

HOUSE BILL No. 5662

May 17, 2016, Introduced by Reps. Glenn, Chatfield, Hooker, Johnson, Aaron Miller, Goike, Cole, Lauwers, Graves, Barrett, Pettalia, Tedder and Runestad and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

by amending section 12a (MCL 28.432a), as amended by 2015 PA 207.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 12a. The requirements of this act for obtaining a license
2 to carry a concealed pistol do not apply to any of the following:

3 (a) A peace officer of a duly authorized police agency of the

1 United States or of this state or a political subdivision of this
2 state, who is regularly employed and paid by the United States or
3 this state or a subdivision of this state, except a township
4 constable.

5 (b) A constable who is trained and certified under the
6 commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL
7 28.601 to 28.616, while engaged in his or her official duties or
8 going to or coming from his or her official duties, and who is
9 regularly employed and paid by a political subdivision of this
10 state.

11 (c) An individual regularly employed by the department of
12 corrections and authorized in writing by the director of the
13 department of corrections to carry a concealed pistol during the
14 performance of his or her duties or while going to or returning
15 from his or her duties.

16 (d) An individual regularly employed as a local corrections
17 officer by a county sheriff, who is trained in the use of force and
18 is authorized in writing by the county sheriff to carry a concealed
19 pistol during the performance of his or her duties.

20 (e) An individual regularly employed in a city jail or lockup
21 who has custody of individuals detained or incarcerated in the jail
22 or lockup, is trained in the use of force, and is authorized in
23 writing by the chief of police or the county sheriff to carry a
24 concealed pistol during the performance of his or her duties.

25 (f) A member of the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, or
26 Marine Corps. ~~while carrying a concealed pistol in the line of~~
27 ~~duty.~~

1 (g) A member of the National Guard, armed forces reserves, or
2 other duly authorized military organization while on duty or drill
3 or while going to or returning from his or her place of assembly or
4 practice or while carrying a concealed pistol for purposes of that
5 military organization.

6 (h) A resident of another state who is licensed by that state
7 to carry a concealed pistol.

8 (i) The regular and ordinary transportation of a pistol as
9 merchandise by an authorized agent of a person licensed to
10 manufacture firearms.

11 (j) An individual while carrying a pistol unloaded in a
12 wrapper or container in the trunk of his or her vehicle or, if the
13 vehicle does not have a trunk, from transporting that pistol
14 unloaded in a locked compartment or container that is separated
15 from the ammunition for that pistol from the place of purchase to
16 his or her home or place of business or to a place of repair or
17 back to his or her home or place of business, or in moving goods
18 from 1 place of abode or business to another place of abode or
19 business.

20 (k) A peace officer or law enforcement officer from Canada.
