ENROLLED SENATE BILL No. 115

AN ACT to amend section 1169 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, entitled as amended "An act to provide a system of public instruction and elementary and secondary schools; to revise, consolidate, and classify the laws relating to elementary and secondary education; to provide for the classification, organization, regulation, and maintenance of schools, school districts, and intermediate school districts; to prescribe rights, powers, duties, and privileges of schools, school districts, and intermediate school districts; to provide for school elections and to prescribe powers and duties with respect thereto; to provide for the levy and collection of taxes; to provide for the borrowing of money and issuance of bonds and other evidences of indebtedness; to provide for and prescribe the powers and duties of certain boards and officials; to provide for licensure of boarding schools; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts," being section 380.1169 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Section 1169 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, being section 380.1169 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1169. (1) The principal modes by which dangerous communicable diseases, including, but not limited to, acquired immunodeficiency syndrome, are spread and the best methods for the restriction and prevention of these diseases shall be taught in every public school in this state.

(2) The curricula to be used for acquired immunodeficiency syndrome required to be taught under subsection (1) shall be approved by the appropriate local board of education prior to its use in the school setting.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.
