SENATE BILL NO. 941**

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled
"The state school aid act of 1979,"
by amending section 2 (MCL 388.1602), as amended by 2011 PA 62, and
by adding article V.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 2. As used in this article, ~~and~~ article IV, **AND ARTICLE**
2 **V**, the words and phrases defined in sections 3 to 6 have the
3 meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

4 **ARTICLE V**

5 **SEC. 297. (1) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2018,**
6 **THERE IS APPROPRIATED FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF THIS STATE AND**
7 **CERTAIN OTHER STATE PURPOSES RELATING TO EDUCATION THE SUM OF**
8 **\$100,000,000.00 FROM THE TALENT INVESTMENT FUND CREATED UNDER**
9 **SECTION 8A OF THE HIGHER EDUCATION LOAN AUTHORITY ACT, 1975 PA 222,**

1 MCL 390.1158A.

2 (2) THE FUNDS APPROPRIATED UNDER THIS SECTION FOR 2017-2018
3 ARE A WORK PROJECT APPROPRIATION, AND ANY UNEXPENDED FUNDS FOR
4 2017-2018 ARE CARRIED FORWARD INTO 2018-2019. THE PURPOSE OF THE
5 WORK PROJECT IS TO IMPROVE THIS STATE'S TALENT POOL BY TRAINING
6 CITIZENS FOR HIGH-DEMAND CAREER FIELDS, PROVIDING EDUCATIONAL
7 SUPPORTS, EXPANDING CAREER EXPLORATION OPPORTUNITIES, AND
8 SUPPORTING INNOVATIVE TEACHERS AND CURRICULUM. THE ESTIMATED
9 COMPLETION DATE OF THE WORK PROJECT IS SEPTEMBER 30, 2022.

10 (3) GRANTS AWARDED UNDER THIS ARTICLE WITH FUNDS APPROPRIATED
11 UNDER THIS SECTION ARE SUBJECT TO SECTION 297J.

12 (4) THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE KNOWN AND MAY BE CITED AS THE
13 "MARSHALL PLAN FOR TALENT".

14 SEC. 297A. (1) FROM THE APPROPRIATION IN SECTION 297, THERE IS
15 ALLOCATED FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$36,485,000.00 FOR
16 THE EXPANSION OF K-12 EDUCATION PROGRAMS THAT FOCUS ON CREATING
17 COMPETENCIES AND EARNING CREDENTIALS IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

18 (2) SUBJECT TO SECTION 297K, FROM THE ALLOCATION IN SUBSECTION
19 (1), THERE IS ALLOCATED AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$29,935,000.00 FOR
20 COMPETITIVE GRANTS TO DISTRICTS AND INTERMEDIATE DISTRICTS THAT ARE
21 MEMBERS OF AND APPLY ON BEHALF OF A TALENT CONSORTIUM, IN A FORM
22 AND MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER SECTION 297I FOR THE
23 PURPOSE OF EXPANDING OR CREATING PUPIL EXPERIENCES THAT RESULT IN
24 COMPETENCIES OR CREDENTIALS, OR BOTH, IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

25 (3) FUNDS RECEIVED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE USED BY MEMBERS
26 OF THE TALENT CONSORTIUM FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

27 (A) STIPENDS FOR INDUSTRY MENTORS TO ASSIST IN TEACHING

1 CLASSES IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

2 (B) TESTING OR PROJECT FEES ON BEHALF OF PUPILS FOR THE
3 PURPOSE OF EARNING CREDENTIALS IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

4 (C) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR TEACHERS WHO IMPROVE THEIR
5 CAPACITY TO TEACH HIGH-DEMAND SKILLS. GRANTS AWARDED FOR THIS
6 PURPOSE SHALL NOT EXCEED \$5,000.00 PER TEACHER.

7 (D) THE HIRING OF FULL-TIME STAFF TO CREATE OR EXPAND A
8 PROGRAM IN A HIGH-DEMAND FIELD. IN ORDER TO USE FUNDS FOR THIS
9 PURPOSE, THE APPLICANT MUST COMMIT TO CONTINUING TO PROVIDE THE
10 PROGRAM FOR AT LEAST AN ADDITIONAL 3 YEARS FOLLOWING THE FINAL
11 DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS. THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF GRANTS AWARDED FOR THE
12 PURPOSE UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION MUST NOT EXCEED \$7,000,000.00. AN
13 APPLICANT SHALL NOT RECEIVE MORE THAN 1 GRANT FOR THE PURPOSES
14 UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION.

15 (E) THE CREATION OF NEW CURRICULUM, WHICH MAY INCLUDE, BUT IS
16 NOT LIMITED TO, PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT, MATERIALS, LESSON PLANS,
17 PUPIL PROJECTS, AND OTHER ITEMS NEEDED IN A HIGH-DEMAND FIELD THAT
18 LACKS SUFFICIENT CURRICULA, AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT. A
19 CURRICULUM CREATED USING FUNDS ALLOCATED UNDER THIS SECTION MUST
20 MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

21 (i) IS MADE OPEN-SOURCE TO OTHER DISTRICTS ACROSS THIS STATE,
22 TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE.

23 (ii) IS DEVELOPED WITH THE DIRECT AND MEANINGFUL INPUT OF AT
24 LEAST 1 EMPLOYER WHO IS PARTY TO A TALENT CONSORTIUM.

25 (iii) UTILIZES THE PRINCIPLES OF COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING.

26 (F) FEES AND COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH PARTICIPATION IN
27 CYBERSECURITY PROGRAMS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE

1 GOVERNOR'S HIGH SCHOOL CHALLENGE, THE NATIONAL YOUTH CYBER DEFENSE
2 COMPETITION, THE CYBER SECURITY FOR AUTOMOTIVE CHALLENGE (CYBERAUTO
3 CHALLENGE), AND THE CYBERPATRIOT COMPETITION.

4 (G) TO ASSIST CERTIFICATED TEACHERS TO EARN NEW ENDORSEMENTS
5 IN AREAS OF HIGH-DEMAND CRITICAL SHORTAGE THROUGH A COMPETENCY-
6 BASED RESIDENCY MODEL. GRANTS AWARDED FOR THE PURPOSES UNDER THIS
7 SUBDIVISION MUST NOT EXCEED \$8,000.00 PER TEACHER AND MUST BE USED
8 TO PAY THE COSTS OF A TEACHER'S PARTICIPATION IN A TEACHER
9 PREPARATION PROGRAM THAT COLLABORATES WITH THE DEPARTMENT TO
10 DEVELOP ENDORSEMENT PROGRAMS THAT COST NO MORE THAN \$8,000.00 FOR A
11 TEACHER OR A DISTRICT AND THAT ASSESS A TEACHER'S MASTERY OF
12 STANDARDS IN A COMPETENCY-BASED MODEL.

13 (4) AT LEAST \$2,000,000.00 OF THE FUNDS APPROPRIATED UNDER
14 SUBSECTION (1) MUST BE USED FOR COMPETITIVE GRANTS TO DISTRICTS
15 THAT ARE MEMBERS OF A TALENT CONSORTIUM AND THAT SEEK TO CONVERT AN
16 ENTIRE SCHOOL OR DISTRICT TO A COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING MODEL.
17 APPLICATIONS UNDER THIS SECTION MUST INCLUDE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

18 (A) AN EDUCATIONAL MODEL THAT ALLOWS THE USE OF MULTIPLE AND
19 INNOVATIVE METHODS TO DETERMINE PUPILS' ACHIEVEMENT OF GRADE-LEVEL
20 COMPETENCIES AND CREDIT UNDER THE MICHIGAN MERIT CURRICULUM.

21 (B) CURRICULUM THAT ALLOWS FOR A MAJORITY OF INSTRUCTIONAL
22 TIME TO BE SPENT ON PUPIL-DRIVEN PROJECTS THAT TARGET ACADEMIC
23 SKILLS AND ASSIST PUPILS IN ACHIEVING 21ST CENTURY SKILLS SUCH AS
24 LEADERSHIP, TEAMWORK, PROBLEM SOLVING, AND COMMUNICATION.

25 (C) AN INNOVATIVE PARTNERSHIP WITH EMPLOYERS OR INSTITUTES OF
26 HIGHER EDUCATION, OR BOTH, TO PROVIDE CONTEXTUALIZED LEARNING
27 OPPORTUNITIES THAT EMPHASIZE ATTAINMENT OF COMPETENCIES THAT

1 INCLUDE APPLICATION AND CREATION OF KNOWLEDGE, ALONG WITH THE
2 DEVELOPMENT OF WORK-READY SKILLS.

3 (D) A PLAN FOR THE TRANSITION AWAY FROM A GRADE-LEVEL SYSTEM
4 OF PUPIL PROMOTION TO A COMPETENCY-BASED SYSTEM OF PUPIL PROMOTION.
5 THIS PLAN MUST INCLUDE MESSAGING TO PARENTS DESCRIBING THE BENEFITS
6 OF, AND STEPS TAKEN TO IMPLEMENT, A COMPETENCY-BASED INSTRUCTIONAL
7 MODEL.

8 (E) A PLAN FOR A SCOPE AND TIMELINE OF PROFESSIONAL
9 DEVELOPMENT FOR SCHOOL INSTRUCTIONAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF.

10 (F) A COMMITMENT TO MAINTAIN PARTICIPATION IN STATEWIDE
11 ASSESSMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEMS FOR PUPILS BEING SERVED BY
12 PROGRAMS FUNDED UNDER THIS SECTION.

13 (G) A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE APPLICANT WILL BE AN AMBASSADOR
14 FOR COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING, INCLUDING A COMMITMENT TO MENTOR
15 OTHER DISTRICTS THAT WISH TO CONVERT TO A COMPETENCY-BASED
16 INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL.

17 (5) FROM THE ALLOCATION IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS ALLOCATED
18 FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,100,000.00 TO THE
19 DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT, AND BUDGET TO SUPPORT
20 CRITICAL CYBERSECURITY TRAINING AND INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMS, AS
21 APPROVED BY THIS STATE'S INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY GOVERNANCE COUNCIL.
22 FUNDING ALLOCATED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MUST BE USED TO EXPAND THE
23 MICHIGAN HIGH SCHOOL CYBER CHALLENGE PROGRAM, AS APPROVED BY THE
24 DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT, AND BUDGET. THE EXPANSION
25 MUST INCLUDE, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:

26 (A) AN OPEN PROFESSIONAL CREDENTIALING OR MICRO-CREDENTIALING
27 PROCESS, OR BOTH, FOR ANY PUPIL IN GRADES 9 TO 12 WHO DEMONSTRATES

1 MASTERY OF INDUSTRY-RECOGNIZED CYBERSECURITY SKILLS.

2 (B) COLLABORATION WITH OTHER CYBERSECURITY PROGRAMS TO ENSURE
3 ALIGNMENT OF COACH, MENTOR, AND EDUCATOR SKILLS.

4 (6) FROM THE ALLOCATION IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS ALLOCATED
5 FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$450,000.00 TO THE DEPARTMENT
6 FOR STATEWIDE SUPPORTS FOR COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING, INCLUDING,
7 BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE NECESSARY CAPACITY-BUILDING INFRASTRUCTURE,
8 TOOLS, TRANSCRIPTS, AND REPORTING MECHANISMS TO SUPPORT THE
9 IMPLEMENTATION OF COMPETENCY-BASED EDUCATION MODELS IN DISTRICTS
10 AND CONSORTIA OF DISTRICTS RECEIVING FUNDING UNDER SUBSECTION (4)
11 WITH THE GOAL OF OFFERING THESE TOOLS STATEWIDE.

12 (7) FROM THE FUNDS ALLOCATED IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS
13 ALLOCATED AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000,000.00 TO THE DEPARTMENT
14 FOR PROVIDING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO DISTRICTS TO HELP DISTRICTS
15 INTEGRATE THE MICHIGAN MERIT CURRICULUM INTO COMPETENCY-BASED
16 PROGRAMS, INCLUDING CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS.

17 (8) AN APPLICATION FOR A GRANT UNDER SUBSECTION (2) MUST
18 INCLUDE A COMMITMENT TO ADOPT THE PRINCIPLES OF A COMPETENCY-BASED
19 INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL.

20 (9) FROM THE FUNDS ALLOCATED IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS
21 ALLOCATED FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$4,000,000.00 FOR
22 AN INNOVATIVE EDUCATOR PROGRAM. FUNDS SHALL BE USED TO SUPPORT
23 EDUCATORS WHO POSSESS SPECIALIZED SKILLS AND USE THOSE SKILLS TO
24 DEPLOY INNOVATIVE INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS FOR THE PURPOSES OF
25 REPLICATION, EXPANSION, AND DISSEMINATION ACROSS THIS STATE. ALL OF
26 THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO THE INNOVATIVE EDUCATOR PROGRAM:

27 (A) BEGINNING IN THE 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT

1 SHALL DEVELOP A PROCESS FOR SELECTING INNOVATIVE EDUCATORS UNDER
2 THIS SECTION.

3 (B) THE GOVERNING BODY OF EACH DISTRICT MAY NOMINATE 1
4 EDUCATOR TO THE INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT IN WHICH THE DISTRICT IS
5 LOCATED FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE INNOVATIVE EDUCATOR CORPS, ACCORDING
6 TO THE TIMELINES ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT. AN INDIVIDUAL MUST
7 MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING TO BE NOMINATED UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION:

8 (i) HAVE DEMONSTRATED DOCUMENTED PUPIL ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT IN
9 THE INNOVATIVE PROGRAM OR THE CREATION OF PUPIL TALENT PORTFOLIOS
10 IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

11 (ii) BE RECOMMENDED BY, AT LEAST, PEERS, PUPILS,
12 ADMINISTRATORS, PARENTS, AND LOCAL COMMUNITY PARTNERS.

13 (iii) HAVE DEMONSTRATED SUCCESSFUL IMPLEMENTATION OF
14 INNOVATIVE INSTRUCTIONAL METHODOLOGY IN PREPARING PUPILS FOR 21ST
15 CENTURY CAREERS.

16 (iv) EXEMPLIFY THE PASSION, ENERGY, AND PROFESSIONALISM OF THE
17 TEACHING PROFESSION.

18 (C) NOT LATER THAN DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, DEPENDING ON
19 AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW THE NOMINATIONS
20 SUBMITTED UNDER SUBDIVISION (B) AND SELECT UP TO 100 EDUCATORS FROM
21 THE SUBMITTED NOMINATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE INNOVATIVE
22 EDUCATOR CORPS FOR A TERM OF 3 YEARS. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SELECT
23 EDUCATORS BASED ON AT LEAST BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

24 (i) PREFERENCE FOR EDUCATORS WITH DEMONSTRATED COMMUNITY,
25 HIGHER EDUCATION, OR BUSINESS PARTNERSHIPS.

26 (ii) PREFERENCE FOR EDUCATORS WHO UTILIZE A COMPETENCY-BASED
27 INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL, UTILIZE A PROJECT-BASED INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL,

1 HAVE HAD SUCCESS IN THE TURNAROUND OF A LOW-PERFORMING SCHOOL, OR
2 HAVE HAD SUCCESS IN A BALANCED OR YEAR-ROUND CALENDAR.

3 (D) IF SUFFICIENT FUNDING IS AVAILABLE, EACH OF THE EDUCATORS
4 SELECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO SERVE IN THE INNOVATIVE EDUCATOR
5 CORPS UNDER SUBDIVISION (C) SHALL RECEIVE A STIPEND IN THE AMOUNT
6 OF \$5,000.00 PER YEAR FOR UP TO 3 YEARS. AT LEAST 1 TIME PER YEAR,
7 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW THE QUALIFICATION OF EDUCATORS TO
8 ENSURE THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS, AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS
9 ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT, ARE STILL BEING MET. IF SUFFICIENT
10 FUNDING IS AVAILABLE, AN ADDITIONAL \$5,000.00 PER EDUCATOR WILL BE
11 AWARDED ANNUALLY TO THE INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT FOR PURPOSES OF
12 REPLICATION, EXPANSION, AND DISSEMINATION OF THE INNOVATIVE
13 STRATEGIES AND PROGRAM. THE SELECTED EDUCATOR SHALL DEVELOP A PLAN
14 WITH THE INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT THAT DETAILS HOW THE FUNDS WILL BE
15 SPENT TO SUPPORT THE DUTIES OF THE SELECTED EDUCATOR UNDER THIS
16 SUBSECTION. THESE FUNDS MAY BE USED TO COVER COSTS, INCLUDING, BUT
17 NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:

18 (i) PUPIL AND EDUCATOR TRAVEL.

19 (ii) SUBSTITUTE EDUCATORS.

20 (iii) PROGRAM MATERIALS.

21 (iv) TRAINING MATERIALS.

22 (v) PUPIL SUPPLIES AND MATERIALS.

23 (10) THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL PROMULGATE
24 RULES TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.

25 SEC. 297B. (1) FROM THE APPROPRIATION IN SECTION 297, THERE IS
26 ALLOCATED FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$18,500,000.00 FOR
27 COMPETITIVE GRANTS TO DISTRICTS AND INTERMEDIATE DISTRICTS FOR THE

1 TALENT EQUIPMENT PROGRAM DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION. GRANTS AWARDED
2 UNDER THIS SECTION ARE SUBJECT TO SECTION 297K.

3 (2) A DISTRICT OR INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT THAT IS A MEMBER OF A
4 TALENT CONSORTIUM IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR A GRANT UNDER THIS
5 SECTION, IN A FORM AND MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER
6 SECTION 297I.

7 (3) GRANT FUNDS AWARDED UNDER THIS SECTION MUST BE USED TO
8 PURCHASE OR LEASE EQUIPMENT FOR USE IN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS THAT
9 BUILD A MORE QUALIFIED AND SKILLED WORKFORCE IN EMERGING AND HIGH-
10 DEMAND FIELDS AND RESULT IN COMPETENCIES OR CREDENTIALS IN THOSE
11 FIELDS.

12 (4) AN APPLICATION FOR A GRANT UNDER THIS SECTION MUST INCLUDE
13 A COMMITMENT TO PROVIDE MATCHING FUNDS OF AT LEAST 25% OF THE
14 AMOUNT OF THE GRANT AWARD AND INCLUDE A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE
15 PROPOSED CAPITAL INFRASTRUCTURE INITIATIVE WILL ALIGN WITH THE
16 TALENT AGREEMENT DEFINED IN SECTION 297H AND PROVIDE INCREASED
17 CAREER OPPORTUNITIES FOR PUPILS AND ADULT LEARNERS IN HIGH-DEMAND
18 FIELDS. MATCHING FUNDS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE IN-
19 KIND.

20 SEC. 297C. (1) FROM THE APPROPRIATION IN SECTION 297, THERE IS
21 ALLOCATED FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$25,500,000.00 FOR
22 THE MICHIGAN TALENT PLEDGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE
23 DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY.

24 (2) FROM THE ALLOCATION IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS ALLOCATED
25 FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$20,000,000.00 TO BE USED FOR
26 THE PURPOSE OF ASSISTING LOW-INCOME INDIVIDUALS WITH THE COST OF
27 OBTAINING A QUALIFYING DEGREE OR CREDENTIAL IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

1 THE FUNDS MUST BE USED TO FUND SCHOLARSHIPS AND STIPENDS FOR 3
2 COHORTS OF ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS OVER 4 YEARS. AWARDS SHALL BE IN
3 THE FOLLOWING AMOUNTS:

4 (A) \$750.00 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD FOR INDIVIDUALS ENROLLED IN AN
5 ELIGIBLE PROGRAM THAT LEADS TO A 1-YEAR CREDENTIAL, IN ADDITION TO
6 A \$250.00 STIPEND PAID TO THE INDIVIDUAL.

7 (B) \$500.00 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD EACH YEAR FOR 2 YEARS FOR
8 INDIVIDUALS ENROLLED IN AN ELIGIBLE PROGRAM THAT LEADS TO A 2-YEAR
9 CREDENTIAL, IN ADDITION TO A \$250.00 STIPEND EACH YEAR PAID TO THE
10 INDIVIDUAL.

11 (3) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A SCHOLARSHIP GRANT UNDER THIS SECTION,
12 AN INDIVIDUAL SHALL MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

13 (A) EXCEPT FOR AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER THE AGE OF 18, POSSESS A
14 HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA, RECOGNIZED EQUIVALENCY, OR RECOGNIZED
15 EQUIVALENCY CERTIFICATE.

16 (B) BE A RESIDENT OF THIS STATE AND A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED
17 STATES OF AMERICA.

18 (C) FILE THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA),
19 ANNUALLY.

20 (D) MEET THE SAME INCOME QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS AS THE
