

SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 4388

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending section 1606 (MCL 324.1606), as added by 1995 PA 60;
and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1606. (1) The department and conservation officers
2 appointed by the department are peace officers vested with all
3 the powers, privileges, prerogatives, and immunities conferred
4 upon peace officers by the general laws of this state; have the
5 same power to serve criminal process as sheriffs; have the same
6 right as sheriffs to require aid in executing process; and are
7 entitled to the same fees as sheriffs in performing those
8 duties.

9 (2) The department may commission ~~state~~ park AND
10 RECREATION officers to enforce, ~~within the boundaries of the~~

1 ~~state parks~~ ON PROPERTY REGULATED UNDER PART 741 OR 781, rules
2 promulgated by the department, ORDERS ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT

4 specified in those rules as enforceable by commissioned ~~state~~
5 park AND RECREATION officers. In performing those enforcement
6 activities, commissioned ~~state~~ park AND RECREATION officers are
7 vested with the powers, privileges, prerogatives, and immunities
8 conferred upon peace officers under the laws of this state.
[HOWEVER, A PARK AND RECREATION OFFICER ENFORCING RULES, ORDERS, OR
LAWS DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION ON PROPERTY REGULATED UNDER PART
781 MAY ARREST AN INDIVIDUAL ONLY FOR A MINOR OFFENSE COMMITTED IN
THE OFFICER'S PRESENCE AND SHALL ISSUE AN APPEARANCE TICKET AS
PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (6).]

9 (3) IN ADDITION TO THE LIMITED ARREST AUTHORITY GRANTED IN
10 SUBSECTION (2), ON PROPERTY REGULATED UNDER PART 741 [], A
11 COMMISSIONED PARK AND RECREATION OFFICER MAY ARREST AN INDIVIDUAL
12 WITHOUT A WARRANT IF 1 OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES
13 EXIST:

14 (A) IN THE PRESENCE OF THE PARK AND RECREATION OFFICER, THE
15 INDIVIDUAL COMMITS AN ASSAULT OR AN ASSAULT AND BATTERY IN VIOLA-
16 TION OF SECTION 81 OR 81A OF THE MICHIGAN PENAL CODE, 1931 PA
17 328, MCL 750.81 AND 750.81A.

18 (B) THE PARK AND RECREATION OFFICER HAS REASONABLE CAUSE TO
19 BELIEVE THAT A FELONY HAS BEEN COMMITTED AND REASONABLE CAUSE TO
20 BELIEVE THAT THE INDIVIDUAL HAS COMMITTED IT.

21 (C) THE PARK AND RECREATION OFFICER HAS RECEIVED AFFIRMATIVE
22 WRITTEN OR VERBAL NOTICE FROM A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR AGENCY
23 THAT A PEACE OFFICER POSSESSES A WARRANT FOR THE INDIVIDUAL'S
24 ARREST.

25 (D) THE PERSON VIOLATES SECTION 625(1), (3), OR (6) OR 626
26 OF THE MICHIGAN VEHICLE CODE, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.625 AND
27 257.626.

7 WHO VIOLATES SECTION 626B OR 627 OF THE MICHIGAN VEHICLE CODE,
8 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.626B AND 257.627.

9 [(6)] ~~(3)~~ If a conservation officer or a ~~state~~ park AND
10 RECREATION officer commissioned ~~pursuant to~~ UNDER subsection
11 (2) arrests a person without warrant for a [~~misdemeanor~~ MINOR
OFFENSE] committed
12 in the officer's presence [~~that is punishable by imprisonment for~~

8 ~~being section 600.8511 of the Michigan Compiled Laws~~ 1961 PA
9 236, MCL 600.8511, or may accept a plea of not guilty for pur-
10 poses of arraignment, if authorized to do so by the judge of the
11 district court district, with the same effect as though the
12 person personally appeared before the court. The court, by
13 giving not less than 5 days' notice of the date of appearance,
14 may require appearance in person at the place designated in the
15 appearance ticket.

16 [(8)] ~~(5)~~ This section does not prevent the execution of a
17 warrant for the arrest of the person as in other cases of misde-
18 meanors if necessary.

19 [(9)] ~~(6)~~ If a person fails to appear, the court, in addi-
20 tion to the fine assessed if the person is found guilty for the
21 offense committed, may add to the fine and costs levied against
22 the person additional costs incurred in compelling the appearance
23 of the person, which additional costs shall be returned to the
24 general fund of the unit of government incurring the costs.
