

## **HOUSE BILL No. 5784**

September 14, 1994 Introduced by Rep Gustafson and referred to the Committee on Public Utilities

A bill to amend section 3g of Act No 206 of the Public Acts of 1913, entitled as amended

"An act to declare telephone lines and telephone companies within this state to be common carriers to regulate the telephone business to confer certain powers, duties, and responsibilities on the public service commission to provide for the consolidation of telephone lines and telephone companies to prohibit certain uses of telephone lines and telephone equipment to regulate persons using telephone lines and telephone equipment to prescribe a penalty for the violation of this act and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts on specific dates

as added by Act No 309 of the Public Acts of 1990 being section 484 103g of the Michigan Compiled Laws

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT

- 1 Sec 3g (1) Notwithstanding any other provision in this
- 2 act, an alternative operator service provider shall do all of the
- 3 following -- EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2) AS USED IN THIS
- 4 SECTION ALTERNATIVE OPERATOR SERVICE MEANS AN OPERATOR SERVICE
- 5 THAT INCLUDES ANY AUTOMATIC OR LIVE ASSISTANCE TO A CONSUMER TO
- 6 ARRANGE FOR BILLING OR COMPLETION OF A TELEPHONE CALL BETWEEN
- 7 POINTS WITHIN THIS STATE THAT ARE SPECIFIED BY THE USER THROUGH A
- 8 METHOD OTHER THAN 1 OF THE FOLLOWING
- 9 (A) AUTOMATIC COMPLETION WITH BILLING TO THE TELEPHONE FROM
- 10 WHICH THE CALL ORIGINATED
- (B) COMPLETION THROUGH AN ACCESS CODE OR A PROPRIETARY
- 12 ACCOUNT NUMBER USED BY THE CONSUMER, WITH BILLING TO AN ACCOUNT
- 13 PREVIOUSLY ESTABLISHED WITH THE CARRIER BY THE CONSUMER
- 14 (C) COMPLETION IN ASSOCIATION WITH DIRECTORY ASSISTANCE
- 15 SERVICES
- 16 (2) 'ALTERNATIVE OPERATOR SERVICE DOES NOT INCLUDE OPERATOR
- 17 SERVICE OFFERED BY A PROVIDER OF TOLL SERVICE OR BASIC LOCAL
- 18 EXCHANGE SERVICE AS THOSE TERMS ARE DEFINED IN SECTION 102 OF THE
- 19 MICHIGAN TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACT, ACT NO 179 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS
- 20 OF 1991 BEING SECTION 484 2102 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS
- 21 (3) COMMISSION MEANS THE MICHIGAN PUBLIC SERVICE
- 22 COMMISSION
- 23 (4) THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT AND ENFORCE OPERATING
- 24 REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROVISION OF ALTERNATIVE OPERATOR SERVICES
- 25 THESE REQUIREMENTS SHALL INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO THE
- 26 FOLLOWING

- (a) Furnish each entity with which -it- THE ALTERNATIVE
- 2 OPERATOR PROVIDER contracts to provide operator service a
- 3 sticker, card, or other form of information for each telephone
- 4 that has access to the operator service and is intended to be
- 5 used by the public The information shall include the name of
- 6 the alternative operator service provider a toll-free customer
- 7 service telephone number and a statement that charges imposed by
- 8 the alternative operator service and additional information may
- 9 be obtained by calling the toll-free telephone number The
- 10 alternative operator service provider shall require by contract
- II that the entity receiving the information display it on or near
- 12 each of the telephones that has access to the service and is
- 13 intended for use by the public This information shall be dis-
- 14 played prior to implementing the contract If the operator serv-
- 15 ice provider owns telephones through which it provides operator
- 16 services, the information shall also be displayed on or near
- 17 those telephones
- (b) Prior to the connection of each alternative operator
- 19 service call do the following
- 20 (1) Announce the alternative operator service provider s
- 21 name
- 22 (11) Quote at the caller s request and without charge the
- 23 rate and any other fees or surcharges applicable to the call
- 24 charged by the alternative operator service
- 25 (c) Allow a caller to the alternative operator service to
- 26 choose the carrier of his or her choice by doing either of the
- 27 following

- 1 (1) After informing the caller that the rates for the call
- 2 may not reflect the rates for a call from the location of the
- 3 caller and receiving the caller s consent transfer the caller to
- 4 the carrier of his or her choice without charge
- 5 (11) Instruct the caller how to reach his or her carrier of
- 6 choice by dialing the carrier s 950 1-800 or 10-XXX access
- 7 method
- 8 (d) Allow callers to the alternative operator service to
- 9 reach emergency services without charge
- 10 (5) A PERSON SHALL NOT PROVIDE ALTERNATIVE OPERATOR SERVICES
- II IN THIS STATE WITHOUT FIRST REGISTERING WITH THE COMMISSION THE
- 12 REGISTRATION SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION
- 13 (A) THE NAME OF THE PROVIDER
- 14 (B) THE ADDRESS OF THE PROVIDER S PRINCIPAL OFFICE
- 15 (C) IF THE PROVIDER IS NOT LOCATED IN THIS STATE, THE
- 16 ADDRESS OF THE REGISTERED OFFICE AND THE NAME OF THE REGISTERED
- 17 AGENT AUTHORIZED TO RECEIVE SERVICE OF PROCESS IN THIS STATE
- 18 (D) ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT THE COMMISSION MAY REQUIRE
- (6) THE REGISTRATION SHALL BE ACCOMPANIED WITH A REGISTRA-
- 20 TION FEE OF \$100 00
- 21 (7) THE REGISTRATION IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY UPON FILING
- 22 WITH THE COMMISSION AND THE PAYMENT OF THE REGISTRATION FEE AND
- 23 SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT FOR 1 YEAR FROM ITS EFFECTIVE DATE
- 24 (8) A REGISTRATION MAY BE RENEWED FOR 1 YEAR BY FILING WITH
- 25 THE COMMISSION A RENEWAL REGISTRATION ON A FORM PROVIDED BY THE
- 26 COMMISSION AND THE PAYMENT OF A RENEWAL FEE OF \$100 00

- 1 (9) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED BY THE COMMISSION A
- 2 PROVIDER SHALL NOT CHARGE A RATE FOR ALTERNATIVE OPERATOR
- 3 SERVICES THAT IS GREATER THAN 2 TIMES THE STATE AVERAGE RATE FOR
- 4 SIMILAR OPERATOR SERVICES
- 5 (10) ALL ORDERS ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION UNDER THIS SECTION
- 6 SHALL BE NONDISCRIMINATORY AND DESIGNED TO PROMOTE COMPETITION
- 7 WHICH FACILITATES CONSUMER CHOICE
- 8 (11)  $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$  In addition to any other penalty provided for in
- 9 this act a person who is charged for the use of an alternative
- 10 operator service or is denied access to emergency services in
- II violation of this section may bring an action IN A COURT OF COM-
- 12 PETENT JURISDICTION to recover actual damages or \$250 00 which-
- 13 ever is greater along with reasonable attorney fees
- 14 (12) -(3) This section does not apply to specialized tele-
- 15 communications in local county or state correctional or other
- 16 confinement facilities, including juvenile and mental health
- 17 facilities
- 18 (4) As used in this section, "alternative operator service"
- 19 means an operator service that is separate from the operator
- 20 service provided by the local exchange carrier and that is not
- 21 offered at prices that are required by law to be approved and on
- 22 file with the commission
