- 3 funds and either receive or are eligible for other family planning funds
- 4 shall have the option of receiving all of their family planning funds

- 5 free Michigan, a maximum of 2 5% shall be allocated to adolescent health
- 6 care centers that currently provide smoking prevention programs These
- 7 funds shall be distributed under the current adolescent health center
- 8 allocation formula
- 9 Sec 311 (1) The funds appropriated in section 101 for violence

- 18 as defined in Act No 472 of the Public Acts of 1978 being sections
- 19 4 411 to 4 431 of the Michigan Compiled Laws
