Analysis

Summary

HB 4934 amends the general property tax act to allow the voters of a school district or intermediate school district to reconsider a school millage if the revenue from the millage was used for purposes other than what was stated on the ballot. The bill allows the authorized millage to be reconsidered at the next general election or at a special election, if at least 10 percent of the qualified voters in the school district or intermediate school district petitioned the district to reconsider the millage.

Fiscal Impact

HB 4934 could result in additional local cost to school districts or intermediate school districts for the cost of holding an election. There would be little if any costs to the school district or intermediate school district if the election was held in conjunction with a general election. If the election was a special election there would be costs to the school district or intermediate school district. The actual cost will depend on the number of jurisdictions the school district or intermediate school district falls in.
