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## **HOUSE BILL No. 4806**

April 21, 2009, Introduced by Reps. Switalski and Miller and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to provide education assistance for certain entrepreneurship courses and training; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
  "entrepreneurship education act".
- 3 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Annual family income" means the combined annual adjusted 5 gross income, as reported for federal income tax purposes, of an 6 individual and all of the following:
  - $\left(i\right)$  All individuals 15 years of age or older who reside with that individual.
    - (ii) If that individual is 23 years of age or younger, his or

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- 1 her parents, whether or not they reside with that individual.
- 2 (b) "Approved school" means any of the following:
- 3 (i) A degree or certificate granting public or private college,
- 4 university, or community or junior college in this state.
- 5 (ii) A nonprofit association, corporation, or foundation
- 6 approved by the department to provide courses in entrepreneurship.
- 7 (iii) A training program approved by the department to provide
- 8 courses in entrepreneurship.
- 9 (c) "Courses in entrepreneurship" means educational courses,
- 10 classes, or training that provide a student with the fundamental
- 11 aspects of starting or operating a small business or venture,
- 12 including, but not limited to, the profile of an entrepreneur;
- 13 opportunity recognition; business feasibility assessment; building
- 14 a business model; industry and market competition; market analysis;
- 15 pricing; financial analysis and statements relating to start-up
- 16 costs, operational expenses, and cash flow; raising
- 17 commercialization capital; procuring government-sponsored research
- 18 and development grants for developing technology innovations;
- 19 licensing and transferring technology from universities; developing
- 20 a business plan; and similar courses, classes, or training approved
- 21 by the department. The term includes, but is not limited to, a
- 22 course, class, or training that is part of a broader training
- 23 program or a curriculum or degree or certificate program in
- 24 entrepreneurial or small business management or administration.
- 25 (d) "Department" means the department of labor and economic
- 26 growth.
- (e) "Eligible costs" means tuition costs and any other costs

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- 1 directly related to instruction, books and materials, and other
- 2 fees incurred by an individual for enrollment in 1 or more courses
- 3 in entrepreneurship and the cost of supportive services for that
- 4 individual.
- 5 (f) "Eligible student" means an individual who meets all of
- 6 the following:
- 7 (i) Is currently unemployed; is employed but has received a
- 8 notice of termination or layoff from employment; or has annual
- 9 family income of \$40,000.00 or less.
- 10 (ii) Is at least 18 years old.
- 11 (iii) Did not graduate from high school within the preceding 2
- 12 years.
- 13 (iv) Is not a full-time college student, as determined by the
- 14 department.
- 15 (v) Meets any other standards established in quidelines
- 16 adopted by the department under this act.
- 17 (g) "Supportive services" means any of the following:
- 18 (i) Personal guidance and counseling, including, but not
- 19 limited to, crisis intervention, information, and referral, life-
- 20 skills counseling, and mentoring.
- 21 (ii) Supplemental services, including, but not limited to,
- 22 helping the individual with child care subsidies or vouchers,
- 23 transportation passes, and book or supply vouchers.
- Sec. 5. (1) An eliqible student who enrolls in 1 or more
- 25 qualified courses in entrepreneurship at an approved school is
- 26 eligible for and may receive educational assistance for the
- 27 eligible costs he or she would have otherwise paid the approved

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- 1 school in connection with the course or courses.
- 2 (2) The department may establish the form or format of the
- 3 educational assistance application.
- 4 (3) The department shall determine the maximum amount and
- 5 duration of educational assistance an eligible student may receive
- 6 under this act.
- 7 Sec. 7. (1) The department shall annually assess the
- 8 performance of approved schools in providing effective
- 9 entrepreneurship education.
- 10 (2) The department may adopt guidelines to implement and
- 11 administer this act.
