A bill to make appropriations for the department of natural resources and for capital outlay purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995, to provide for certain work projects, to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials, and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations

# 1 GENERAL SECTIONS

2       Sec 201   In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of arti  
3 cle IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending in this  
4 appropriation act is \$69,008,000 00 and state appropriations to be paid  
5 to local units of government are \$12,200,000 00 as follows

9       Sec 202   The appropriations made and expenditures authorized under  
10 this act and the departments agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and  
11 programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to  
12 the management and budget act, Act No 431 of the Public Acts of 1984,  
13 being sections 18 1101 to 18 1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws

14       Sec 203   For all projects and grant programs funded under this  
15 act, the commission of natural resources or the department of natural  
16 resources shall notify each legislator whose district is to receive a  
17 grant 7 days before the grants are announced

18       Sec 204   It is the intent of the legislature that the state shall  
19 make bonds issued pursuant to the environmental protection bond implemen  
20 tation act, Act No 328 of the Public Acts of 1988, being  
21 sections 299 671 to 299 685 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, available to  
22 the citizens of the state by making a portion of the bonds available in  
23 denominations of \$500 00 or less, and shall otherwise encourage the par  
24 ticipation of the citizens of the state in the investment in environmen  
25 tal protection bonds

26       Sec 205   The unexpended portion of the appropriation in  
27 section 101 for the environmental bond projects is considered work

1 project appropriations and any unencumbered or unallotted funds are  
2 carried forward into the succeeding fiscal year The following is in  
3 compliance with section 451(3) of the management and budget act, Act  
4 No 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18 1451 of the Michigan  
5 Compiled Laws

6 (a) The purpose of the environmental bond projects to be carried  
7 forward is to provide toxic waste cleanup, management of solid wastes,  
8 and increased water protection

9 (b) These projects will be accomplished by contract

10 (c) The total estimated costs of all projects is identified in each  
11 line item appropriation

12 (d) The tentative completion date for these projects is  
13 September 30, 1997

#### 14 SURFACE WATER QUALITY

15 Sec 301 The appropriations in section 101 for environmental pro  
16 tection bond water pollution control revolving fund shall not be encum  
17 bered or expended until the department has reported to the senate and  
18 house of representatives appropriations subcommittees on natural  
19 resources those projects that have been approved for expenditure under  
20 this program

21 Sec 302 Loans provided by the water pollution control revolving  
22 fund pursuant to the appropriation in section 101 are to be repaid on  
23 schedule and penalties shall be assigned for delinquent repayment as pro  
24 vided in the state clean water assistance act, Act No 317 of the Public

1 Acts of 1988, being sections 323 451 to 323 470 of the Michigan Compiled  
2 Laws

3 ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE

4       Sec 401 (1) The commission of natural resources shall annually  
5 report to the governor, the house of representatives and senate appropri  
6 ations committees, the house of representatives and senate appropriations  
7 subcommittees on natural resources, the joint capital outlay subcommit  
8 tee, the house of representatives and senate standing committees with  
9 jurisdiction over issues related to the environment and natural  
10 resources, and the house of representatives and senate fiscal agencies on  
11 the progress of the environmental protection bond cleanups for which  
12 appropriations have been made under this act This report shall include  
13 the criteria used for site selection, a list of sites funded, including  
14 the name, address, county, and telephone number of the recipient or par  
15 ticipant bond funded actions taken at each site other sources of funds  
16 used at each site in addition to bond proceeds, including private actions  
17 or responsible party actions, the amount of funds committed for each site  
18 and actually expended at each site, further cleanup actions that may be  
19 anticipated at each site, and other information considered pertinent by  
20 the commission of natural resources

21       (2) The annual report required under subsection (1) shall include a  
22 summary of all of the sites funded, organized by the type of remedial  
23 action undertaken at the site as follows surface cleanup, alternative  
24 water supply, municipal water supply, site investigation, final cleanup  
25 design, final cleanup, operation and maintenance, and superfund cleanup

1 project match The report shall also include the sources of funding for  
2 each site, the amount of funds committed for each site and actually  
3 expended at each site, the estimated amount of funds saved because of  
4 private actions and responsible parties, and staff costs associated with  
5 each site

6 Sec 402 The expenditure of money under this act for cleanup  
7 projects, alternative water supply projects, site investigations, and  
8 superfund match projects does not preclude the use of private, federal,  
9 local, or other state funds on these projects

10 Sec 403 In addition to the funds appropriated for environmental  
11 response projects listed in section 101, additional funds are authorized  
12 for expenditures from appropriations contained in Act No 180 of the  
13 Public Acts of 1989, Act No 55 of the Public Acts of 1990, Act No 194  
14 of the Public Acts of 1990, Act No 31 of the Public Acts of 1991, Act  
15 No 160 of the Public Acts of 1991, Act No 74 of the Public Acts of  
16 1993, and Act No 353 of the Public Acts of 1993 for the environmental  
17 response program with funding support from the environmental protection  
18 bond fund The department shall provide to the senate and house of rep  
19 resentatives appropriations subcommittees on natural resources by  
20 October 30, 1995 a list documenting funds saved per site from previous  
21 appropriations and the reallocation of those funds for fiscal year  
22 1994 95

23 Sec 404 The appropriation in section 101 for contingency fund  
24 shall not be encumbered or expended until the department has reported to  
25 the senate and house of representatives appropriations subcommittees on  
26 natural resources those projects that have been approved under this  
27 program
