- 1 A resolution to declare May 5-11, 2019, as InfantSee Week in
- 2 the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, The most critical stages of vision development occur
- 4 in the first year of a child's life; and
- 5 Whereas, Undetected eye and vision problems can lead to
- 6 permanent vision impairment or loss of life; and
- 7 Whereas, One in 10 children is at risk from undiagnosed eye
- 8 and vision problems; and
- 9 Whereas, One in 30 children will be affected by amblyopia, a
- 10 leading cause of vision loss in people younger than 45 years; and
- 11 Whereas, Undetected vision problems can contribute to a

- 1 decrease in a child's quality of life and may lead to developmental
- 2 and behavioral difficulties which impede classroom learning, as
- 3 well as increase the costs to society; and
- 4 Whereas, Early detection of vision problems is the best way to
- 5 treat and prevent permanent vision impairment; and
- 6 Whereas, Member optometrists of the American Optometric
- 7 Association and The Vision Care Institute of Johnson & Johnson
- 8 Vision Care, Inc., have partnered to create InfantSee, a public
- 9 health program to provide a one-time, no-cost eye assessment for
- 10 infants six to twelve months; now, therefore, be it
- 11 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 12 this legislative body declare May 5-11, 2019, as InfantSee Week in
- 13 the state of Michigan. We commend the members of the Michigan
- 14 Optometric Association and the profession of optometry for
- 15 voluntarily dedicating their expertise and services to the infants
- 16 of Michigan through the InfantSee program; and be it further
- 17 Resolved, That we encourage parents to schedule an InfantSee
- 18 assessment for their infants.
