- 1 A resolution to declare March 22, 2023, as Michigan Water Day 2 and World Water Day in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Since 1993, the United Nations has designated March
- 4 22nd as World Water Day. In 2010, the United Nations acknowledged
- 5 "the importance of equitable access to safe and clean drinking
- 6 water and sanitation as an integral component of the realization of
- 7 all human rights"; and

Whereas, The theme of World Water Day 2023 is accelerating 1 change to solve the water and sanitation crisis. Billions of people 2 around the world do not have access to clean water and sanitation; 3 4 and 5 Whereas, A substantial number of Michigan residents do not 6 have reliable access to clean water and sanitation. During the 7 recent pandemic, when access to clean water and sanitation was especially vital, tens of thousands of Michigan residents were at 8 risk of water service shutoffs. Water services and sanitation 9 10 should meet the needs of all Michiganders, including those who are 11 the most vulnerable; and Whereas, Water is a human right; now therefore be it 12 13 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 14 this legislative body declare March 22, 2023, as Michigan Water Day 15 and World Water Day in the state of Michigan. It is with great honor and appreciation that we take this time to join other states 16 and nations in expressing our commitment to ensuring that clean 17 18 affordable drinking water is available to all Michiganders; and 19 commit ourselves to promotion of public awareness to prevent our 20 precious water from pollution and depletion. On this day, we will 21 celebrate and honor the pure water in our state, our country, and our world; and be it further 22 23 Resolved, While we recognize the interconnectedness of 24 humanity and appreciate global challenges, we also recognize our 25 duty as Michiganders in protecting our natural resources and 26 instilling a sense of pride in ourselves and our children for our 27 Great Lakes; and be it further Resolved, We cherish and acknowledge the special 28

responsibility of protecting Michigan's waters for current and
