Senate Bill No. 415, entitled

A bill to amend 1933 PA 167, entitled "General sales tax act," by amending sections 12 and 18 (MCL 205.62 and 205.68), as amended by 2022 PA 3.

The Senate has passed the bill.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Tax Policy.

Senate Bill No. 416, entitled

A bill to amend 1937 PA 94, entitled "Use tax act," by amending sections 14a and 14b (MCL 205.104a and 205.104b), as amended by 2022 PA 4.

The Senate has passed the bill.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Tax Policy.

Senate Bill No. 515, entitled

A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled “The code of criminal procedure,” by amending section 27c of chapter VIII (MCL 768.27c), as added by 2006 PA 79.

The Senate has passed the bill.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Senate Bill No. 516, entitled

A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled “The code of criminal procedure,” by amending section 27b of chapter VIII (MCL 768.27b), as amended by 2018 PA 372.

The Senate has passed the bill.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Senate Bill No. 517, entitled

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled “The Michigan penal code,” by amending section 462g (MCL 750.462g), as amended by 2017 PA 53.

The Senate has passed the bill.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Introduction of Bills

Reps. Arbit, Rheingans, Dievendorf, Byrnes, Miller and MacDonell introduced

House Bill No. 5410, entitled

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled “The Michigan penal code,” by amending sections 158 and 159 (MCL 750.158 and 750.159).

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Criminal Justice.

Reps. Rheingans, Arbit, Dievendorf, Byrnes, Miller and MacDonell introduced

House Bill No. 5411, entitled

A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled “The code of criminal procedure,” by amending section 9 of chapter VI and section 16i of chapter XVII (MCL 766.9 and 777.16i), section 9 of chapter VI as amended by 1988 PA 106 and section 16i of chapter XVII as amended by 2012 PA 169.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Criminal Justice.

Reps. Dievendorf, Arbit, Rheingans, Byrnes, Miller and MacDonell introduced

House Bill No. 5412, entitled

A bill to amend 1925 PA 289, entitled “An act to create and maintain a fingerprint identification and criminal history records division within the department of state police; to require peace officers, persons in charge of certain institutions, and others to make reports respecting juvenile offenses, crimes, and criminals to the state police; to require the fingerprinting of an accused by certain persons; and to provide penalties and remedies for a violation of this act,” by amending section 3 (MCL 28.243), as amended by 2018 PA 67.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Criminal Justice.

Reps. Hoskins, Filler, Farhat and Martus introduced

House Bill No. 5413, entitled

A bill to amend 1984 PA 270, entitled “Michigan strategic fund act,” by amending sections 9, 90g, and 90h (MCL 125.2009, 125.2090g, and 125.2090h), section 9 as amended by 2021 PA 136 and sections 90g and 90h as added by 2017 PA 109.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Economic Development and Small Business.

Reps. Martus, Filler, Hoskins and Farhat introduced

House Bill No. 5414, entitled

A bill to amend 1984 PA 270, entitled “Michigan strategic fund act,” by amending sections 90i and 90j (MCL 125.2090i and 125.2090j), as added by 2017 PA 109.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Economic Development and Small Business.

Reps. Filler, Hoskins and Martus introduced

House Bill No. 5415, entitled

A bill to amend 1967 PA 281, entitled “Income tax act of 1967,” by amending sections 51f and 711 (MCL 206.51f and 206.711), section 51f as added by 2017 PA 110 and section 711 as amended by 2018 PA 118.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Economic Development and Small Business.

Reps. Liberati, Edwards, Paiz and Filler introduced

House Bill No. 5416, entitled

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled “Public health code,” (MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding part 173A.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

Rep. Filler introduced

House Bill No. 5417, entitled

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled “Public health code,” (MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding section 16328a and by adding sections 17353, 17355, 17357, 17358, 17359, and 17361 to part 173A.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

Reps. Johnsen, Cavitt, Alexander, Jaime Greene, Thompson, DeBoyer, Neyer, Rigas, Smit, Friske, Kunse, Bierlein and Hoadley introduced

House Bill No. 5418, entitled

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled “Michigan vehicle code,” by amending sections 2, 698, 716, and 907 (MCL 257.2, 257.698, 257.716, and 257.907), section 2 as amended by 2011 PA 231, section 698 as amended by 2020 PA 382, section 716 as amended by 2016 PA 453, and section 907 as amended by 2023 PA 40.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Transportation, Mobility and Infrastructure.
