

HOUSE BILL No. 4929

June 6, 1991, Introduced by Reps Randall, Hickner, DeBeaussaert and Gnodtke and referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Forestry and Minerals.

A bill to amend section 12901 of Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978, entitled as amended "Public health code," as amended by Act No. 209 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 333.12901 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 12901 of Act No. 368 of the Public Acts
2 of 1978, as amended by Act No. 209 of the Public Acts of 1988,
3 being section 333.12901 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended
4 to read as follows:

5 Sec. 12901. (1) As used in this part:

6 (a) "Bed and breakfast" means a private residence that
7 offers sleeping accommodations to transient tenants in 14 or
8 fewer rooms for rent, is the innkeeper's residence in which the
9 innkeeper resides while renting the rooms to transient tenants,

1 serves breakfasts at no extra cost to its transient tenants, and
2 has a smoke detector in proper working order in every sleeping
3 room and a fire extinguisher in proper working order on every
4 floor.

5 (b) "Continental breakfast" means the serving of only nonpo-
6 tentially hazardous food, such as a roll, pastry or doughnut,
7 fruit juice, hot beverage, or individual portions of milk, and
8 items incidental to ~~such~~ THESE foods.

9 (c) "Food service establishment" means a fixed or mobile
10 restaurant, coffee shop, cafeteria, short order cafe, luncheon-
11 ette, grill, tearoom, sandwich shop, soda fountain, tavern, bar,
12 cocktail lounge, nightclub, drive-in, industrial feeding estab-
13 lishment, private organization serving the public, rental hall,
14 catering kitchen, delicatessen, theater, commissary, or similar
15 place in which food or drink is prepared for direct consumption
16 through service on the premises or elsewhere, and any other
17 eating or drinking establishment or operation where food is
18 served or provided for the public. Food service establishment
19 does not apply to any of the following:

20 (i) An inpatient food service operation located in a health
21 facility or agency subject to licensure under article 17.

22 (ii) Unless the establishment is carrying out operations
23 beyond the scope of its license, an establishment licensed and
24 inspected under any of the following acts:

8 (iii) A motel that serves continental breakfasts only.

9 (iv) A food concession at a state or county fair.

10 (v) A charitable, religious, fraternal, or other nonprofit
 11 organization operating a home-prepared baked goods sale or serv-
 12 ing only home-prepared food in connection with its meetings or as
 13 part of a fund raising event.

14 (vi) A food establishment that is licensed and inspected
 15 under the food processing act of 1977, Act No. 328 of the Public
 16 Acts of 1978, being sections 289.801 to 289.810 of the Michigan
 17 Compiled Laws, even if the food establishment sells for consump-
 18 tion off the premises, in a volume incidental to the total volume
 19 of the food establishment, any of the following:

20 (A) Prepackaged food that is offered for sale in individual
 21 portions that do not require preparation in the food establish-
 22 ment except for temperature modification. As used in this sub-
 23 paragraph, "prepackaged food" means food that is prepared and
 24 packaged either at a facility inspected and approved by the
 25 United States department of agriculture or a facility that is
 26 licensed as a food processor under the food processing act of
 27 1977, Act No. 328 of the Public Acts of 1978.

1 (B) Food that is prepared at the food establishment,
2 displayed in bulk form for sale, and sold in quantities other
3 than individual portions.

4 (C) Beverages, including, but not limited to, hot chocolate,
5 coffee, tea, slush, and soda pop.

6 (D) Hand dipped ice cream.

7 (E) Rotisserie prepared hot dogs.

8 (F) Other foods as determined by the director or his or her
9 representative, in conjunction with the director of the depart-
10 ment of agriculture or his or her representative.

11 (vii) A bakery that is licensed and inspected under the food
12 processing act of 1977, Act No. 328 of the Public Acts of 1978,
13 even if the bakery sells hot or cold beverages or temperature
14 modified bakery products ~~—~~ in a volume incidental to the total
15 volume of business of the bakery.

16 (viii) An establishment otherwise within the scope of this
17 act ~~which~~ THAT is licensed and inspected by the department of
18 agriculture ~~—~~ if the manner of licensing and inspection is
19 mutually agreed upon by the director and the director of the
20 department of agriculture or their designated representatives.

21 (ix) A bed and breakfast that has 8 or fewer sleeping rooms,
22 including sleeping rooms occupied by the innkeeper, 1 or more of
23 which are available for rent to transient tenants.

24 (x) A bed and breakfast that has at least 9 but fewer than
25 15 rooms for rent, if the bed and breakfast serves continental
26 breakfasts only.

1 (xi) A temporary food service establishment using only
2 single service articles and serving only food or beverages that
3 do not come within the definition of potentially hazardous food
4 or beverage. As used in this subparagraph, "potentially hazard-
5 ous food or beverage" means any food that consists, in whole or
6 in part, of milk or milk products, eggs, meat, poultry, fish,
7 shellfish, edible crustacea, or other ingredients, including syn-
8 thetic ingredients, in a form capable of supporting rapid and
9 progressive growth of infectious or toxigenic microorganisms.
10 The term does not include clean, whole, uncracked, odor-free
11 shell eggs or foods ~~which~~ THAT have a pH level of 4.6 or below
12 or a water activity (aw) value of 0.85 or less.

13 (d) "Transient tenant" means a person who rents a room in a
14 bed and breakfast for fewer than 30 consecutive days.

15 (e) "Person" means a person as defined in section 1106 or a
16 governmental entity.

17 (f) "Temporary food service establishment" means a food
18 service establishment ~~which~~ THAT operates at a fixed location
19 for a temporary period of time not to exceed 2 weeks.

20 (g) "Transitory food unit" means a food service establish-
21 ment that operates from and is regularly transported by a motor
22 vehicle, and ~~which~~ THAT does not regularly return to a fixed
23 food service establishment licensed by the department for servic-
24 ing and maintenance.

25 (h) "Vending machine" means a self-service device offered
26 for public use ~~which~~ THAT, upon insertion of a coin, ~~or~~
27 token, ~~or by other similar means~~ CARD, KEY, OR PAPER CURRENCY,

1 dispenses unit servings of food or beverages without the
2 necessity of replenishing the device between each vending
3 operation. ~~The term does not mean a~~ VENDING MACHINE DOES NOT
4 INCLUDE:

5 (A) A device ~~which~~ THAT dispenses only bottled or canned
6 soft drinks; other packaged nonperishable foods or beverages; or
7 bulk ball gum, nuts, and panned candies.

8 (B) A WATER-DISPENSING MACHINE THAT IS LOCATED INSIDE A FOOD
9 ESTABLISHMENT THAT IS LICENSED UNDER THE FOOD PROCESSING ACT OF
10 1977, ACT NO. 328 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1978, BEING SECTIONS
11 289.801 TO 289.810 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS.

12 (i) "Vending machine location" means the room, enclosure,
13 space, or area ~~where~~ IN WHICH 1 or more vending machines are
14 installed and operated.

15 (2) In addition, article 1 contains general definitions and
16 principles of construction ~~applicable~~ THAT APPLY to all arti-
17 cles in this code.
