## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 1284 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts

section 380.1284 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

- 3 being section 380.1284 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 1284. (1) The board of a school district shall deter-
- 6 mine the length of the school term. The minimum number of days
- 7 of student instruction shall be 180 YEAR, AND SHALL PROVIDE AT
- 8 LEAST 180 DAYS AND 900 HOURS OF PUPIL INSTRUCTION. NOT LATER
- 9 THAN JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE BOARD OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL

- 1 ADOPT AND PUBLISH A SCHEDULE FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR, WITH A SPECIAL
- 2 SCHEDULED STARTING DATE AND ENDING DATE, FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR THAT
- 3 BEGINS IN THAT CALENDAR YEAR. UNLESS THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHED-
- 4 ULES AN EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR OF MORE THAN 180 DAYS OF PUPIL
- 5 INSTRUCTION. THE SCHOOL YEAR SHALL BE SCHEDULED TO BEGIN NOT
- 6 LATER THAN THE WEDNESDAY AFTER LABOR DAY AND TO END NOT LATER
- 7 THAN THE END OF THE SECOND FULL WEEK IN JUNE. Except as provided
- 8 in section 101 of the state school aid act of 1979, being
- 9 section 388.1701 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, a district fail-
- 10 ing to hold 180 days AND 900 HOURS of -student PUPIL instruction
- 11 shall forfeit 1/180 of its total state school aid for each day of
- 12 failure. Not later than August 1, the board of each district
- 13 shall certify to the state board the number of days of -student-
- 14 PUPIL instruction in the previous school year. If the district
- 15 did not hold at least 180 days AND 900 HOURS of student PUPIL
- 16 instruction, the deduction of state school aid shall be made in
- 17 the following fiscal year from the first payment of state school
- 18 aid. Days lost because of strikes or teachers' conferences shall
- 19 not be counted as days of <del>student</del> PUPIL instruction.
- 20 (2) IF THERE IS A TEACHER STRIKE IN A SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT
- 21 OCCURS ON OR AFTER THE SCHEDULED STARTING DATE FOR THE SCHOOL
- 22 YEAR, THE BOARD OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL ENSURE THAT THE MIN-
- 23 IMUM 180 DAYS AND 900 HOURS OF PUPIL INSTRUCTION ARE PROVIDED
- 24 ACCORDING TO THE SCHOOL YEAR SCHEDULE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD BY
- 25 HIRING SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS TO PROVIDE THE NECESSARY INSTRUCTION.
- 26 (3) IF A TEACHER EMPLOYED BY A SCHOOL DISTRICT PARTICIPATES
- 27 IN A TEACHER STRIKE IN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OCCURRING ON OR AFTER

- 1 THE SCHEDULED STARTING DATE FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR, THE TEACHER
- 2 SHALL FORFEIT, AND THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL WITHHOLD, 1/180 OF
- 3 THE TEACHER'S ANNUAL SALARY FOR EACH DAY OF PUPIL INSTRUCTION
- 4 DURING WHICH THE STRIKE OCCURS. SALARY FORFEITED AND WITHHELD
- 5 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION IS NOT WAGES EARNED BY THE TEACHER FOR THE
- 6 PURPOSES OF ANY STATE LAW. A SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL NOT LENGTHEN
- 7 OR OTHERWISE ALTER THE SCHEDULED SCHOOL YEAR IN A MANNER THAT
- 8 WOULD ALLOW A TEACHER TO RECOVER ANY PART OF THE SALARY FORFEITED
- 9 AND WITHHELD UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, AND AN EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT OR
- 10 COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT COVERING THE TEACHER SHALL NOT
- II PROVIDE FOR REIMBURSEMENT, EITHER DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, OF ANY
- 12 PART OF THE SALARY FORFEITED AND WITHHELD UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- (4) -(2)— The state board shall promulgate rules for the
- 14 implementation of this section.
