A bill to amend 2020 PA 312, entitled "Law enforcement and firefighter access to epinephrine act," by amending the title and sections 1, 2, and 3 (MCL 28.821, 28.822, and 28.823).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to allow certain law enforcement officers and

firefighters to administer auto-injectable an epinephrine delivery

system in certain circumstances; to provide access to auto
injectable an epinephrine delivery system by eligible entities, law

enforcement officers, and firefighters; and to limit civil and

- 1 criminal liability of certain entities and individuals.
- 2 Sec. 1. (1) This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 3 "law enforcement and firefighter access to epinephrine act".
- 4 (2) As used in this act:
- 5 (a) "Eligible entity" means a law enforcement agency or
- 6 organized fire department that is prescribed auto-injectable an
- 7 epinephrine delivery system.
- 8 (b) "Epinephrine delivery system" includes, but is not limited
- 9 to, an epinephrine auto-injector, an epinephrine inhaler, or
- 10 epinephrine nasal spray.
- (c) (b)—"Firefighter" means that term as defined in section 1
- 12 of the fire prevention code, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.1.
- (d) (c) "Law enforcement agency" means that term as defined in
- 14 section 2 of the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards
- 15 act, 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.602.
- (e) (d) "Law enforcement officer" means that term as defined
- 17 in section 2 of the Michigan commission on law enforcement
- 18 standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.602.
- 19 (f) (e)—"Organized fire department" means that term as defined
- 20 in section 1 of the fire prevention code, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.1.
- 21 Sec. 2. (1) An eligible entity may purchase and possess auto-
- 22 injectable an epinephrine delivery system for purposes of this act
- 23 and distribute that auto-injectable epinephrine delivery system to
- 24 law enforcement officers or firefighters in its employ who have
- 25 been trained in the administration of that auto-injectable
- 26 epinephrine delivery system as required under subsection (3).
- 27 (2) If a law enforcement officer or firefighter has completed
- 28 the training required under subsection (3), the law enforcement
- 29 officer or firefighter may administer auto-injectable an

- 1 epinephrine delivery system prescribed to an eligible entity to an
- 2 individual who the law enforcement officer or firefighter has
- 3 reason to believe is experiencing anaphylaxis, regardless of
- 4 whether the individual has a prescription for epinephrine or has
- 5 been previously diagnosed with an allergy.
- **6** (3) An individual shall complete training on the proper
- 7 administration of auto-injectable an epinephrine delivery system
- 8 before administering auto-injectable epinephrine under this act.
- 9 Sec. 3. (1) An eligible entity that purchases, stores, or
- 10 provides to a law enforcement officer or firefighter auto-
- 11 injectable an epinephrine delivery system for use under section 2
- 12 is immune from civil liability for injuries, death, or damages
- 13 arising out of the administration of that auto-injectable
- 14 epinephrine delivery system to any individual, if the conduct does
- 15 not amount to gross negligence that is the proximate cause of
- 16 injury, death, or damage.
- 17 (2) Any law enforcement officer or firefighter who possesses,
- 18 administers, or fails to administer auto-injectable an epinephrine
- 19 delivery system under section 2 is immune from civil liability for
- 20 injuries, death, or damages arising out of the administration or
- 21 failure to administer auto-injectable an epinephrine delivery
- 22 system to any individual, if the conduct does not constitute
- 23 willful or wanton misconduct that is the proximate cause of injury,
- 24 death, or damage.
- 25 (3) An eligible entity that purchases, possesses, or
- 26 distributes auto-injectable an epinephrine delivery system under
- 27 section 2 and any law enforcement officer or firefighter who
- 28 possesses, administers, or fails to administer auto-injectable an
- 29 epinephrine delivery system under section 2 is not subject to

- 1 criminal prosecution for purchasing, possessing, or distributing
- 2 auto-injectable an epinephrine delivery system, or administering or
- 3 failing to administer auto-injectable an epinephrine delivery
- 4 system to any individual under this act.
- 5 (4) This section does not eliminate, limit, or reduce any
- 6 other immunity or defense that may be available under the laws of
- 7 this state.
- **8** (5) As used in this section, "gross negligence" means that
- **9** term as defined in section 7 of 1964 PA 170, MCL 691.1407.
- 10 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
