SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 350

A bill to amend 2008 PA 549, entitled "Michigan promise zone authority act,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 390.1663), as amended by 2020 PA 330.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- (a) "Authority" means a promise zone authority created underthis act.
- 4 (b) "Board" means the governing body of an authority.
- 5 (c) "Eligible entity" means a city, township, county, local
- 6 school district, or intermediate school district, in which the
- 7 percentage of families with children under age 18 that are living
- 8 at or below the federal poverty level is greater than or equal to
- 9 the state average of families with children under age 18 living at

- 1 or below the federal poverty level, as determined by the department
 2 of treasury.
- 3 (d) "Federal poverty level" means the poverty guidelines
 4 published annually in the Federal Register by the United States
 5 Department of Health and Human Services under its authority to
 6 revise the poverty line under 42 USC 9902.
- 7 (e) "Governing body" means the elected body of an eligible8 entity that has legislative powers.
- 9 (f) "Nonpublic high school" means a high school operated by a 10 nonpublic school that includes grades 9 to 12 or 10 to 12 and that 11 awards a high school diploma. Nonpublic high school also includes a 12 general education development test.
- (g) "Nonpublic school" means that term as defined in section 5of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.5.
- (h) "Promise of financial assistance" means a commitment by an eligible entity to provide financial resources for public or private postsecondary education, including a vocational program, to eligible students living in a promise zone and who have graduated from a public high school or nonpublic high school located within that promise zone.
- (i) "Promise zone" means that area created by a governing bodyunder this act.
- (j) "Promise zone development plan" means that plan developed

 y an authority under this act that will ensure that the financial

 resources are available to adequately fund the promise of financial
 assistance.
- (k) "Public high school" means a public school that includesgrades 9 to 12 or 10 to 12 and that awards a high school diploma.
- 29 (l) "Public school" means that term as defined in section 5 of

- 1 the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.5.
- 2 (m) "Qualified educational expenses" means tuition and fees
- 3 required for the enrollment or attendance of a student at an
- 4 educational institution, and may also include, if provided for in
- 5 an authority's promise zone development plan, expenses any of the
- 6 following:
- 7 (i) Expenses for fees, books, supplies, and equipment required
- 8 for courses of instruction at that educational institution.
- 9 (ii) Other costs of attendance, including the cost of housing
- 10 and food; transportation expenses; federal student loan fees;
- 11 miscellaneous expenses, including a reasonable amount for the
- 12 documented cost of a personal computer; allowance for child care or
- 13 other dependent care; costs related to a disability; costs of
- 14 obtaining a license, certification, or a first professional
- 15 credential; and reasonable costs for study abroad programs.
- 16 (n) "School district" means that term as defined in the
- 17 revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 to 380.1852.
- 18 (o) "State education tax" means the tax levied under the state
- 19 education tax act, 1993 PA 331, MCL 211.901 to 211.906.
- 20 (p) "Vocational program" means an education or training
- 21 program intended to teach a trade, occupation, or vocation and
- 22 offered by a public or private postsecondary institution in this
- 23 state.
