### SUMMARY:

House Bill 4923 would amend the Michigan Election Law to add a concealed pistol license (CPL) to the list of allowable identification for election purposes.

2018 PA 129<sup>1</sup> defined *identification for election purposes* as the forms of photo ID that were already accepted under existing law, namely:

- A state ID card or driver's license issued by Michigan.
- An enhanced state ID card or enhanced driver's license issued by Michigan.
- A state ID card or driver's license issued by another state.
- A federal or state government-issued photo ID.
- A U.S. passport.
- A military photo ID.
- A student ID from a high school or institution of higher education.
- A tribal photo ID.

Additionally, it required that the name on the individual's card or document sufficiently match the elector's name in the voter registration record.

The bill would allow a voter to use a CPL as identification for election purposes, as well.

The bill would have no fiscal impact on the state or local units of government.
