SENATE BILL NO. 259

April 11, 2023, Introduced by Senator WOJNO and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 759a and 764a (MCL 168.759a and 168.764a), section 759a as amended by 2022 PA 197 and section 764a as amended by 2020 PA 177.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 759a. (1) An absent uniformed services voter or an

overseas voter who is not registered, but possessed the qualifications of an elector under section 492, may apply for registration by using the federal postcard application. The department of state, bureau of elections, is responsible for disseminating information on the procedures for registering and voting to an absent uniformed services voter and an overseas voter.

7 (2) Upon the request of an absent uniformed services voter or 8 an overseas voter, the clerk of a county, city, or township shall electronically transmit a blank voter registration application or 9 10 blank absent voter ballot application to the voter. The clerk of a 11 county, city, or township shall accept a completed voter registration application or completed absent voter ballot 12 application electronically transmitted by an absent uniformed 13 14 services voter or overseas voter. A voter registration application 15 or absent voter ballot application submitted by an absent uniformed 16 services voter or overseas voter must contain the signature of the 17 voter.

18 (3) A spouse or dependent of an overseas voter who is a 19 citizen of the United States, is accompanying that overseas voter, 20 and is not a qualified and registered elector anywhere else in the 21 United States, may apply for an absent voter ballot even though the 22 spouse or dependent is not a qualified elector of a city or 23 township of this state.

(4) An absent uniformed services voter or an overseas voter,
whether or not registered to vote, may apply for an absent voter
ballot. Upon receipt of an application for an absent voter ballot
under this section that complies with this act, a county, city, or
township clerk shall forward to the applicant the absent voter
ballots requested, the forms necessary for registration, and

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instructions for completing the forms. If the ballots are not yet 1 available at the time of receipt of the application, the clerk 2 shall immediately forward to the applicant the registration forms 3 and instructions, and forward the ballots as soon as they are 4 5 available. If a federal postcard application or an application from 6 the official United States Department of Defense website is filed, 7 the clerk shall accept the federal postcard application or the application from the official United States Department of Defense 8 website as the registration application and shall not send any 9 10 additional registration forms to the applicant. If Subject to 11 subsection (18), if the ballots and registration forms are received 12 before the close of the polls on election day and if the registration complies with the requirements of this act, the absent 13 14 voter ballots must be delivered to the proper election board to be 15 tabulated. If the registration does not comply with the 16 requirements of this act, the clerk shall retain the absent voter 17 ballots until the expiration of the time that the voted ballots 18 must be kept and shall then destroy the ballots without opening the envelope. The clerk may retain registration forms completed under 19 20 this section in a separate file. The address in this state shown on a registration form is the residence of the registrant. 21

(5) Not later than 45 days before an election, a county, city,
or township clerk shall electronically transmit or mail as
appropriate an absent voter ballot to each absent uniformed
services voter or overseas voter who applied for an absent voter
ballot 45 days or more before the election.

27 (6) Upon the request of an absent uniformed services voter or
28 overseas voter, the clerk of a county, city, or township shall
29 electronically transmit an absent voter ballot to the voter. Except

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as otherwise provided in this subsection, the voter shall print the 1 absent voter ballot and return the voted ballot by mail to the 2 appropriate clerk. Subject to subsection (17), beginning January 1, 3 2024, a member of a uniformed service on active duty, by reason of 4 5 being on active duty, or a member of the merchant marine, by reason 6 of service in the merchant marine, who is absent from the United 7 States and does not expect to return to the residence where the member is otherwise qualified to vote before an election may 8 electronically return a voted ballot to the appropriate city or 9 10 township clerk to be counted under the rules promulgated by the 11 secretary of state policies and procedures as set forth in 12 subsection (17).

13 (7) The secretary of state shall prescribe electronic absent 14 voter ballot formats and electronic absent voter ballot 15 transmission methods. Each county, city, or township clerk shall 16 employ the prescribed electronic ballot formats to fulfill an 17 absent voter ballot request received from an absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter who wishes to receive an absent 18 voter ballot through an electronic transmission. The secretary of 19 20 state shall establish procedures to implement the requirements in this section and for the processing of a marked absent voter ballot 21 returned by an absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter 22 23 who obtained an absent voter ballot through an electronic 24 transmission.

(8) The secretary of state shall modify the printed statement provided under section 761(4) and the absent voter ballot instructions provided under section 764a as appropriate to accommodate the procedures developed for electronically transmitting an absent voter ballot to an absent uniformed services

voter or overseas voter. A statement must be included in the 1 certificate signed by the absent voter who obtained an absent voter 2 ballot through an electronic transmission that the secrecy of the 3 absent voter ballot may be compromised during the duplication 4 5 process. The absent voter ballot instructions provided to an absent 6 uniformed services voter or overseas voter must include the proper 7 procedures for returning the absent voter ballot to the appropriate 8 clerk.

9 (9) The size of a precinct must not be determined by10 registration forms completed under this section.

11 (10) An absent uniformed services voter or an overseas voter 12 who submits an absent voter ballot application is eligible to vote as an absent voter in any local, state, or federal election 13 14 occurring in the calendar year in which the election is held for 15 that ballot requested if the absent voter ballot application is 16 received by the county, city, or township clerk not later than 2 17 p.m. of the Saturday before the election. A village clerk receiving 18 an absent voter ballot application from an absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter shall transmit to the township 19 20 clerk and the school district election coordinators, where applicable, the necessary information to enable the city or 21 township clerk and school district election coordinators to forward 22 23 an absent voter ballot for each applicable election in that calendar year to the absent voter. If the local elections official 24 25 rejects a voter registration application or absent voter ballot application submitted by an absent uniformed services voter or 26 27 overseas voter, the election official shall notify the voter of the 28 rejection.

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(11) An email address provided by an absent uniformed services

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voter or overseas voter for the purposes of this section is
 confidential and exempt from disclosure under the freedom of
 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.

4 (12) Under the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee voting
5 act, the state director of elections shall approve a ballot form
6 and registration procedures for absent uniformed services voters
7 and overseas voters.

(13) An absent uniformed services voter or an overseas voter 8 may use the federal write-in absentee ballot, in accordance with 9 10 the provisions of the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee 11 voting act, at a regular election or special election to vote for a local, state, or federal office or on a ballot question. Except as 12 otherwise provided in this subsection, an absent uniformed services 13 14 voter or an overseas voter who uses the federal write-in absentee 15 ballot shall return the voter's voted federal write-in absentee 16 ballot by mail to the appropriate clerk. Subject to subsection 17 (17), beginning January 1, 2024, a member of a uniformed service on 18 active duty, by reason of being on active duty, or a member of the merchant marine, by reason of service in the merchant marine, who 19 20 is absent from the United States and does not expect to return to the residence where the member is otherwise qualified to vote 21 before an election may electronically return a voted ballot to the 22 23 appropriate city or township clerk to be counted under the rules promulgated by the secretary of state policies and procedures as 24 25 set forth in subsection (17). The state bureau of elections shall do both of the following: 26

27 (a) Make the ballot format for each election available to
28 absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters by email or on
29 an internet website maintained by the department of state.

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(b) Make the ballot information, including the offices, names
 of candidates, and ballot proposals, for each election available to
 absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters on an internet
 website maintained by the department of state.

5 (14) The clerk of a city or township shall submit to the 6 county clerk of the county in which that city or township is 7 located a written statement no later than 45 days before each 8 election indicating whether absent voter ballots were issued to absent uniformed services voters or overseas voters in compliance 9 10 with this section and the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee 11 voting act. The city or township clerk shall provide to the county clerk a written explanation describing remedial actions taken by 12 the city or township clerk if the city or township clerk fails to 13 14 comply with this section and the uniformed and overseas citizens 15 absentee voting act. Not later than 42 days before each election, 16 each county clerk shall submit to the state bureau of elections a 17 written report compiled from the written statements submitted by the city and township clerks. The written report must identify the 18 cities and townships that complied with the 45-day deadline under 19 20 this subsection, the cities and townships that did not comply with the 45-day deadline under this subsection, but provided a written 21 explanation, and those cities and townships that did not comply 22 23 with the 45-day deadline under this subsection and that did not provide a written explanation. The state bureau of elections may 24 25 require the clerk of a city or township that did not comply with the 45-day deadline under this subsection, but provided a written 26 27 explanation, to provide additional information. The state bureau of elections shall require the clerk of a city or township that did 28 29 not comply with the 45-day deadline and that did not provide a

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written explanation to file a written explanation, describing the
 remedial actions taken by the city or township clerk, within 1
 business day after the state bureau of elections notifies the clerk
 of that city or township.

(15) For a presidential primary election, the secretary of 5 6 state shall prescribe procedures for contacting an elector who is 7 an absent uniformed services voter or an overseas voter, as described in this section, and who is eligible to receive an absent 8 voter ballot or who applies for an absent voter ballot for the 9 10 presidential primary election, offering the elector the opportunity to select a political party ballot for the presidential primary 11 12 election.

(16) The secretary of state shall order a city or township 13 14 clerk to extend the ballot receipt deadline for any absentee absent 15 voter ballots under this section that were not transmitted to an 16 absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter in compliance 17 with subsection (5). The extension must equal the total number of 18 days beyond the deadline as provided in subsection (5) that the 19 city or township clerk transmitted the requested absentee absent 20 voter ballots. These absente absent voter ballots received during the extension time must be counted and tabulated for the final 21 results of the election provided that the absentee absent voter 22 23 ballots are executed and sent by the close of the polls on election day. The election may be formally certified before the end of the 24 25 extension time if the number of outstanding absentee absent voter ballots under this subsection will not alter the outcome of the 26 27 election.

28 (17) The secretary of state shall promulgate rules that
29 establish policies and procedures for the electronic return of

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voted ballots by eligible members. In promulgating rules that 1 establish establishing the policies and procedures for the 2 electronic return of voted ballots by eligible members, the 3 secretary of state shall require an eligible member to use a United 4 States Department of Defense verified electronic signature, as that 5 6 term is defined in section 18a, so that the identity of the 7 eligible member can be verified utilizing those policies and procedures. A member who is unable or unwilling to provide a United 8 States Department of Defense verified electronic signature is not 9 10 eligible to electronically return a voted ballot. The secretary of 11 state shall take reasonable steps to ensure the integrity and secrecy of voted ballots returned electronically. The secretary of 12 state may develop and maintain a secure web portal on the secretary 13 14 of state's website to facilitate the electronic return of voted 15 ballots by eligible members. Only the secretary of state or the 16 secretary of state's duly authorized agent, a city or township 17 clerk, the clerk's deputy clerk, or a sworn member of the clerk's staff is authorized to access the secure web portal on the 18 19 secretary of state's website. No later than January 1, 2024, the 20 secretary of state shall promulgate rules pursuant to the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 21 22 24.328, establish policies and procedures to implement this 23 subsection, and the secretary of state must allow for the electronic return of voted ballots by eligible members starting no 24 25 later than the 2024 statewide presidential primary election. As used in this subsection, "eligible member" means a member of a 26 27 uniformed service on active duty or a member of the merchant marine, as described in subsection (6) or (13). 28

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(18) If the absent voter ballot return envelope containing a

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marked absent voter ballot for an absent uniformed services voter 1 2 or overseas voter is postmarked on or before election day and the absent voter ballot is received by mail by the city or township 3 clerk within 6 days after the election, the city or township clerk 4 shall consider that absent voter ballot timely received. If the 5 6 absent voter ballot return envelope containing a marked absent 7 voter ballot for an absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter is received by mail by the city or township clerk within 6 8 days after the election and the postmark on the absent voter ballot 9 10 return envelope is missing or unclear, but the absent voter ballot 11 return envelope or the voter certificate is dated on or before election day by the absent uniformed services voter or overseas 12 voter, the city or township clerk shall consider that absent voter 13 14 ballot as timely received. Not later than the seventh day after 15 election day, each city or township clerk shall forward the absent 16 voter ballots timely received after the election as provided under 17 this subsection to the board of county canvassers of the county in 18 which the city or township is located to be tabulated. As used in this subsection, "postmark" means any type of mark applied by the 19 20 United States Postal Service or any delivery service to the absent voter ballot return envelope, including, but not limited to, a bar 21 22 code or any tracking marks that indicate when a ballot was mailed.

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(19) (18) As used in this section:

24 (a) "Absent uniformed services voter" means any of the25 following:

26 (i) A member of a uniformed service on active duty who, by
27 reason of being on active duty, is absent from the place of
28 residence where the member is otherwise qualified to vote.

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(*ii*) A member of the merchant marine who, by reason of service

1 in the merchant marine, is absent from the place of residence where 2 the member is otherwise qualified to vote.

3 (iii) A spouse or dependent of a member referred to in
4 subparagraph (i) or (ii) who, by reason of the active duty or service
5 of the member, is absent from the place of residence where the
6 spouse or dependent is otherwise qualified to vote.

7 (b) "Member of the merchant marine" means an individual, other
8 than a member of a uniformed service or an individual employed,
9 enrolled, or maintained on the Great Lakes or the inland waterways,
10 who is either of the following:

(i) Employed as an officer or crew member of a vessel documented under the laws of the United States, a vessel owned by the United States, or a vessel of foreign-flag registry under charter to or control of the United States.

15 (*ii*) Enrolled with the United States for employment or training 16 for employment, or maintained by the United States for emergency 17 relief service, as an officer or crew member of a vessel documented 18 under the laws of the United States, a vessel owned by the United 19 States, or a vessel of foreign-flag registry under charter to or 20 control of the United States.

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(c) "Overseas voter" means any of the following:

(i) An absent uniformed services voter who, by reason of active
duty or service, is absent from the United States on the date of an
election.

25 (ii) An individual who resides outside of the United States and
26 is qualified to vote in the last place in which the individual was
27 domiciled before leaving the United States.

28 (iii) An individual who resides outside of the United States and29 who, but for such residence outside of the United States, would be

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qualified to vote in the last place in which the individual was
 domiciled before leaving the United States.

3 (d) "Uniformed services" means the Army, Navy, Air Force,
4 Marine Corps, Space Force, or Coast Guard, the Commissioned Corps
5 of the Public Health Service, the Commissioned Corps of the
6 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, a reserve
7 component of a uniformed service, or the Michigan National Guard as
8 that term is defined in section 105 of the Michigan military act,
9 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.505.

Sec. 764a. The following instructions for an absent voter must be included with each ballot or set of ballots furnished an absent voter:

13 INSTRUCTIONS FOR ABSENT VOTERS

Step 1. Enclosed you will find voting instructions as to the method of voting. Read these carefully and then vote the ballot.

Step 2. After voting a ballot, place the ballot in the secrecy sleeve, if any. If a secrecy sleeve is not provided, refold the ballot to conceal your votes.

19 Step 3. Place the ballot or ballots in the return envelope and20 securely seal the envelope.

Step 4. Sign and date the return envelope in the place designated. Your signature must appear on the return envelope or the ballot will not be counted. If you are disabled or otherwise unable to mark the ballot and required assistance in voting your absent voter ballot, have the individual who assisted you complete the section on the return envelope entitled "TO BE COMPLETED ONLY IF VOTER IS ASSISTED IN VOTING BY ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL".

28 Step 5. Deliver the return envelope by 1 of the following 29 methods:

(a) Place the necessary postage upon the return envelope and
 deposit it in the United States mail or with another public postal
 service, express mail service, parcel post service, or common
 carrier.

5 (b) Deliver the envelope personally to the office of the
6 clerk, to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk, or
7 to a secure drop box located in the city or township.

8 (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of
9 the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law,
10 sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or
11 grandchild or an individual residing in the voter's household may
12 mail or deliver a ballot to the clerk for the voter.

13 (d) You may request by telephone that the clerk who issued the 14 ballot provide assistance in returning the ballot. The clerk is 15 required to provide assistance if you are unable to return your 16 absent voter ballot as specified in (a), (b), or (c) above, if it 17 is before 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately preceding the election, 18 and if you are asking the clerk to pick up the absent voter ballot within the jurisdictional limits of the city, township, or village 19 20 in which you are registered. Your absent voter ballot will then be picked up by the clerk or an election assistant sent by the clerk. 21 All individuals authorized to pick up absent voter ballots are 22 23 required to carry credentials issued by the clerk. If using this absent voter ballot return method, do not give your ballot to 24 25 anyone until you have checked their credentials.

Step 6. The ballot must reach the clerk or an authorized assistant of the clerk before the close of the polls on election day. An absent voter ballot received by the clerk or **authorized** assistant of the clerk after the close of the polls on election day

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will not be counted. For an absent uniformed services voter or 1 overseas voter, the absent voter ballot return envelope containing 2 a marked absent voter ballot must be postmarked on or before 3 election day and must reach the clerk or authorized assistant of 4 5 the clerk within 6 days after the election. If the absent voter 6 ballot return envelope containing an absent voter ballot for an 7 absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter is received by mail by the clerk or authorized assistant of the clerk more than 6 8 9 days after the election or is postmarked after election day, the 10 absent voter ballot will not be counted.

11 WARNING

12 All of the following actions are violations of the Michigan
13 election law and are illegal in this state:

14 (1) To vote an absent voter ballot at a meeting or gathering15 at which other individuals are voting absent voter ballots.

16 (2) For an individual who is assisting an absent voter in
17 marking the ballot to suggest or in any manner attempt to influence
18 the absent voter on how he or she the absent voter should vote.

19 (3) For an individual who is present and knows that an 20 individual is voting an absent voter ballot to suggest or in any 21 manner attempt to influence the absent voter on how he or she the 22 absent voter should vote.

23 (4) For an individual other than those listed in these
24 instructions to return, offer to return, agree to return, or
25 solicit to return an absent voter ballot to the clerk.

(5) For an individual other than the absent voter; an individual listed in these instructions; or an individual whose job it is to handle mail before, during, or after being transported by a public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service,

1 or common carrier, but only during the normal course of his or her

2 the individual's employment to be in possession of a voted or

3 unvoted absent voter ballot.
