“(2) IN ADDITION TO THE MONEY APPROPRIATED UNDER SUBSECTION (1), IF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING BILLS OF THE 93RD LEGISLATURE ARE ENACTED BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2006, THEN ALL STATE SCHOOL AID FUND REVENUE RESULTING FROM THAT ENACTMENT IS APPROPRIATED FOR 2006-2007 FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:

(A) HOUSE BILL NO. 4951.

(B) HOUSE BILL NO. 4953.

(C) HOUSE BILL NO. 4909.

(3) IN ADDITION TO THE MONEY APPROPRIATED IN SECTION 11, THERE IS APPROPRIATED FROM THE GENERAL FUND IN 2006-2007 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$22,800,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.” and renumbering the remaining subsections.

The question being on the adoption of the amendment offered by Rep. Williams,

Rep. Waters demanded the yeas and nays.

The demand was supported.

The question being on the adoption of the amendment offered by Rep. Williams,

Rep. Ward moved that consideration of the bill be postponed temporarily.

House Bill No. 5056, entitled

A bill to amend 1975 PA 197, entitled "An act to provide for the establishment of a downtown development authority; to prescribe its powers and duties; to correct and prevent deterioration in business districts; to encourage historic preservation; to authorize the acquisition and disposal of interests in real and personal property; to authorize the creation and implementation of development plans in the districts; to promote the economic growth of the districts; to create a board; to prescribe its powers and duties; to authorize the levy and collection of taxes; to authorize the issuance of bonds and other evidences of indebtedness; to authorize the use of tax increment financing; to reimburse downtown development authorities for certain losses of tax increment revenues; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state officials," by amending section 4 (MCL 125.1654), as amended by 1987 PA 66.

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-1) previously recommended by the Committee on Commerce,

The substitute (H-1) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Ward moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

Senate Bill No. 1112, entitled

A bill to amend 1917 PA 167, entitled "Housing law of Michigan," by amending section 85a (MCL 125.485a), as added by 2003 PA 307.

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-1) previously recommended by the Committee on Health Policy,

The substitute (H-1) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Ward moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

The motion prevailed.

Senate Bill No. 1115, entitled

A bill to prescribe certain duties of the department of state police with respect to certain illegal drug manufacturing laboratories.

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-2) previously recommended by the Committee on Judiciary,

The substitute (H-2) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Ward moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

Senate Bill No. 1119, entitled

A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "Revised judicature act of 1961," (MCL 600.101 to 600.9947) by adding section 2975.

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed amendment previously recommended by the Committee on Judiciary (for amendment, see House Journal No. 48, p. 1143),

The amendment was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

A bill to amend 1975 PA 238, entitled "Child protection law," by amending sections 3, 8, and 17 (MCL 722.623, 722.628, and 722.637), section 3 as amended by 2002 PA 693, section 8 as amended by 2004 PA 195, and section 17 as added by 1997 PA 168.

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-1) previously recommended by the Committee on Family and Children Services,

The substitute (H-1) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979," by amending sections 11 and 17b (MCL 388.1611 and 388.1617b), section 11 as amended by 2005 PA 155 and section 17b as amended by 2005 PA 150.

(The bill was considered earlier today, see today's Journal p. 1208.)

1. Amend page 81, following line 9, by inserting:

"SEC. 29. (1) IN ADDITION TO THE MONEY APPROPRIATED IN SECTION 11, THERE IS APPROPRIATED FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR 2006-2007 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$44,000,000.00 FOR 2006-2007 FOR ADDITIONAL PAYMENTS TO ELIGIBLE DISTRICTS FOR DECLINING ENROLLMENT ASSISTANCE.

(2) A DISTRICT IS ELIGIBLE FOR A PAYMENT UNDER THIS SECTION IF ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY:

(A) THE DISTRICT’S PUPIL MEMBERSHIP FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR IS LESS THAN THE DISTRICT’S PUPIL MEMBERSHIP FOR THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR AND THE DISTRICT’S PUPIL MEMBERSHIP FOR THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR IS LESS THAN THE DISTRICT’S PUPIL MEMBERSHIP FOR THE PREVIOUSLY PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR AS CALCULATED UNDER SECTION 6 FOR THAT FISCAL YEAR.

(B) THE DISTRICT’S AVERAGE PUPIL MEMBERSHIP 1 IS GREATER THAN THE DISTRICT’S PUPIL MEMBERSHIP FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR AS CALCULATED UNDER SECTION 6.

(C) THE DISTRICT IS NOT ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE FUNDING UNDER SECTIONS 6(4)(Y) OR 22D OF THIS ACT.

(3) PAYMENTS TO EACH ELIGIBLE DISTRICT SHALL BE EQUAL TO THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE DISTRICT’S AVERAGE PUPIL MEMBERSHIP AND THE DISTRICT’S PUPIL MEMBERSHIP AS CALCULATED UNDER SECTION 6 FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR MULTIPLIED BY THE DISTRICT’S FOUNDATION ALLOWANCE AS CALCULATED UNDER SECTION 20. IF THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF THE PAYMENTS CALCULATED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION EXCEEDS THE ALLOCATION FOR THIS SECTION, THE PAYMENT TO EACH DISTRICT SHALL BE PRORATED ON AN EQUAL PERCENTAGE BASIS.

(4) IN ADDITION TO THE MONEY APPROPRIATED UNDER SUBSECTION (1), IF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING BILLS OF THE 93RD LEGISLATURE ARE ENACTED BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2006, THEN ALL STATE SCHOOL AID FUND REVENUE RESULTING FROM THAT ENACTMENT IS APPROPRIATED FOR 2006-2007 FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:

(A) HOUSE BILL NO. 4951.

(B) HOUSE BILL NO. 4953.

(C) HOUSE BILL NO. 4909.

(5) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, “AVERAGE PUPIL MEMBERSHIP” MEANS THE AVERAGE OF THE DISTRICT’S MEMBERSHIP FOR THE 3-FISCAL-YEAR PERIOD ENDING WITH THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR, CALCULATED BY ADDING THE DISTRICT’S ACTUAL MEMBERSHIP FOR EACH OF THOSE 3 FISCAL YEARS, AS OTHERWISE CALCULATED UNDER SECTION 6, AND DIVIDING THE SUM OF THOSE 3 MEMBERSHIP FIGURES BY 3.”.

A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2006; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

The Senate has amended the bill as follows:

1. Amend page 3, following line 11, by inserting:

“Sec. 104. CAPITAL OUTLAY

2. Amend page 4, following line 15, by inserting:

“CAPITAL OUTLAY

Sec. 501. The department of natural resources shall require local units of government to enter into agreements with the department for the purpose of administering the natural resources trust fund grants identified in part 1 of this act.

Among other provisions, the agreements shall require that grant recipients agree to dedicate to public outdoor recreation uses in perpetuity the land acquired or developed; to replace lands converted or lost to other than public outdoor recreation use; and for parcels acquired that are over 5 or more acres in size, to provide the state with a nonparticipating 1/6 minimum royalty interest in any acquired minerals that are retained by the grant recipient. The agreements shall also provide that the full payments of grants can be made only after proof of acquisition or completion of the development project is submitted by the grant recipient and all costs are verified by the department of natural resources.

Sec. 502. Any unobligated balance in any natural resources trust fund appropriation made under part 1 of this act shall not revert to the funds from which appropriated at the close of the fiscal year, but shall continue until the purpose for which it was appropriated is completed for a period not to exceed 3 fiscal years. The unexpended balance of any natural resources trust fund appropriation made in part 1 of this act remaining after the purpose for which it was appropriated is completed shall revert to the Michigan natural resources trust fund and be made available for appropriation.”.

The Senate has passed the bill as amended and ordered that it be given immediate effect.

Senate Bill 242 included a direct line item to the Director of the Michigan State Fair of \$12,300. I am uncertain of the rationale of Director Hertel’s pay increase and I do not believe that neither his performance nor the financial performance of the Michigan State Fair warrants such a substantial raise for Director Hertel. Many operational issues still loom and issues, such as; children not receiving fair premiums in a reasonable amount of time, lack of attention to livestock exhibitors, financial insolvency of the Michigan State Fair, the actual dates, and the duration of the fair in no fashion warrant a pay increase to Director Hertel. The State of Michigan has been in tremendous financial strain and such a hefty pay increase to a director of a financially unstable entity is absurd, at best. I understand that the governing body of the Michigan State Fair approved a tremendous pay increase to its director and I find it unfortunate that the People of the State of Michigan are financially responsible for this action.”

House Joint Resolution X, entitled

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution of 1963, by amending sections 2, 3, and 6 of article IV, to base legislative apportionment and districting on the number of citizens of this state.

The joint resolution was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on House Oversight, Elections, and Ethics.
