.
