

# HOUSE BILL NO. 4613

May 23, 2023, Introduced by Reps. Prestin, Fitzgerald, Roth, Paquette, Mueller, Markkanen, Cavitt, Hoadley, Bezotte, Harris, Martus, Conlin, Hoskins, Tyrone Carter, Liberati, Coleman, Alexander, Beson, Jaime Greene, BeGole, Schmaltz, Rheingans, DeBoyer, Haadsma, Glanville and Witwer and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled  
"Public health code,"  
by amending section 20952 (MCL 333.20952), as added by 1990 PA 179.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1           Sec. 20952. (1) The department may grant a nonrenewable  
2 temporary license to an individual who has made proper application  
3 with the required fee for licensure as a medical first responder,  
4 emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician  
5 specialist, or paramedic and who has successfully completed all of

1 the requirements for licensure except for the department prescribed  
2 examinations. A temporary license is valid for ~~120 days~~ **1 year** from  
3 the date of an accepted application.

4 (2) An individual holding a temporary license as ~~an emergency~~  
5 ~~medical technician~~ **under this section** shall practice only under the  
6 direct supervision of ~~an emergency medical technician, emergency~~  
7 ~~medical technician specialist, or paramedic who holds a license~~  
8 ~~other than a temporary license.~~

9 ~~(3) An individual holding a temporary license as an emergency~~  
10 ~~medical technician specialist shall practice only under the direct~~  
11 ~~supervision of an emergency medical technician specialist or~~  
12 ~~paramedic who holds a license other than a temporary license.~~

13 ~~(4) An individual holding a temporary license as a paramedic~~  
14 ~~shall practice only under the direct supervision of a paramedic who~~  
15 ~~holds a license other than a temporary license.~~ **as provided under**  
16 **section 20952a.**

17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
