SENATE RESOLUTION NO.123

Senators Moss, Irwin, Santana, McMorrow, Polehanki, Bayer, Brinks, Hertel, Chang, Bullock, Alexander, Wojno, McCann, Geiss, Ananich and Hollier offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize June 2020 as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual,
- 2 Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) Pride Month.
- 3 Whereas, LGBTQ pride began 50 years ago in 1970 with the one-
- 4 year anniversary of the Stonewall Riots. In 1969, a black
- 5 transgender woman named Marsha P. Johnson, along with other LGBTQ
- 6 individuals, risked their lives to protest the over-policing of the
- 7 LGBTQ community and the injustice that threatened their existence
- 8 on a daily basis; and
- 9 Whereas, The LGBTQ movement has been marked by tragedy,
- 10 especially the slow and insufficient government response to assist

- 1 those with HIV/AIDS; and
- 2 Whereas, Michigan's LGBTO community is not currently protected
- 3 from discrimination in housing, employment, or public
- 4 accommodation; and
- 5 Whereas, The push to include sexual orientation, gender
- 6 identity, and gender expression among the existing protected
- 7 classes in the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act has never been put
- 8 up for a vote in the Michigan Legislature; and
- 9 Whereas, Michigan should expend all efforts to attract and
- 10 retain talent, and amending the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act
- 11 would signal to the nation we are welcoming to those who wish to
- 12 contribute to the economic vitality of our state; and
- 13 Whereas, Expanding the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act would
- 14 preserve the freedom, worth, and dignity of those in the LGBTQ
- 15 community from people who seek to do them harm; and
- 16 Whereas, Everyone benefits from the multiple talents,
- 17 viewpoints, and cultural backgrounds of all of its citizens; and
- 18 Whereas, We firmly believe in a society that values the
- 19 freedom, worth, and dignity of each human being; and
- 20 Whereas, In 2015, the Supreme Court of the United States
- 21 historically affirmed marriage equality nationwide in Obergefell v.
- 22 Hodges; and
- 23 Whereas, The people of Michigan understand, appreciate, and
- 24 value the cultural, civic, and economic contributions of LGBTQ
- 25 communities to the greater community of the state, and affirm a
- 26 celebration of love, living authentically, and accepting ourselves;

- 28 Whereas, June is recognized and celebrated as LGBTQ Pride
- 29 Month throughout the country and worldwide; now, therefore, be it
