

## SENATE BILL No. 949

December 8, 1993, Introduced by Senators Ehlers and Hoffman and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs

A bill to amend the title and sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, and 13 of Act No 204 of the Public Acts of 1979, entitled "Michigan resource inventory act," section 8 as amended by Act No 224 of the Public Acts of 1981, being sections 321 202, 321 203, 321 204, 321 205, 321 206, 321 207, 321 208, 321 209, 321 211, and 321 213 of the Michigan Compiled Laws and to repeal certain parts of the act

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT

- 1 Section 1 The title and sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9,
- 2 11, and 13 of Act No 204 of the Public Acts of 1979, section 8
- 3 as amended by Act No 224 of the Public Acts of 1981, being

- 4 on the use of the inventory to -municipalities, counties LOCAL

- 16 (A) "BOARD" MEANS THE GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS COORDI-

- 18 (B) -(a) "Classification system" means a mechanism to iden-
- 19 tify the current use of WATER RESOURCES, land, and any structures
- 20 on the land
- 21 (b) "Data management system" means a mechanism which relies
- 22 on a computer to manipulate, store, and retrieve information col-
- 23 lected and updated during a resource inventory
- 24 (c) "Department" means the DIRECTOR OF THE department of
- 25 natural resources OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE

- 1 (D) "GEOGRAPHIC DATA" MEANS INFORMATION DESCRIBING OBJECTS
- 2 IN TERMS OF THEIR GEOGRAPHICAL POSITION, ATTRIBUTES UNRELATED TO
- 3 GEOGRAPHICAL POSITION, AND SPATIAL INTERRELATIONSHIPS
- 4 (E) "GIS" OR "GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM" MEANS AN INTE-
- 5 GRATED SET OF COMPUTER HARDWARE AND APPLICATION SOFTWARE FOR COL-
- 6 LECTING, STORING, RETRIEVING, MANIPULATING, ANALYZING, AND DIS-
- 7 PLAYING GEOGRAPHICAL DATA
- 8 (F)  $-\frac{d}{d}$  "Inventory" means the land AND WATER resource and
- 9 current use inventory
- 10 (G) "MICHIGAN RESOURCE INFORMATION SYSTEM" MEANS THE GEO-
- 11 GRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO THIS ACT,
- 12 WHICH CONTAINS THE INVENTORY
- 13 (H) (e) "Municipality" "LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT" means a
- 14 COUNTY, city, village, or township, A SUBUNIT OF ANY OF THESE
- 15 ENTITIES, OR A COMBINATION OF ANY OF THESE ENTITIES

- 26 Sec 3 (1) The department shall -make or cause to be made
- 27 a project design study The study shall determine the

- 1 appropriate operational criteria, computer software and hardware,
- 2 staffing, available information resources, data updating method-
- 3 ology, most economical inventory resources, location of data man-
- 4 agement operations, linkages with other data management systems
- 5 in the state, data geographic base configuration, data delivery
- 6 system, and other information necessary to complete the inventory
- 7 and -development of TO DEVELOP a NATURAL RESOURCES data manage-
- 8 ment system
- 9 (2) The department shall make or cause to be made a land AND
- 10 WATER resource and current use inventory, as provided in sections
- 11 6 and 7, of all land AND WATER RESOURCES, public or private, in
- 12 this state The land AND WATER resource and current use invento-
- 13 ry, if appropriate, shall rely on any other information and
- 14 surveys
- 15 (3) The department shall create a technical assistance pro-
- 16 gram for the purpose of providing services to -municipalities and
- 17 counties LOCAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT as provided in section 5
- 18 (4) The department shall prepare recommendations for consid-
- 19 eration by the -inventory advisory committee BOARD regarding
- 20 means to address problems or issues indicated by the inventory
- 21 Sec 4 (1) There is created an inventory advisory commit-
- 22 tee in the department The governor shall appoint members of the
- 23 inventory advisory committee with the advice and consent of the
- 24 senate The committee shall be composed of representatives from
- 25 municipalities, counties, regional planning commissions, soil
- 26 conservation districts, the major state agencies affected by the
- 27 inventory, federal agencies, major land resource based

- 1 industries, environmental groups, and the general public from
- 2 various areas of the state The committee shall consist of 20
- 3 members Not less than 4 of the members shall be from the Upper
- 4 Peninsula not less than 4 of the members shall be from the Lower
- 5 Peninsula north of townline 16, and not less than 4 of the mem-
- 6 bers shall be from the Lower Peninsula south of townline 16 The
- 7 term of each member shall be 4 years, except that of those first
- 8 appointed, 5 shall be appointed for 1 year, 5 for 2 years, 5 for
- 9 3 years, and 5 for 4 years A vacancy shall be filled for the
- 10 balance of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original
- 11 appointment (2) A minimum of 5 subcommittees of the inventory
- 12 advisory committee shall be created. The subcommittees shall be
- 13 composed of members of the inventory advisory committee and other
- 14 individuals The subcommittees shall study the inventory
- 15 requirements in the areas of agriculture, forestry, minerals,
- 16 unique and special environments, and developed land Each sub-
- 17 committee shall include members of the inventory advisory commit-
- 18 tee whose particular interests are affected by those portions of
- 19 the inventory dealing with 1 of those areas (3) The inventory
- 20 advisory committee shall be responsible for reviewing and assist-
- 21 ing the department's efforts in completing the inventory and pro-
- 22 viding for its use The committee's THE BOARD SHALL REVIEW AND
- 23 ASSIST THE DEPARTMENT IN ITS EFFORTS TO COMPLETE THE INVENTORY
- 24 AND PROVIDE FOR ITS USE IN CARRYING OUT ITS RESPONSIBILITIES
- 25 UNDER THIS ACT, PRIOR TO TAKING ACTION, THE BOARD SHALL REFER ALL
- 26 MATTERS TO THE BOARD'S SUBCOMMITTEE ON THE MICHIGAN RESOURCE
- 27 INFORMATION SYSTEM AS PROVIDED FOR IN THE GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

- 1 SYSTEMS ACT FOR A RECOMMENDATION THE BOARD'S review and
- 2 assistance shall include the development of ALL OF THE
- 3 FOLLOWING
- 4 (a) The definitions of the features to be inventoried in the
- 5 land AND WATER resource inventory as provided in section 6
- 6 (b) The technical assistance program to help -municipalities
- 7 and counties LOCAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT effectively use the
- 8 inventory as provided in section 5
- 9 (c) Final recommendations to be sent to the legislature and
- 10 the governor regarding the manner of addressing the problems or
- 11 issues indicated by the inventory as provided in section 3(4)
- 12 (2) -(4) The -inventory advisory committee BOARD shall
- 13 approve or disapprove the criteria for participation in the cur-
- 14 rent use portion of inventory process as provided in section 8
- 15 (5) The inventory advisory committee shall meet not less
- 16 than 3 times each year-
- 17 (6) The legislature annually shall establish a schedule for
- 18 reimbursement of expenses of the inventory advisory committee
- 19 members
- 20 Sec 5 (1) The department shall create a technical assist-
- 21 ance program designed to help -municipalities and counties LOCAL
- 22 UNITS OF GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC, NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS effec-
- 23 tively use the inventory The technical assistance program, when
- 24 feasible, shall utilize the technical assistance programs of
- 25 MULTIAGENCY INSTITUTIONS SUCH AS regional planning commissions
- 26 AND HEALTH DISTRICTS The technical assistance shall include ALL
- 27 OF THE FOLLOWING

- 1 (a) The publication and -distribution AVAILABILITY of the
- 2 inventory as applicable to -each-municipality and county in the
- 3 state LOCAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC, NONPROFIT ORGANIZA-
- 4 TIONS, INCLUDING REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSIONS
- 5 (b) The preparation and -distribution AVAILABILITY of land
- 6 AND WATER resource management manuals AND OTHER TECHNICAL TRAIN-
- 7 ING AND EXPERTISE to assist municipalities and counties LOCAL
- 8 UNITS OF GOVERNMENT, planning and resource management entities,
- 9 and other federal -, AND state -, and local agencies in
- 10 updating their planning and resource management programs to
- 11 incorporate the inventory Land AND WATER resource management
- 12 manuals may also be prepared to assist -municipalities and
- 13 counties LOCAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT in solving problems which
- 14 confront their planning resource management programs
- (c) The conducting of workshops, in conjunction with local
- 16 government associations, regarding the inventory
- 17 (d) The provision of a team of experts on the inventory to
- 18 assist in problem solving by municipalities and counties -
- 19 (D)  $\frac{-(e)}{}$  The provision of an inventory information center
- 20 and library function which municipalities and counties LOCAL
- 21 UNITS OF GOVERNMENT may utilize in their own programs
- 22 Sec 6 -(1) The land AND WATER resource -portion of the-
- 23 inventory shall be completed in a format that may be readily
- 24 integrated into -the data management A GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION
- 25 system, and shall provide a base of information to analyze the
- 26 existing and future productivity of the state's natural resources
- 27 and provide information to assist in the analysis of the timing,

- 1 location, and intensity of future development in the state The
- 2 format should also include information that will be readily
- 3 usable and available to assist local -governmental units OF
- 4 GOVERNMENT in their land use planning The inventory may include
- 5 BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO any of the following
- 6 (a) Geological features, including groundwater features such
- 7 as depth to groundwater, groundwater recharge zones, and potable
- 8 aguifers
- 9 (b) Land area with characteristics which pose problems to
- 10 development such as an area subject to reasonably predictable
- 11 hazardous natural phenomenon which may include flooding, high
- 12 risk erosion, or subsidence
- (c) Land area with characteristics which make it suited for
- 14 agricultural use
- (d) Land area with characteristics which make it suited for
- 16 silvicultural use
- (e) Metallic and nonmetallic mineral deposits
- (f) Hydrological features, including WATERSHED BOUNDARIES,
- 19 lakes, rivers and creeks, impoundments, drainage basins,
- 20 FLOODPLAINS, and wetlands
- 21 (g) Land area of wildlife habitat, including each signifi-
- 22 cant breeding area or area used by migratory wildlife
- 23 (h) Topographic contours
- 24 (I) THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES
- 25 (J) SITES OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONTAMINATION
- 26 (2) If the department designates an area as wetland, the
- 27 state may negotiate and contract for an option to purchase or

- 1 exchange the wetland in order to protect the wetland The option
- 2 to purchase or exchange the wetland shall be valid for 5 years
- 3 After an option to purchase is negotiated a person may apply for
- 4 and receive consideration for an exemption from property taxes
- 5 levied pursuant to Act No 206 of the Public Acts of 1893, as
- 6 amended, being sections 211 1 to 211 157 of the Michigan Compiled
- 7 Laws, for the duration of the option to purchase
- 8 Sec 7 The current use portion of the inventory shall be
- 9 completed using a consistent classification system that can be
- 10 readily integrated into the data management A GEOGRAPHIC
- 11 INFORMATION system, and shall provide the base to analyze the
- 12 existing use and cover in the state The current use inventory
- 13 may include any of the following
- (a) Substantially undeveloped land devoted to the production
- 15 of plants and animals useful to humanity, including forages and
- 16 sod crops grain and feed crops dairy and dairy products live-
- 17 stock, including the breeding and grazing of those animals
- 18 fruits of all kinds vegetables and other similar uses and
- 19 activities
- 20 (b) Land in the production of fiber and other woodland prod-
- 21 ucts, or supporting trees for the protection of water resources,
- 22 soils, recreation, or wildlife habitat
- (c) Land which is being mined, drilled, or excavated for
- 24 metallic and nonmetallic mineral, rock, stone, gravel, clay,
- 25 soil, or other earth, petroleum, or natural gas resources
- 26 (d) A site, structure, district, or archaeological landmark
- 27 which is officially included in the national register of historic

- 1 places or designated as an historic site pursuant to state or
- 2 federal law
- 3 (e) Urban and developed land, including residential, commer-
- 4 cial, industrial, transportation, communication, utilities, and
- 5 open space uses, including recreational land
- 6 (f) Land owned on behalf of the public, including land man-
- 7 aged by federal, state, or local government or school districts
- 8 (g) Land enrolled in THE FARMLAND AND OPEN SPACE PRESERVA-
- 9 TION ACT, Act No 116 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended,
- 10 being sections 554 701 to 554 719 of the Michigan Compiled Laws
- 11 (h) Land enrolled in Act No 94 of the Public Acts of 1925
- 12 as amended, being sections 320 301 to 320 314 of the Michigan
- 13 Compiled Laws
- 14 (1) Land designated for tax abatements, restricted use, or
- 15 specific use under a public act of the state of Michigan
- 16 Sec 8 (1) The current use portion of the inventory may be
- 17 conducted by -municipalities, counties, LOCAL UNITS OF
- 18 GOVERNMENT or regional planning commissions -as provided in sub-
- 19 section (4) A municipality, county, LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT
- 20 or regional planning commission conducting a portion of the cur-
- 21 rent use inventory shall conduct that portion on a scale, level
- 22 of detail, format, and classification system prepared by the
- 23 department
- 24 (2) By December 27, 1980, the THE department shall
- 25 prepare PROVIDE criteria for municipality, county, LOCAL
- 26 UNITS OF GOVERNMENT and regional planning -commission
- 27 participation COMMISSIONS TO PARTICIPATE in the current use

- 1 inventory process The criteria shall specify the scale, level
- 2 of detail, format, and classification system to be used in the
- 3 current use portion of the inventory -, and shall contain forms
- 4 and information on the financial reimbursement provisions pro-
- 5 vided in section 9
- 6 (3) The <u>inventory advisory committee</u> BOARD shall approve
- 7 or disapprove the criteria for participation in the current use
- 8 portion of the inventory as prepared by the department under sub-
- 9 section (2) If the -committee- BOARD disapproves the criteria,
- 10 the department shall again prepare the criteria, taking into con-
- 11 sideration any comments made by the -committee- BOARD
- 12 (4) The criteria prepared under subsection (2) shall be
- 13 circulated by the department to local government associations and
- 14 to a municipality, county, or regional planning commission, upon
- 15 request By March 27, 1982, a municipality with an established
- 16 planning commission may submit to the department and to the
- 17 county board of commissioners of the county in which the munici-
- 18 pality is primarily located a notice of intent to perform or
- 19 cause to be performed the work necessary to complete the current
- 20 use portion of the inventory By June 27 1982, a county with an
- 21 established planning commission may submit to the department a
- 22 notice of intent to perform or cause to be performed the work
- 23 necessary to complete the current use portion of the inventory
- 24 for each area for which a municipality is not performing the work
- 25 necessary to complete the current use portion of the inventory
- 26 By September 27, 1982, a regional planning commission may submit
- 27 a notice of intent to the department to perform the work

- 1 necessary to complete the current use inventory for each area not
- 2 covered by a municipality or county notice of intent For each
- 3 area not covered by a notice of intent under this subsection, the
- 4 department shall make or cause to be made the current use portion
- 5 of the inventory
- 6 (4) -(5)- A municipality, county, or regional planning
- 7 commission LOCAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC, NONPROFIT
- 8 ORGANIZATIONS engaged in the preparation OR UPDATING of the cur-
- 9 rent use portion of the inventory may make use of assistance,
- 10 data, and information made available to them by public or private
- 11 organizations
- Sec 9 The state -shall MAY reimburse each -municipality,
- 13 county, LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT or regional planning commission
- 14 engaged in the preparation of the current use portion of the
- 15 inventory for -75% 50% of the expenditures certified by the
- 16 department Certification shall be based upon conformance to the
- 17 format, scale and classification system provisions of the con-
- 18 tract between the -municipality county LOCAL UNIT OF

- 20 If the amount appropriated during any fiscal year is not suffi-

- 3 (2) The DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW AND UPDATE THE current use
- 4 portion of the inventory -shall be reviewed and updated when- AS
- 5 necessary -, but not less than once each 5 years
- 6 Sec 13 -(1) There is hereby appropriated from the general
- 7 fund for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1980 the sum of
- 8 \$250,000 00 for the department of natural resources for the pur-
- 9 pose of carrying out the project design study described in sec-
- 10 tion 3(1) of this act (2) To further carry out the require-
- 11 ments of this act, it is anticipated that a minimum of approxi-
- 12 mately \$1,000,000 00 for each year -for the next 3 years will be
- 13 required
- 14 Section 2 Section 10 of Act No 204 of the Public Acts of
- 15 1979, being section 321 210 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
- 16 repealed
- 17 Section 3 This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
- 18 Senate Bill No 950
- of the 87th Legislature is enacted into law
