

HOUSE BILL No. 6182

June 13, 2002, Introduced by Reps. Bernero, Schauer and Dennis and referred to the Committee on Energy and Technology.

A bill to amend 1929 PA 16, entitled

"An act to regulate the business of carrying or transporting, buying, selling or dealing in crude oil or petroleum or its products, through pipe lines; to authorize the use of public highways and the condemnation of private property; to regulate the purchase and storage of crude oil or petroleum; to provide for the control and regulation of all corporations, associations and persons engaged in such business, by the Michigan public utilities commission; to define the powers and duties of the commission in relation thereto; and to prescribe penalties for violations of the provisions hereof,"

(MCL 483.1 to 483.11) by adding section 3a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

HOUSE BILL No. 6182

1 SEC. 3A. (1) THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF A PIPELINE LOCATED IN
2 WHOLE OR IN PART IN THIS STATE IS SUBJECT TO AN ANNUAL PIPELINE
3 IMPACT FEE OF \$20,000.00 FOR EACH MILE OR PORTION OF A MILE OF
4 PIPELINE. THE COMMISSION SHALL ANNUALLY ASSESS THE OWNER OR
5 OPERATOR HIS OR HER PIPELINE IMPACT FEE. THE OWNER OR OPERATOR

1 OF A PIPELINE SHALL PAY HIS OR HER PIPELINE IMPACT FEE IN THE
2 MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSION.

3 (2) UPON RECEIPT OF PIPELINE IMPACT FEES UNDER THIS SECTION,
4 THE COMMISSION SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE IMPACT FEES AS FOLLOWS:

5 (A) FIFTY PERCENT OF THE IMPACT FEE THAT IS COLLECTED ON
6 EACH MILE OR PORTION OF A MILE OF A PIPELINE THAT IS LOCATED
7 WITHIN A COUNTY SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO THAT COUNTY FOR IMPLEMEN-
8 TATION OF ITS RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:

13 (B) FIFTY PERCENT OF THE IMPACT FEES COLLECTED SHALL BE FOR-
14 WARDED TO THE STATE TREASURER TO BE DEPOSITED INTO THE GENERAL
15 FUND WHERE THEY SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR USE IN IMPLEMENTING THE
16 STATE'S RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
