

SENATE BILL No. 925

June 21, 1988, Introduced by Senators KELLY, BARCIA, FESSLER, SCHWARZ
and DE GROW and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend section 310 of Act No. 150 of the Public
Acts of 1967, entitled
"Michigan military act,"
being section 32.710 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 310 of Act No. 150 of the Public Acts of
2 1967, being section 32.710 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 310. The adjutant general shall be the military advi-
5 sor to the governor and ~~may~~ SHALL be the director of the
6 department of military affairs. ~~His~~ THE ADJUTANT GENERAL'S
7 office shall be maintained in Lansing. ~~He is authorized to~~ THE
8 ADJUTANT GENERAL MAY publish orders and other directives in the
9 name of the governor and the state to implement and administer
10 ~~his~~ THE duties and responsibilities as outlined in this

1 ~~statute. His~~ ACT. THE ADJUTANT GENERAL'S duties shall include
2 maintenance of the personnel records of all persons, active,
3 inactive, retired, and deceased of the state military establish-
4 ment; liaison in the transaction of official business for the
5 state with the United States and for this state with other states
6 and territories, including those duties devolving upon ~~him~~ THE
7 ADJUTANT GENERAL pursuant to the national defense act and other
8 pertinent federal laws and regulations. ~~He~~ THE ADJUTANT
9 GENERAL shall maintain records of claims for state gratuities for
10 military service rendered by citizens of this state and, when
11 authorized by the legislature, shall receive, examine, process,
12 and recommend the payment of gratuities in accordance with law.
13 ~~He~~ THE ADJUTANT GENERAL shall be entitled to use the coat of
14 arms of Michigan with the words added "State of Michigan,
15 Department of Military Affairs" as ~~his~~ THE seal of office. All
16 copies of orders, records, and papers certified and authenticated
17 under such seal shall be equivalent in evidence to the
18 originals.
