

SENATE BILL No. 505

March 17, 1993, Introduced by Senators GAST, FAUST, DINGELL, KOIVISTO and EHLERS and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs.

A bill to amend section 4701 of Act No. 236 of the Public Acts of 1961, entitled as amended

"Revised judicature act of 1961,"

as added by Act No. 104 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 600.4701 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 4701 of Act No. 236 of the Public Acts

- 9 317.181 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS, THAT IS PUNISHABLE UNDER
- 10 SECTION 9(2) OF THE RECREATIONAL TRESPASS ACT, ACT NO. 323 OF THE
- 11 PUBLIC ACTS OF 1976, BEING SECTION 317.179 OF THE MICHIGAN
- 12 COMPILED LAWS.
- (b) "Instrumentality of a crime" means any property, other
- 14 than real property, the use of which contributes directly and
- 15 materially to the commission of a crime.
- (c) "Person" means an individual, corporation, partnership,
- 17 or other business entity, or an unincorporated or voluntary
- 18 association.
- (d) "Proceeds of a crime" means any property obtained
- 20 through the commission of a crime, including any appreciation in
- 21 the value of the property.
- (e) "Security interest" means any interest in real or per-
- 23 sonal property that secures payment or performance of an
- 24 obligation.
- 25 (f) "Substituted proceeds of a crime" means any property
- 26 obtained or any gain realized by the sale or exchange of proceeds
- 27 of a crime.

- 1 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless

- of the 87th Legislature is enacted into law.
