March 10, 1987, Introduced by Senators NICHOLS, CROPSEY, WELBORN, GEAKE, BINSFELD and GAST and referred to the Committee on Human Resources and Senior Citizens.

A bill to amend section 55 of Act No. 154 of the Public Acts of 1974, entitled as amended

"Michigan occupational safety and health act,"

as amended by Act No. 24 of the Public Acts of 1986, being section 408.1055 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 55 of Act No. 154 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1974, as amended by Act No. 24 of the Public Acts of 1986, being
- 3 section 408.1055 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 55. (1) To accomplish the objectives outlined in sec-
- 6 tion 54, a safety education and training fund is created. The
- 7 state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund and may invest the
- 8 surplus of the fund in investments as in the state treasurer's
- 9 judgment are in the best interest of the state. Earnings from

- I those investments shall be credited to the fund. The state
- 2 treasurer shall notify the director of the department of labor
- 3 and the legislature of interest credited and the balance of the
- 4 safety education and training fund as of December 31 of each
- 5 year.
- 6 (2) The director of the department of labor shall supervise
- 7 and administer the fund. The director shall annually assess a
- 8 -levy SUM based on the total annual worker's disability compen-
- 9 sation losses, excluding medical payments, paid in the previous
- 10 calendar year by employers under the worker's disability compen-
- 11 sation act of 1969, Act No. 317 of the Public Acts of 1969, as
- 12 amended, being sections 418.101 to 418.941 of the Michigan
- 13 Compiled Laws. As soon as practicable after January 1, 1986, and
- 14 each year thereafter, the director, except as provided in this
- 15 subsection and subsection (3), shall assess upon and collect from
- 16 each carrier, self-insured employer, and the state accident
- 17 fund a sum equal to that proportion of 50% of the current fiscal
- 18 year appropriation of safety education and training funds which
- 19 the total worker's disability compensation benefits, exclusive of
- 20 medical payments, paid by each carrier, the -state- accident
- 21 fund, or each self-insured employer bears to the total of the
- 22 compensation benefits paid by all carriers, self-insured employ-
- 23 ers, and the -state accident fund during the previous calendar
- 24 year, except the total amount -levied ASSESSED annually shall
- 25 not exceed 3/4 of 1% of the total of the compensation benefits
- 26 paid by all carriers, self-insured employers, and the -state-
- 27 accident fund during the previous calendar year. Funds which are

- 1 unexpended at the end of each fiscal year shall be returned to
- 2 the safety education and training fund.
- 3 (3) If at any time during the fiscal year in which the
- 4 assessment required by subsection (2) is made the balance of
- 5 money in the safety education and training fund would be less
- 6 than \$1,500,000.00, the assessment shall equal the total fiscal
- 7 year appropriation of safety education and training funds.
- 8 (4) Notice of the assessments shall be sent by the director
- 9 of the department of labor by mail to each carrier. Payment of
- 10 assessments shall be received in the principal office of the
- 11 department of labor before a date specified uniformly in the
- 12 notice, but not less than 90 days after the date of mailing.
- (5) The levy assessments shall constitute an element of
- 14 loss for the purpose of establishing rates for worker's disabil-
- 15 ity compensation insurance. Funds derived from -this levy THESE
- 16 ASSESSMENTS shall be deposited in the safety education and train-
- 17 ing fund and shall be appropriated by the legislature for the
- 18 operation of this program.
- 19 (6) To enable full and complete legislative review of the
- 20 assessment process, the department of labor, not later than
- 21 September 30, 1991, shall submit to the legislature and the house
- 22 OF REPRESENTATIVES and senate committees that consider labor mat-
- 23 ters a written report on the status of the safety education and
- 24 training assessment required by this section. The report shall
- 25 include, but not be limited to, information on the TOTAL amount
- 26 of the assessment, the percentage of the assessment as compared

- 1 to losses, and the balance of money in the safety education and
- 2 training fund.
- 3 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless

- 5 Legislature is enacted into law.
