

SENATE BILL No. 269

January 28, 1993, Introduced by Senators FAXON, CHERRY, HONIGMAN, CISKY, MILLER and SCHWARZ and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to establish the Michigan school reorganization commission; to prescribe its powers and duties; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state officials, departments, and agencies; to provide for an appropriation; and to repeal certain parts of the act on specific dates.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Commission" means the Michigan school reorganization
- 3 commission created in section 2.
- 4 (b) "Pupil membership count day" means that term as defined
- 5 in section 6 of the state school aid act of 1979, Act No. 94 of
- 6 the Public Acts of 1979, being section 388.1606 of the Michigan
- 7 Compiled Laws.
- 8 (c) "School district" means a school district or a local act
- 9 school district, as defined in the school code of 1976, Act

- 1 No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 380.1 to
- 2 380.1852, of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 3 Sec. 2. (1) Not later than 30 days after the effective date
- 4 of this act, the governor shall appoint with the advice and con-
- 5 sent of the senate the Michigan school reorganization commission
- 6 for the purpose of developing a plan to reduce the number of
- 7 school districts in this state.
- 8 (2) The commission shall consist of the following 9
- 9 members:
- 10 (a) One member representing school districts in the Upper
- 11 Peninsula.
- 12 (b) One member representing school districts in the area of
- 13 the Lower Peninsula north of the Bay City-Muskegon line.
- 14 (c) Three members representing school districts in the
- 15 remainder of the state. As far as practicable, the members
- 16 appointed under this subdivision shall be fairly representative
- 17 of the various types of school districts and various regions
- 18 represented.
- (d) Four members representing the general public.
- 20 (3) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled in the same
- 21 manner as the original appointment.
- 22 (4) Not later than 10 days after all appointments have been
- 23 made and confirmed under this section, the commission shall hold
- 24 its first meeting. At the meeting, the commission shall elect a
- 25 chairperson and other officers as it considers necessary from
- 26 among its members. Following this initial meeting, the

- 1 commission shall hold meetings as considered necessary by the 2 chairperson.
- 3 (5) A majority of the members of the commission constitute a
- 4 quorum for the transaction of business at a meeting of the
- 5 commission. Action by the commission shall be by a majority of
- 6 the votes cast.
- 7 (6) A member of the commission shall be reimbursed for
- 8 actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of
- 9 official duties.
- 10 Sec. 3. The commission shall do all of the following:
- 11 (a) Develop a school reorganization plan in compliance with
- 12 section 5 to reduce the number of school districts in this
- 13 state.
- (b) Not later than 6 months after the date of the first
- 15 meeting of the commission, publish a report on its findings and
- 16 recommendations on school reorganization. The report shall
- 17 include a schedule for implementation, with consideration given
- 18 to the duration of existing collective bargaining agreements and
- 19 the need for holding new elections for board members.
- 20 (c) After the publication of the report described in
- 21 subdivision (b), hold public hearings across the state to provide
- 22 appropriate information to citizens, to answer questions, and to
- 23 hear testimony on school reorganization.
- 24 (d) After the completion of the public hearings required by
- 25 subdivision (c) but not later than 1 year after the date of the
- 26 first meeting of the commission, revise its findings and
- 27 recommendations as necessary and publish a final report on its

- 1 findings and recommendations on school reorganization and submit
- 2 a copy of the report to the legislature.
- 3 Sec. 4. Not later than 30 days after receiving the
- 4 commission's final report submitted under section 3, the legisla-
- 5 ture shall convert the recommendations on school reorganization
- 6 contained in the final report into the form of a bill and shall
- 7 introduce the bill. After introduction, the bill containing the
- 8 commission's recommendations shall be acted upon by the legisla-
- 9 ture in the same manner as other bills except that it shall not
- 10 be subject to amendment in either house of the legislature. If
- 11 the legislature passes the bill containing the commission's rec-
- 12 ommendations, it shall do so by not later than the sine die
- 13 adjournment of the 87th Legislature.
- 14 Sec. 5. In developing the school reorganization plan
- 15 required by section 3(a), the commission shall take into account
- 16 all of the following criteria:
- 17 (a) A new school district shall operate a school program of
- 18 kindergarten through twelfth grade.
- 19 (b) The total number of school districts in this state shall
- 20 not exceed 250.
- 21 (c) Except as provided in this subdivision, a new school
- 22 district shall have at least 2,000 pupils according to the most
- 23 recent pupil membership count day. This 2,000 pupil requirement
- 24 may be waived if either of the following conditions applies:
- 25 (i) Due to a low population density, the 2,000 pupil
- 26 requirement would place an undue hardship upon pupils within the

- 1 new school district by requiring more than 1 hour of travel time
- 2 to the nearest school for pupils attending that school.
- (ii) The pupil population trends indicate that a new school
- 4 district with less than 2,000 pupils will have at least 2,000
- 5 pupils within 1 year after the formation of the new school
- 6 district.
- 7 (d) A new school district shall not be required to be larger
- 8 in territory than 1 county.
- 9 (e) A new school district shall not be so large in territory
- 10 as to require more than 1 hour of travel time to the nearest
- 11 school for a pupil attending that school.
- (f) A new school district shall be compact and reflect some
- 13 continuity of a former district.
- 14 (g) A new school district, to the extent possible in keeping
- 15 with the other criteria under this section, shall be formed along
- 16 municipal boundary lines.
- 17 (h) A new school district shall be comprised of residents of
- 18 various economic levels and racial backgrounds.
- 19 (i) A new school district shall efficiently use existing
- 20 school buildings and facilities.
- 21 (j) Other relevant data, material, and concepts that will
- 22 increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the operation of the
- 23 educational system conducted by school districts formed or reor-
- 24 ganized pursuant to this act.
- Sec. 6. The commission may do 1 or both of the following:
- 26 (a) Accept assistance from state departments, agencies, and
- 27 individuals.

- 1 (b) Form committees or working groups as appropriate for the
- 2 performance of its responsibilities.
- 3 Sec. 7. The department of education and any other depart-
- 4 ment or agency as requested by the commission shall assist the
- 5 commission and shall provide staff and services as required by
- 6 the commission.
- 7 Sec. 8. The commission shall comply with the open meetings
- 8 act, Act No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections
- 9 15.261 to 15.275 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, and the freedom
- 10 of information act, Act No. 442 of the Public Acts of 1976, being
- 11 sections 15.231 to 15.246 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- Sec. 9. The legislature annually shall appropriate to the
- 13 commission a sum sufficient to implement this act.
- 14 Sec. 10. This act is repealed effective on the sine die
- 15 adjournment of the 87th Legislature.
