## **HOUSE BILL No. 5855**

September 7, 1988, Introduced by Rep. Van Singel and referred to the Committee on State Affairs.

A bill to authorize the state transportation department to convey certain state owned property located in Montcalm county; to prescribe conditions for the conveyance; and to provide for disposition of the revenue derived from the conveyance.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. The state transportation department, on behalf of
- 2 the state, may convey to the city of Greenville, for considera-
- 3 tion of \$1.00, property located in the city of Greenville,
- 4 Montcalm county, and described as follows:
- 5 That part of Section 10, Town 9 North, Range 8 West, City of
- 6 Greenville, County of Montcalm, State of Michigan, described as
- 7 follows: Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4, except the South 112 feet of Lot
- 8 1, Block 1, Edward's Fifth Addition and commencing at the
- 9 Northwest corner of Edward's Fifth Addition, thence East on the
- 10 North line extended, of said addition to the North/South Quarter

- 1 line of said Section 10, thence North on said Quarter line to
- 2 Flat River, thence Southerly along said river to the point of
- 3 beginning. To include all that part of vacated East Cass Street
- 4 lying East of the Flat River.
- 5 Sec. 2. The conveyance authorized by this act shall provide
- 6 that the land shall be used exclusively for public purposes and
- 7 that upon termination of that use or upon use for any private
- 8 purpose, title to the land shall revert immediately to the state,
- 9 with the state having no liability for any improvements made by
- 10 the city of Greenville.
- 11 Sec. 3. The conveyance authorized by this act shall be by
- 12 quitclaim deed approved by the attorney general, and shall
- 13 reserve to the state rights to all coal, oil, gas, and other min-
- 14 erals found on, within, or under the property.
- 15 Sec. 4. The revenue received under this act shall be depos-
- 16 ited in the state treasury and credited to the general fund.
