

SENATE BILL No. 397

July 11, 1991, Introduced by Senator HOLMES and referred to the
the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of social services
for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991; to prescribe powers and
duties for certain state agencies; and to provide for the expenditure of
the appropriations.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the department of social serv-
2 ices for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991, from the following
3 funds:

4 DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES

5 Hospital services and therapy..... \$ 4,000,000

6 Appropriated from:

7 State general fund/general purpose..... \$ 4,000,000

1 GENERAL SECTIONS

2 Sec. 201. (1) In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of
3 article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from
4 state resources in this appropriation act is \$4,000,000.00 and state
5 appropriations to be paid to units of local government in section 101 are
6 zero.

7 (2) When it appears to the principal executive officer of each
8 department that state spending to local units of government will be less
9 than the amount that was projected to be expended for any quarter, the
10 principal executive officer shall immediately give notice of the appro-
11 priate shortfall to the department of management and budget, the senate
12 and house appropriations committees, and the senate and house fiscal
13 agencies.

14 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized
15 under this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards,
16 offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made under this act
17 are subject to the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public
18 Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled
19 Laws.

20 Sec. 301. From the funds appropriated in section 101 for hospital
21 services and therapy an emergency grant of \$4,000,000.00 shall be made to
22 southwest Detroit hospital to defray operating expenses and to ensure its
23 continued operation.
