A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

by amending section 81d (MCL 750.81d), as amended by 2006 PA 517.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 81d. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (2),
- 2 (3), and (4), this section, an individual who assaults, batters,
- 3 wounds, resists, obstructs, opposes, or endangers a person who the
- 4 individual knows or has reason to know is performing his or her





- duties is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 2 years or a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.
- 3 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an
 4 individual who assaults, batters, wounds, or endangers a health
 5 professional or a medical volunteer who the individual knows or has
 6 reason to know is performing his or her duties is guilty of a
 7 felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 2 years or a
 8 fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.
 - (3) (2)—An individual who assaults, batters, wounds, resists, obstructs, opposes, or endangers a person who the individual knows or has reason to know is performing his or her duties violates subsection (1) or (2) causing a bodily injury requiring medical attention or medical care to that person, health professional, or medical volunteer is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, or both.
 - (4) (3)—An individual who assaults, batters, wounds, resists, obstructs, opposes, or endangers a person who the individual knows or has reason to know is performing his or her duties violates subsection (1) or (2) causing a serious impairment of a body function of that person, health professional, or medical volunteer is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 15 years or a fine of not more than \$10,000.00, or both.
 - (5) (4)—An individual who assaults, batters, wounds, resists, obstructs, opposes, or endangers a person who the individual knows or has reason to know is performing his or her duties violates subsection (1) or (2) causing the death of that person, health professional, or medical volunteer is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 20 years or a fine of not more

- 2 (6) (5) This section does not prohibit an individual from
- 3 being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other
- 4 violation of law that is committed by that individual while

- 6 (7) (6) A term of imprisonment imposed for a violation of this

- 8 (d) (b) "Person" means any of the following:
- **9** (i) A police officer of this state or of a political
- 10 subdivision of this state including, but not limited to, a motor
- 11 carrier officer or capitol security officer of the department of
- 12 state police.
- (ii) A police officer of a junior college, college, or
- 14 university who is authorized by the governing board of that junior
- 15 college, college, or university to enforce state law and the rules
- 16 and ordinances of that junior college, college, or university.
- 17 (iii) A conservation officer of the department of natural
- 18 resources or the department of environmental quality.
- 19 (iv) A conservation officer of the United States department of
- 20 the interior. Department of the Interior.
- 21 (v) A sheriff or deputy sheriff.
- (vi) A constable.
- (vii) A peace officer of a duly authorized police agency of the
- 24 United States, including, but not limited to, an agent of the
- 25 secret service Secret Service or department of justice. Department

- (ix) Any emergency medical service personnel described in
