Overview

House Bill 5843 contains a supplemental appropriation adjustment for the Department of State Police for FY 2019-20. In sum, adjustments would increase Gross and State Restricted appropriations by \$6.0 million. The bill would have \$0 impact on the state's General Fund.

FY 2019-20 Supplemental Boilerplate Items

GENERAL SECTIONS

Sec. 201. State Spending and State Appropriations Paid to Local Units of Government

Estimates total state spending from state sources and payments to be made to local units of government.

Sec. 202. Appropriations Subject to Management and Budget Act

Subjects appropriations to the Management and Budget Act, 1984 PA 431.

Sec. 203. State Administrative Board Transfers

Authorizes the legislature, by a concurrent resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and serving in each house, to inter-transfer funds if the State Administrative Board transfers funds.

STATE POLICE

Sec. 301. Allocate Disaster and Emergency Contingency Funds - Subject Funds to Emergency Management Act

Requires Disaster and Emergency Contingency Funds to be allocated to Midland, Saginaw, Arenac, Gladwin, and Iosco Counties and to the City of Midland to reimburse project restoration costs and expenses caused by the federally declared disaster; projects include debris removal, emergency protective measures (road blockades, sheltering, and evacuations), chemical contamination clean-up efforts, and the repair of real estate and personal property; requires grants to be made in accordance with section 19 of the Emergency Management Act.

FY 2019-20 Supplemental Boilerplate Items

Sec. 302. Allocate Disaster and Emergency Contingency Funds – Chemical Clean-up and Housing Costs

Requires Disaster and Emergency Contingency Funds to be allocated to Midland County and the City of Midland to reimburse project restoration costs and expenses caused by the federally declared disaster; projects include debris removal, emergency protective measures (road blockades, sheltering, and evacuations), chemical contamination clean-up efforts, and the repair of real estate and personal property; prohibits expenditures for chemical contamination clean-up to be made for projects where existing parties are responsible for monitoring and remediating contaminated properties; requires priority to be given to allocating funding for support of housing assistance costs for individuals displaced from their residence.

Sec. 303. Reimbursement from Parties Found to be Liable

Requires the department to seek reimbursement for flood-related expenditures in the event that any party is found to be criminally or civilly liable for the failure of either the Edenville Dam or the Sanford Dam.

Sec. 304. Reporting Requirement

Requires the department to submit a report that includes the name and location of entities receiving funding, the purpose and use of funding, the amount of federal assistance provided and an itemized list of expenditures made, the number of employees engaged in responding to dam failures, and a listing of all local and county units that applied for grants funding and determinations that were made on each application.
