

**SUBSTITUTE FOR  
SENATE BILL NO. 1112**

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled  
"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"  
by amending section 2 (MCL 28.292), as amended by 2020 PA 242.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1           Sec. 2. (1) An official state personal identification card  
2 must contain the following:

3           (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the  
4 individual to whom the card is issued.

5           (b) The full legal name, date of birth, sex, residence



1 address, height, weight, eye color, digital photographic image,  
2 signature of or verification and certification by the applicant, as  
3 determined by the secretary of state, and expiration date of the  
4 official state personal identification card. If an official state  
5 personal identification card is issued to an individual described  
6 in section 1(5) who has temporary lawful status, the official state  
7 personal identification card must be issued in compliance with 6  
8 CFR 37.21 or in compliance with the process established to comply  
9 with 6 CFR 37.71 by the secretary of state. As used in this  
10 subdivision, "temporary lawful status" means that term as defined  
11 in 6 CFR 37.3.

12 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or  
13 more of the following:

- 14 (i) The blood type of the individual.  
15 (ii) Immunization data of the individual.  
16 (iii) Medication data of the individual.  
17 (iv) A statement that the individual is deaf.

18 (d) In the case of a holder of an official state personal  
19 identification card who has indicated his or her wish to  
20 participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of  
21 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, a  
22 heart insignia on the front of the official state personal  
23 identification card.

24 (e) If requested by an individual who is a veteran as that  
25 term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61, a  
26 designation that the individual is a veteran. The designation must  
27 be in a style and format considered appropriate by the secretary of  
28 state. The secretary of state shall require proof of discharge or  
29 separation of service from the armed forces of this state, another



1 state, or the United States, and the nature of that discharge, for  
 2 the purposes of verifying an individual's status as a veteran under  
 3 this subdivision. The secretary of state shall consult with the  
 4 department of military and veterans affairs in determining the  
 5 proof that must be required to identify an individual's status as a  
 6 veteran for the purposes of this subsection. The secretary of state  
 7 may provide the department of military and veterans affairs and  
 8 agencies of the counties of this state that provide veteran  
 9 services with information provided by an applicant under this  
 10 subsection for the purpose of veterans' benefits eligibility  
 11 referral.

12 (f) Physical security features designed to prevent tampering,  
 13 counterfeiting, or duplication of the official state personal  
 14 identification card for fraudulent purposes.

15 (2) In conjunction with the application for an official state  
 16 personal identification card, the secretary of state shall do all  
 17 of the following:

18 (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:

19 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an  
 20 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public  
 21 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in  
 22 accordance with this section.

23 (ii) Information describing the donor registry program  
 24 maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ procurement  
 25 organization or its successor organization under section 10120 of  
 26 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120. The information  
 27 required under this subparagraph must include the address and  
 28 telephone number of Michigan's federally designated organ  
 29 procurement organization or its successor organization as described



1 in section 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL  
2 333.10120.

3 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have  
4 his or her name placed on the registry described in subparagraph  
5 (ii).

6 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on  
7 his or her official state personal identification card that he or  
8 she is willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death  
9 under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL  
10 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in accordance with this section.

11 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to the  
12 secretary of state under this section a willingness to have his or  
13 her name placed on the donor registry described in subdivision  
14 (a) (ii), the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record for  
15 the donor registry.

16 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of  
17 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:

18 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice  
19 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal  
20 identification card.

21 (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally  
22 appears at a secretary of state branch office.

23 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for  
24 applications processed by electronic means.

25 (4) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the  
26 official state personal identification card. The secretary of state  
27 shall designate a space on the official state personal  
28 identification card where the applicant may place a sticker or  
29 decal of a uniform size as the secretary may specify to indicate



1 that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical  
2 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any  
3 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested  
4 in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information  
5 card, but must meet the specifications of the secretary of state.  
6 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the  
7 cardholder has designated 1 or more patient advocates in accordance  
8 with section 5506 of the estates and protected individuals code,  
9 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The emergency medical information card,  
10 carried separately by the cardholder, may contain the information  
11 described in subsection (2)(c), information concerning the  
12 cardholder's patient advocate designation, other emergency medical  
13 information, or an indication as to where the cardholder has stored  
14 or registered emergency medical information. An original official  
15 state personal identification card or the renewal of an existing  
16 official state personal identification card issued to an individual  
17 less than 21 years of age must be portrait or vertical in form, and  
18 an official state personal identification card issued to an  
19 individual 21 years of age or over must be landscape or horizontal  
20 in form. Except as otherwise required in this act, other  
21 information required on the official state personal identification  
22 card under this act may appear on the official state personal  
23 identification card in a form prescribed by the secretary of state.

24 (5) The official state personal identification card must not  
25 contain a fingerprint or finger image of the applicant.

26 (6) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of  
27 state shall retain and use an individual's digital photographic  
28 image and signature described in subsection (1)(b) only for  
29 programs administered by the secretary of state as specifically



1 authorized by law. An individual's digital photographic image or  
2 signature must only be used as follows:

3 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a  
4 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.

5 (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically  
6 authorized by law.

7 (c) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department  
8 of state police the images of individuals required to be registered  
9 under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.721  
10 to 28.736, upon the department of state police providing the  
11 secretary of state an updated list of those individuals.

12 (d) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department  
13 of state police a digitized photograph taken of the applicant for  
14 an official state personal identification card for use as provided  
15 in section 5c of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.425c.

16 (e) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department  
17 of licensing and regulatory affairs the images of applicants for an  
18 official state registry identification card issued under section 6  
19 of the Michigan Medical Marihuana Act, 2008 IL 1, MCL 333.26426, if  
20 the department of licensing and regulatory affairs promulgates  
21 rules requiring a photograph as a design element for an official  
22 state registry identification card.

23 (f) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or the  
24 United States.

25 (7) If an individual presents evidence of statutory blindness  
26 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued  
27 or is the holder of an official state personal identification card,  
28 the secretary of state shall mark the individual's official state  
29 personal identification card in a manner that clearly indicates



1 that the cardholder is legally blind.

2 (8) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an  
3 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her name  
4 placed on the donor registry described in subsection (2) (a) (ii).  
5 Information about an individual's indication of a willingness to  
6 have his or her name placed on the donor registry that is obtained  
7 by the secretary of state and forwarded under this section is  
8 exempt from disclosure under section 13(1) (d) of the freedom of  
9 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243. As required in section  
10 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the  
11 secretary of state shall establish and maintain the donor registry  
12 in a manner that complies with that section and that provides  
13 electronic access, including, but not limited to, the transfer of  
14 data to this state's federally designated organ procurement  
15 organization or its successor organization, tissue banks, and eye  
16 banks.

17 (9) An official state personal identification card may contain  
18 an identifier for voter registration purposes.

19 (10) An official state personal identification card must  
20 contain information appearing in electronic or machine-readable  
21 codes needed to conduct a transaction with the secretary of state.  
22 The information must be limited to the information described in  
23 subsection (1) (a) and (b) except for the individual's digital  
24 photographic image and signature or verification and certification,  
25 state of issuance, and other information necessary for use with  
26 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines  
27 and must not contain the individual's driving record or other  
28 personal identifier. The official state personal identification  
29 card must identify the encoded information.



1 (11) An official state personal identification card must be  
2 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and must  
3 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the  
4 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the  
5 official state personal identification card without ready  
6 detection.

7 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant  
8 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each  
9 original or renewal official state personal identification card  
10 issued. The secretary of state shall not assess a late renewal fee  
11 for an official state personal identification card that expires on  
12 or after March 1, 2020 and is renewed before December 11, 2020. The  
13 department of treasury shall deposit the fees received and  
14 collected under this section in the state treasury to the credit of  
15 the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the fees  
16 credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary of  
17 state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from the  
18 Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951 PA  
19 51, MCL 247.660, must not be used to compensate the secretary of  
20 state for costs incurred and services performed under this section.

21 (13) An original or renewal official state personal  
22 identification card expires on the birthday of the individual to  
23 whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance  
24 or on the date the individual is no longer considered to be legally  
25 present in the United States under section 1, whichever is earlier.  
26 The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal  
27 identification card under this act for a period greater than 4  
28 years. Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of  
29 state may issue a renewal official state personal identification





1 card for ~~1-2~~ additional 4-year ~~period~~**periods** by mail or by other  
2 methods prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary of  
3 state shall require renewal in person by an individual required  
4 under section 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA  
5 295, MCL 28.725a, to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's  
6 license or official state personal identification card.

7 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this  
8 section if the applicant is any of the following:

9 (a) An individual 65 years of age or older.

10 (b) An individual who has had his or her operator's or  
11 chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or denied under the  
12 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, because  
13 of a mental or physical infirmity or disability.

14 (c) An individual who presents evidence of statutory blindness  
15 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.

16 (d) An individual who presents evidence of 1 or more of the  
17 following:

18 (i) A notice of case action from the department of health and  
19 human services indicating that the individual is a participant in 1  
20 or both of the following programs and is making his or her  
21 application for an official state personal identification card  
22 during a period in which he or she is receiving benefits:

23 (A) The family independence program.

24 (B) The state disability assistance program.

25 (ii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit  
26 award letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving  
27 payments under the federal supplemental security income program as  
28 that term is defined in section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939  
29 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or the Social Security disability income



1 program.

2 (iii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit  
3 verification letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving  
4 payments under the federal supplemental security income program as  
5 that term is defined in section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939  
6 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or the Social Security disability income  
7 program.

8 (e) An individual who decides to add or remove a heart  
9 insignia described in subsection (1)(d).

10 (f) An individual who is a veteran as that term is defined in  
11 section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61. The secretary of state shall  
12 require an individual who seeks a waiver of the fee under this  
13 subdivision to provide the secretary of state the same  
14 documentation required for a veteran designation under subsection  
15 (1)(e) before granting the fee waiver.

16 (g) An individual who presents both of the following:

17 (i) A homeless verification letter that states that the  
18 individual meets the definition of category 1 homeless as that term  
19 is defined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban  
20 Development. A letter provided as evidence under this subparagraph  
21 must be submitted on the official letterhead of a public service  
22 agency. The secretary of state may verify the information contained  
23 in the letter with the agency of issuance before issuing an  
24 official state personal identification card.

25 (ii) A photo identification card generated from the United  
26 States Department of Housing and Urban Development Homeless  
27 Management Information System.

28 (15) An individual who has been issued an official state  
29 personal identification card shall apply for a renewal official



1 state personal identification card if the individual changes his or  
2 her name.

3 (16) An individual who has been issued an official state  
4 personal identification card shall apply for a corrected  
5 identification card if he or she changes his or her residence  
6 address. The secretary of state may correct the address on an  
7 official state personal identification card by a method prescribed  
8 by the secretary of state. A fee must not be charged for a change  
9 of residence address.

10 (17) An individual who has been issued an official state  
11 personal identification card may apply for a renewal official state  
12 personal identification card for 1 or more of the following  
13 reasons:

14 (a) The individual wants to change any information on the  
15 official state personal identification card.

16 (b) An official state personal identification card issued  
17 under this act is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes  
18 illegible.

19 (18) An individual may indicate on an official state personal  
20 identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state  
21 his or her blood type, emergency contact information, immunization  
22 data, medication data, or a statement that the individual is deaf.

23 (19) The secretary of state shall develop and shall, in  
24 conjunction with the department of state police, implement a  
25 process using the L.E.I.N. or any other appropriate system that  
26 limits access to law enforcement that allows law enforcement  
27 agencies of this state to access emergency contact information and  
28 to view a communication impediment designation that the holder of  
29 an official state personal identification card has voluntarily



1 provided to the secretary of state.

2 (20) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state  
3 that he or she is a minor who has been emancipated under 1968 PA  
4 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal identification  
5 card must bear the designation of the individual's emancipated  
6 status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state.

7 (21) The secretary of state shall inquire of each individual  
8 who applies for or who holds an official state personal  
9 identification card, in person or by mail, whether he or she agrees  
10 to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101  
11 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.  
12 An individual who has agreed to participate in the donor registry  
13 is not considered to have revoked that agreement solely because the  
14 individual's official state personal identification card has  
15 expired. Enrollment in the donor registry is a legal agreement that  
16 remains binding and in effect after the donor's death regardless of  
17 the expressed desires of the deceased donor's next of kin who may  
18 oppose the donor's anatomical gift.

19 (22) A valid official state personal identification card  
20 presented by the individual to whom the card is issued is  
21 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license  
22 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically  
23 provided by law.

24 (23) If an official state personal identification card issued  
25 under this act is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes  
26 illegible, the individual to whom the official state personal  
27 identification card was issued may obtain a duplicate upon the  
28 payment of the fee required in subsection (24) and upon furnishing  
29 proof satisfactory to the secretary of state that the official



1 state personal identification card has been lost, destroyed, or  
2 mutilated, or has become illegible.

3 (24) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (25), for each  
4 duplicate official state personal identification card, and for each  
5 correction of an official state personal identification card, an  
6 individual may apply for renewal of the official state personal  
7 identification card and pay the renewal fee prescribed in this act  
8 or the individual may, at his or her option and upon payment of the  
9 fee prescribed in this section, apply for a duplicate official  
10 state personal identification card that expires on the same date as  
11 the official state personal identification card that was lost,  
12 destroyed, or mutilated, or became illegible. The fee for a  
13 duplicate official state personal identification card is \$10.00. A  
14 renewal fee must not be charged for a change of address, a  
15 correction required to correct a department error, or to add or  
16 remove a heart insignia described in subsection (1)(d).

17 (25) Except with regard to an individual who is less than 21  
18 years of age, for each duplicate official state personal  
19 identification card, and for each correction of an official state  
20 personal identification card, an individual shall apply for renewal  
21 of the official state personal identification card and pay the  
22 renewal fee prescribed in this act if the official state personal  
23 identification card was due to expire within the next 12 months.  
24 Except as otherwise provided in this act, an official state  
25 personal identification card renewed under this subsection or  
26 subsection (24) must be renewed for the combined period of the time  
27 remaining on the official state personal identification card before  
28 its renewal and the 4-year renewal period.

29 (26) Notwithstanding subsection (13), an official state



1 personal identification card expiring on or after March 1, 2020 is  
2 considered valid until December 11, 2020. If the secretary of state  
3 receives an application to renew an official state personal  
4 identification card that expires on or after March 1, 2020 before  
5 December 11, 2020, the secretary of state shall process the  
6 application as a renewal of an existing official state personal  
7 identification card.

8 (27) As used in this section:

9 (a) "Communication impediment" means an individual has a  
10 health condition that may impede communication with a police  
11 officer, including, but not limited to, the following:

12 (i) Deafness or hearing loss.

13 (ii) An autism spectrum disorder.

14 (b) "Emergency contact information" means the name, telephone  
15 number, or address of an individual that is used for the sole  
16 purpose of contacting that individual when the holder of an  
17 official state personal identification card has been involved in an  
18 emergency.
