March 02, 2023, Introduced by Reps. Morgan, Rogers, Hoskins, Conlin, Arbit, Mentzer, Glanville, Edwards, Miller, Wilson, McFall, Schmaltz, Alexander, Rheingans, BeGole, Filler, Farhat, Scott and Aiyash and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding sections 5135 and 5135a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 5135. (1) The rare disease advisory council is created within the department for the purpose of advising the department and other state agencies on research, diagnosis, and treatment efforts related to rare diseases in this state.
 - (2) The council must consist of the following members:
- 6 (a) The director or the director's designee.

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- (b) All of the following appointed by the director:
- 2 (i) One physician licensed under part 170 or 175 who has 3 experience treating patients with rare diseases.
- 4 (ii) One registered professional nurse licensed under part 172 who has expertise in providing care to patients with rare diseases.
- 6 (iii) An epidemiologist who practices in this state who has
 7 expertise in the incidence, prevalence, and control of rare
 8 diseases.
- 9 (*iv*) Two individuals who represent hospitals located in this 10 state, at least 1 of whom represents a hospital that conducts 11 research. Each individual appointed under this subparagraph must 12 represent a different hospital.
- 13 (v) One individual representing a health insurer.
- 14 (vi) One individual representing a health maintenance 15 organization.
- 16 (vii) Two individuals representing the biopharmaceutical 17 industry.
- 18 (viii) Two individuals who engage in rare disease research.
- 19 (ix) Two parents of children with a rare disease. Each parent 20 appointed under this subparagraph must be from a different family.
- 21 (x) Two individuals with a rare disease. Each individual 22 appointed under this subparagraph must have a different rare 23 disease.
- 24 (xi) Two individuals representing rare disease patient
 25 organizations that operate in this state. Each individual appointed
 26 under this subparagraph must represent a different organization.
 - (xii) A medical ethicist who practices in this state.

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28 (xiii) A representative from the national pharmaceutical

- 1 industry or a pharmaceutical company working in the area of rare
- 2 diseases.
- 3 (xiv) A genetic counselor licensed under part 170 who is 4 familiar with rare diseases.
- 5 (3) The governor may appoint 1 member to the council.
- 6 (4) Subject to subsection (14), the director may appoint
- 7 additional members to the council that the director considers
- 8 necessary or appropriate.
- 9 (5) The members first appointed to the council must be
- 10 appointed within 90 days after the effective date of the amendatory
- 11 act that added this section.
- 12 (6) Members of the council serve for terms of 4 years or until
- 13 a successor is appointed, whichever is later.
- 14 (7) A vacancy on the council must be filled in the same manner
- 15 as the original appointment. An individual appointed to fill a
- 16 vacancy created other than by expiration of a term must be
- 17 appointed for the unexpired term of the member whom the individual
- 18 is to succeed in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 19 (8) The director may remove a member of the council for
- 20 incompetence, dereliction of duty, malfeasance, misfeasance, or
- 21 nonfeasance in office, or any other good cause.
- 22 (9) The director shall call the first meeting of the council.
- 23 At the first meeting, the council shall elect from among its
- 24 members a chairperson and may elect other officers as it considers
- 25 necessary or appropriate. The council shall meet at least
- 26 quarterly, or more frequently at the call of the chairperson or at
- 27 the request of 4 or more members.
- 28 (10) A majority of the members of the council constitute a
- 29 quorum for the transaction of business. A majority of the members

- 1 present and serving are required for official action of the
- 2 council.
- 3 (11) The council shall conduct its business in compliance with
- 4 the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 5 (12) A writing that is prepared, owned, used, possessed, or
- 6 retained by the council in performing an official function is
- 7 subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231
- 8 to 15.246.
- 9 (13) A member of the council is not entitled to compensation
- 10 for service on the council, but the council may reimburse a member
- 11 for actual and necessary expenses incurred in serving.
- 12 (14) At any time, the council may make recommendations to the
- 13 director on the appointment of additional members to the council
- 14 that the council considers necessary to carry out its duties.
- 15 (15) As used in this section and section 5135a:
- 16 (a) "Council" means the rare disease advisory council created
- 17 in subsection (1).
- 18 (b) "Rare disease" means a disease that affects fewer than
- 19 200,000 individuals in the United States.
- 20 Sec. 5135a. (1) The council may do 1 or more of the following:
- 21 (a) Apply for and accept grants and gifts from government and
- 22 private sources. The department shall provide clerical and
- 23 administrative assistance to the council in applying for grants
- 24 under this subdivision, as the director considers necessary or
- 25 appropriate.
- 26 (b) Hold public hearings and make inquiries and receive
- 27 comments from the general public to assist the council in
- 28 developing recommendations under this section.
- 29 (c) Consult with experts on rare diseases to assist the

- 1 council in developing recommendations under this section,
- 2 including, but not limited to, experts from the private sector,
- 3 organized labor groups, government agencies, and institutions of
- 4 higher education.

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- (2) The council shall do all of the following:
- 6 (a) Research and identify priorities relating to the cost-
- 7 effectiveness of and access to treatments and services provided to
- 8 individuals with rare diseases in this state, and develop policy
- 9 recommendations aimed at preventing discrimination against
- 10 individuals with rare diseases with respect to the cost-
- 11 effectiveness of and access to treatments and services and other
- 12 related issues.
- (b) Identify best practices for rare diseases from other
- 14 states and at the national level that could improve the education,
- 15 care, and treatment of, and services and supports provided to,
- 16 adults and minors with rare diseases in this state.
- 17 (c) Coordinate with other rare disease advisory bodies,
- 18 community-based organizations, and other public and private
- 19 organizations in performing its duties under this section to ensure
- 20 greater cooperation between this state, other states, and the
- 21 federal government regarding the research, diagnosis, and treatment
- 22 of rare diseases, by disseminating the council's research,
- 23 findings, and recommendations when appropriate.
- 24 (d) Serve as an advisory body on rare diseases to the
- 25 legislature, the governor, the department, and other state
- 26 agencies.
- 27 (e) Research and make recommendations to the legislature and
- 28 the department on the most appropriate method to collect data on
- 29 rare diseases.

1 (f) Provide information or advice on rare diseases to the 2 department or governor, as the director or governor considers 3 necessary or appropriate.

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- (g) By December 21, 2023, develop a list of rare diseases and post the list on the department's website. The council shall review and update the list described in this subdivision every 2 years and post the updated list on the department's website.
 - (h) Annually select at least 1 rare disease from the list described in subdivision (g), investigate the rare disease, and make recommendations to the legislature on the rare disease.
- (i) Beginning December 21, 2023, and by December 21 of every other year beginning after the first report is submitted to the legislature under this subdivision, submit a written report to the legislature on the activities, findings, and recommendations of the council.
- 16 (3) Any findings and recommendations made by the council under 17 this section must be based on medical or scientific evidence.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days 19 after the date it is enacted into law.
