Analysis

Summary

These bills would regulate the disposal practices at Michigan landfills. Solid waste could be accepted only if that waste met the minimum requirements set forth in part 115 of the solid waste management statute (HB 5234). The Department of Environmental Quality would be required to post a list of prohibited materials on its web site. Waste haulers would be required to notify each of their customers of prohibited materials and their disposal options (HB 5235).

Senate bills are tiebarred to the package. These bills establish criteria for the acceptance of out-of-state waste (SB 497), prohibit the disposal of beverage containers and whole tires (SB 498), define the term “beverage container” (SB 500), and require the DEQ to post a list of banned items on its website (SB 502)

Fiscal Impact

These bills would not have fiscal impact on the state or on local governmental units.
