AN ACT to repeal Act No. 2 of the Local Acts of 1937, entitled "An act to prevent hunting on Sunday in the county of Branch; to authorize the arrest of person or persons so offending and to prescribe the penalty therefor; and to provide a referendum thereon," and to authorize a referendum.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. (1) This act shall not take effect until it is submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the county of Branch and ratified by a majority of the electors voting on the question. The question of the adoption of this act shall be submitted to the voters of the county at the next general election, or any special election called by the county board of commissioners after the effective date of this act, and notice of this ballot question shall be given as is required by law in the case of elections to elect county officers, and shall be submitted in substantially the following form:

Shall Act No. ____ of the Local Acts of 1993, entitled "An act to repeal Act No. 2 of the Local Acts of 1937, which is an act passed in 1937 to prohibit hunting in Branch county with dogs or firearm on Sunday," be adopted?

- (2) The results of the vote shall be canvassed by the board of state canvassers.
- (3) If a majority of the qualified electors voting on the question, as determined by the canvass of votes cast, vote in favor of the adoption of this act, it shall become effective 10 days following the certification of the election results.

Section 2. Act No. 2 of the Local Acts of 1937 is repealed if within 2 years of the effective date of this act the issue of whether or not to repeal Act No. 2 of the Local Acts of 1937 is submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the county of Branch and the repeal of Act No. 2 of the Local Acts of 1937 is ratified by a majority of the electors voting on the question.
